**Proposed State Lottery Would be Ethical Like Racing!**

Ethics seems to be fast slipping from the American vocabulary.

It means a system or practice of moral conduct. For years we have allowed racing, a form of gambling, also legal poker rooms. Under cover it is an open secret that Americans bet on everything: baseball, football and other games. If gambling is wrong in one form, it is wrong in another.

Which brings us to the question of a proposed state lottery that would help reduce the crushing tax burden in this state. It may be legislated if the idea of a state Board of Equalization

member who believes California should run a lottery or outlaw all legalized forms of gambling. He is George C. Reilly, of San Francisco, who says he will seek to have it introduced at the next Legislature.

His plan would give half the money to the welfare bureau for old age benefits and public welfare payments. The rest would go to the counties. The measure would have to be ratified by vote, and if the people turned it down, he would then ask to have all legalized gambling revoked.

His reasoning is solid, ethical; if one form of gambling is wrong, all are wrong. He added that this does not raise a moral question since gambling is already legal here. Horseracing brought California \$24 million last year. He points to charities receiving some racetrack proceeds, which, like the churches that hold raffles, tacitly condone gambling.

Mankind likes to gamble, has done it for centuries, and will keep at it, legal or not; ethics, as we said before, is a word that is getting weaker all the time. So perhaps Mr. Reilly has a good idea. At that, if it helps reduce the ever-rising tax bite, most of us would be for it. -CI

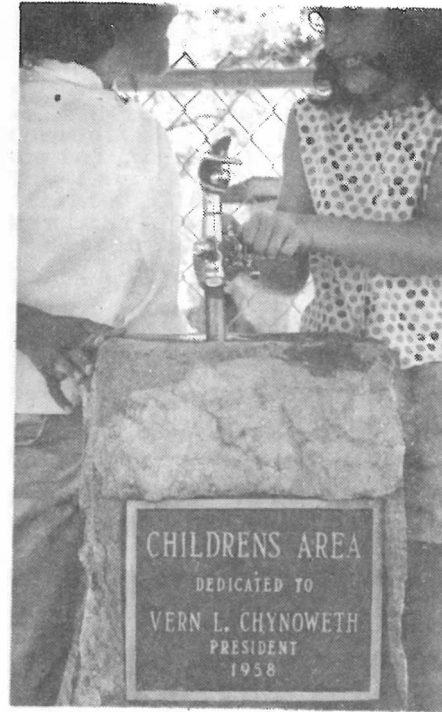

**School Budget Presented**

The County Board of Education has received a preliminary budget of \$279,354 reports Supt. Clyde Gilley of Alpine Union School District, who adds that it would not change the \$1.51 operating tax rate.

This amount includes \$4,000 in salary increases among the district's 30 teachers and other employees. Last year's budget was \$276,000. A public hearing will be held on Aug. 5.

