



> The insurance executive added that the theory of taking away a driving permit is violating a constitutional right, is unreasonable and antiquated, and is morally wrong when the person claims he needs his license to provide for his family. He added that law-abiding citizens have a right to use the highways with freedom from constant threat of unfit drivers.

> Perhaps the states should turn over this important national problem to the federal government; make driving requisites stronger, penalties more stringent, plus exacting physical condition, as is now done nationally for pilots. We who fly must pass a medical examination every two years; follow strict flight rules, and pass stiff verbal, written and performance tests before we may fly. Let's have safety on land as well as in the air.-Cl.






