#### **Dedicate Power Plant**

A conducted tour of the great new SD Gas & Electric Co. power plant at Chula Vista, with dedication, was made Wednesday for city and county officials, members of press, radio & TV

Emery D. Sherwin, president, in dedication, said the plant is putting out 142,000 kilowatts from the \$222 million facility, a second unit to start in 1962 for  $$18\frac{1}{2}$  million. In time there will be eight units at this site, Sherwin told. He gave many exciting facts about the company's growth along with the area, the firm today having an investment of \$225 million, soaring from \$292 million in 1940. In this span their total generating capacity has grown from 110,000 to 809,000 kilowatts.






