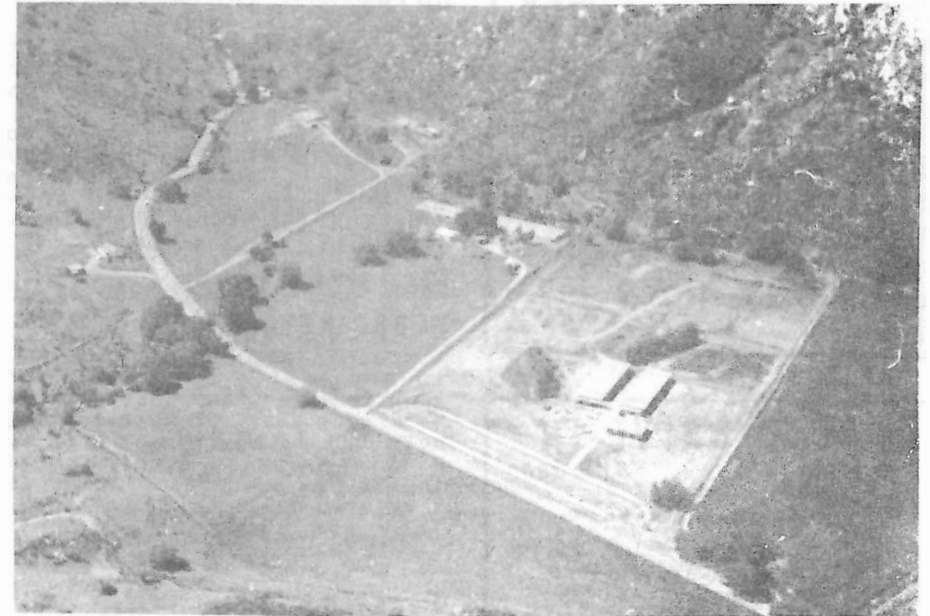

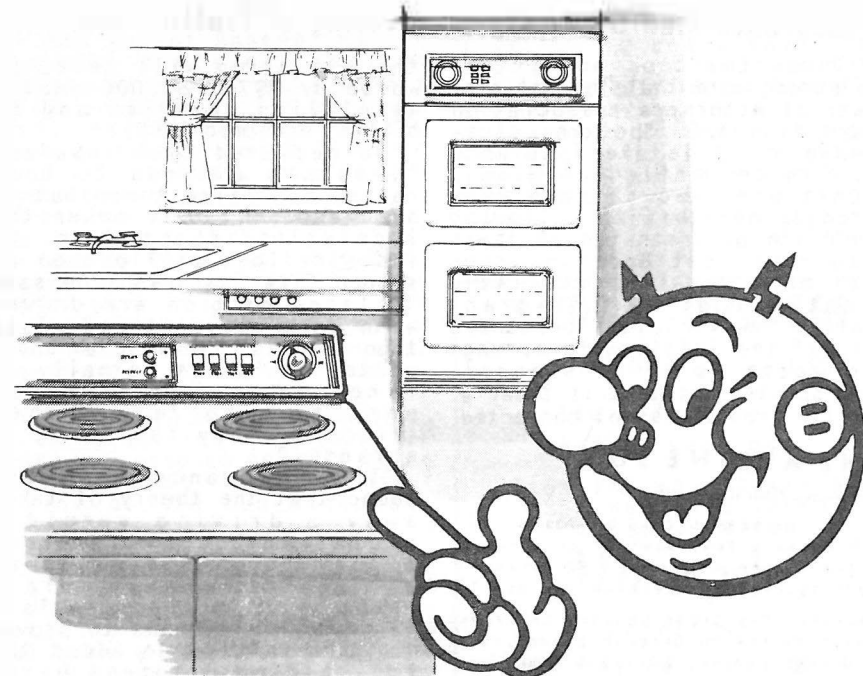

EDITORIAL



Insurance Man Urges Tight Enforcing of Traffic Laws

"Throw the book at him" is the strong word that the National District Attorneys' Association heard from A. E. Spottke, vice-president, Allstate Insurance Co., in convention at Miami.

Last week two SD boys were strongly dealt with following the death of a man hit in their drag race. But Spottke urges that more drastic, realistic treatment of the flagrant traffic law violator, be handed out, if the intolerable carnage and waste is to be stopped.

He pointed out that if today's traffic problem is not corrected

the situation will be 40-50 worse by 1975; 51,000 deaths, 4 1/2 million injuries and \$9 1/2 billion economic loss!

He declared that insurance firms are anxious to lower rates, not raise them, but the high accident rate makes this imperative. "Last year, the industry lost millions on assigned risk business," he said. "A large portion are drivers with long accident and violation records, the type an underwriter would not normally insure. Yet, when these are permitted to retain their licenses, they must have insurance."

The insurance executive added that the theory of taking away a driving permit is violating a constitutional right, is unreasonable and antiquated, and is morally wrong when the person claims he needs his license to provide for his family. He added that law-abiding citizens have a right to use the highways with freedom from constant threat of unfit drivers.

Perhaps the states should turn over this important national problem to the federal government; make driving requisites stronger, penalties more stringent, plus exacting physical condition, as is now done nationally for pilots. We who fly must pass a medical examination every two years; follow strict flight rules, and pass stiff verbal, written and performance tests before we may fly. Let's have safety on land as well as in the air.-Cl.

