As that little boy said on Mel Baldwin's program, this foul event of killing is only a mustard seed that will start a big movement to make a Christian state and nation end such acts of horror.

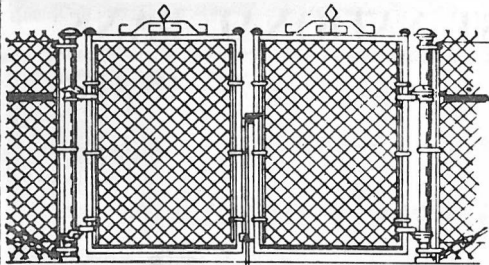
