#### Water Annexation Story from 1

After the Rio attorney, John Campbell, read highlights from the ordinance made by its board, setting forth details, costs, terms and conditions, none of the visitors objected, the board voted to hold the election on Tuesday, Sept. 27, at polling places and with officials set by the registrar of voters.

It was reported that the 1960-61 estimated assessed value of the entire annexation area was \$3,772,071. Tax rate for the present district is now 22¢, but when the total is estimated it may drop to

10 to 12 cents. Rio's annexation fee is payable over five years, SD Water Authority, 10 years, and IA Metropolitan, 30 years.

"Copies of the ordinance which is to be printed in the Alpine sun" said Price, "with maps, will be mailed to all registered voters in

each area".

In closing the meeting he stated, "We urge the committee and your people to record a high vote, which means lower interest on bonds. The longer you put off getting entitlement, the less likely you are to get it, and the higher will be the cost." He pointed out that entitlement does not put pipes or water to the areas, it does assure allotment of water.