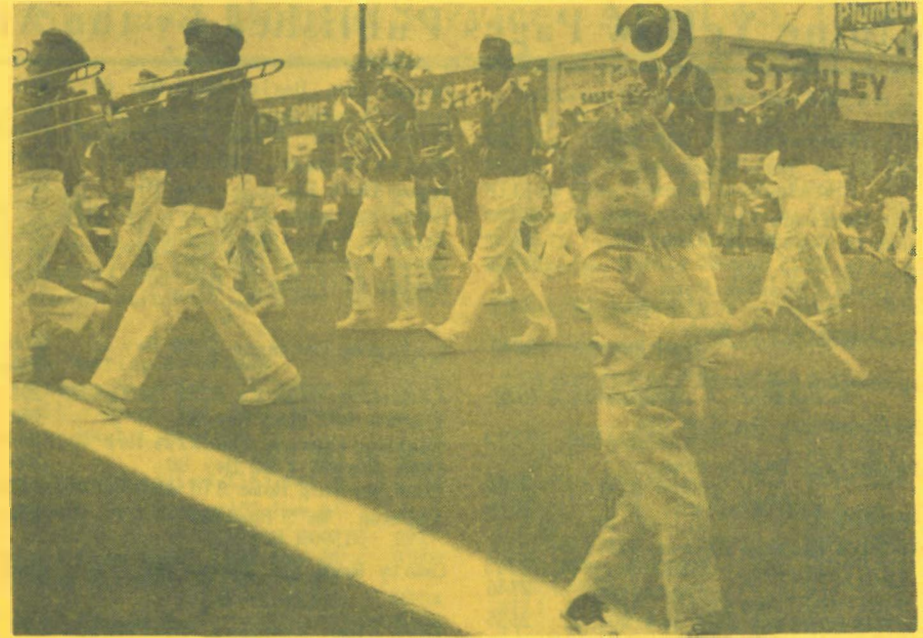

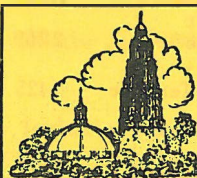
SUMMER WEDDING PLANNED

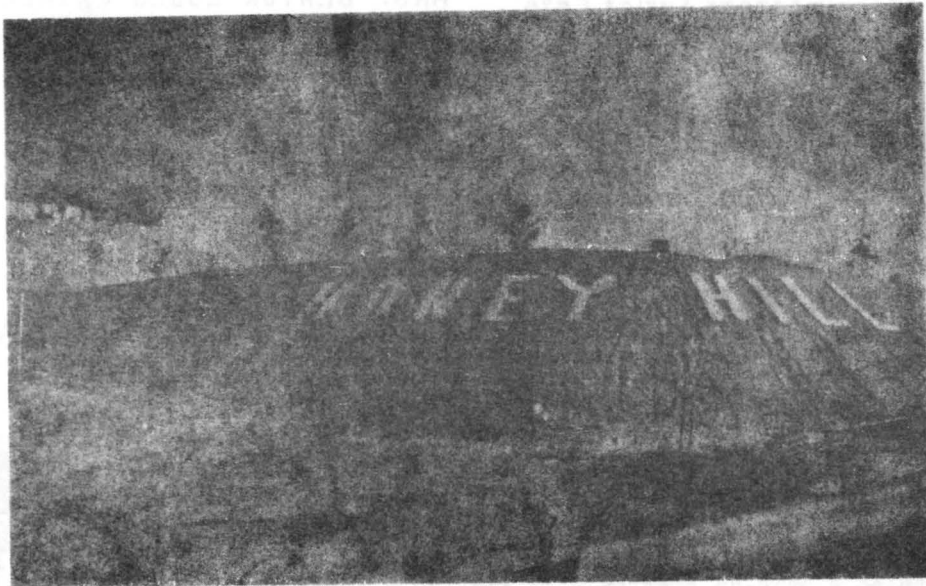

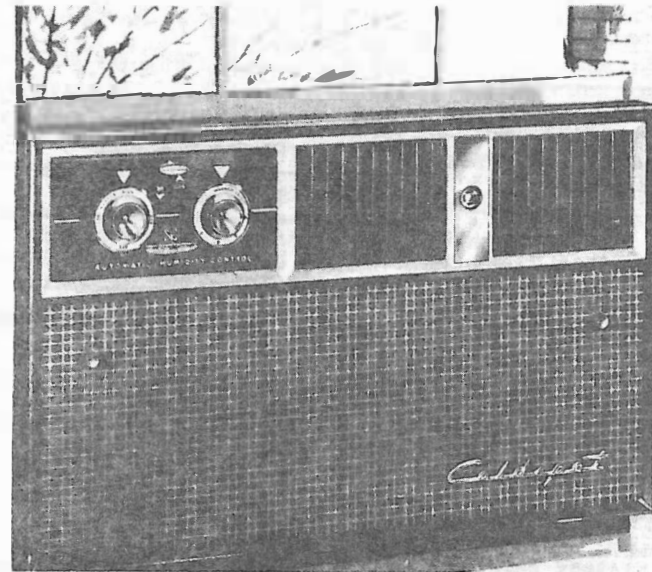