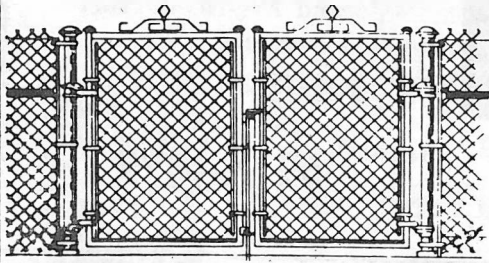

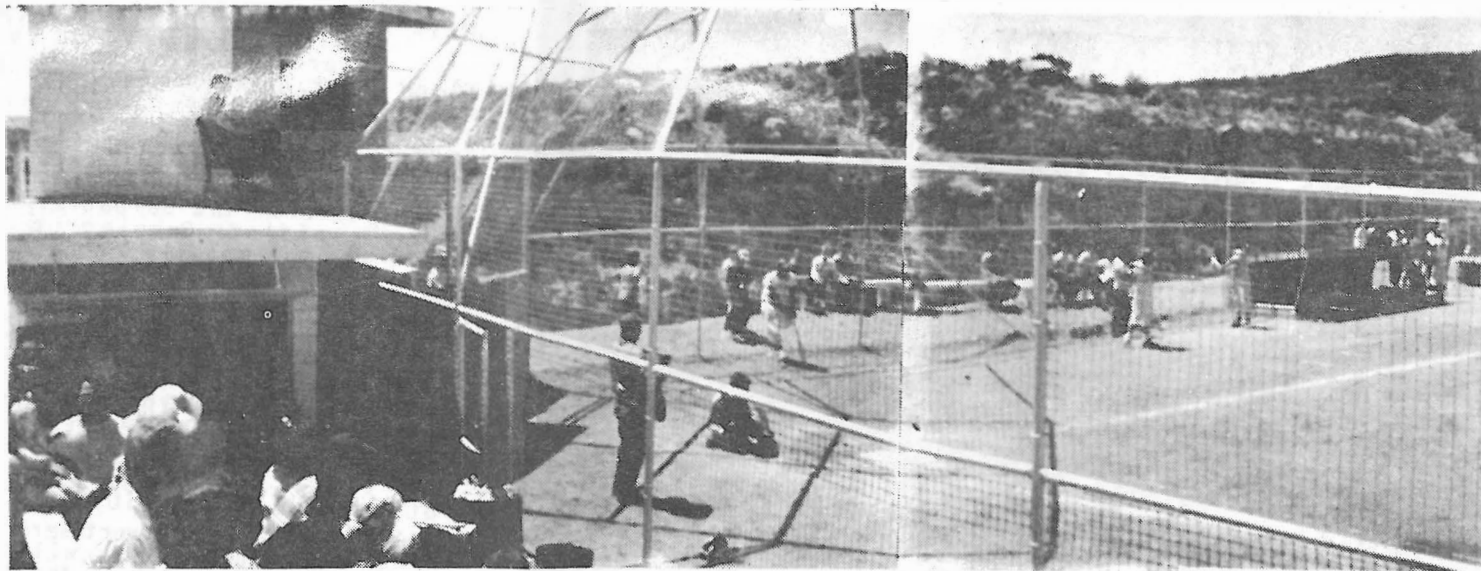

owners, voiced disapproval of the quarry. "This will be the beginning of industrial operations and dust will destroy its value as a place where sufferers from asthma could recover", she stated.

Dr. Ledford declared this fine land should be used for high class homes, and Frank Edwards, realtor, representing the two doctors, revealed that a subdivision for senior citizens is planned for 275 acres adjoining McNinch's land. He argued that the quarry would disrupt plans for this project.

McNinch, who has a poultry ranch, protested opposition, saying the area was residential property when others had bought there for agricultural purposes. The board put off further action. (See Sun May 20,

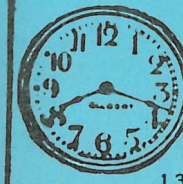

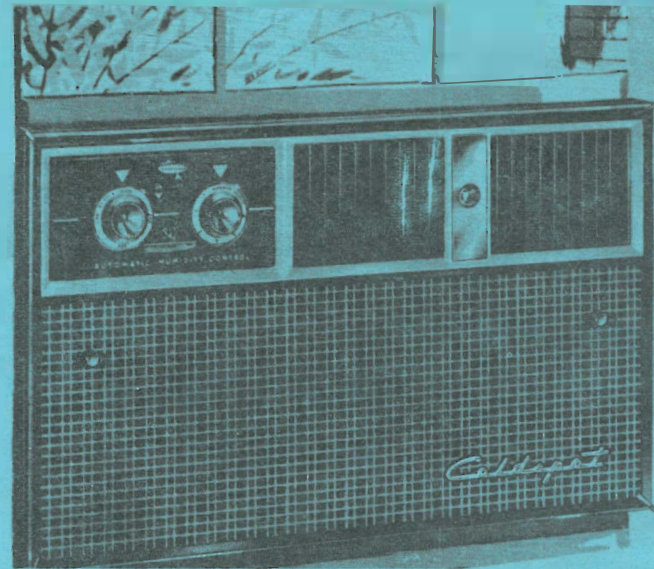
