Rising Crime Needs More than Just Law Enforcement

The FBI has just issued a bulletin on the upturn of crime, which "in the first 6 months of 1960 rose a startling 9% with robbery showing the greatest increase-- 13%."

It points out that until it is learned that law enforcement is decidedly more than merely giving any man a uniform, a night stick and

a gun, crime will never show any abatement.

"Deterrence of crime can be accomplished only through effective enforcing of the law", it concludes.

Last week's savage vandalism at El Capitan HS in Lakeside where thousands of dollars in damage was done, and many other similar outbreaks, only go to prove that young people need something remedial, or preventive.

Thousands of youngsters would love to have a horse, but it costs a lot, and with rising taxes, living costs and other soaring expenses, plus taxes on a horse as a luxury, it is impossible for most folks to keep horses.

Elbert Hubbard, a fine writer, and a great rider, once said "There is something on the outside of a horse that does the inside of a man a lot of good".

It is a fact that Scouting and other activities, a good home, and many things, help mould the youngster, but a horse-- that is really something to keep them busy and out of mischief.

We believe that horses should not be taxed as luxuries, but on the other hand should be subsidized by the county, or funds should be set aside for government operated riding stables. Children of Alpine are unable to rent a horse-- maybe that will come with water and more population.-CI.

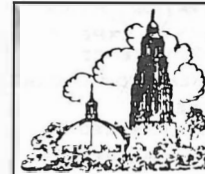

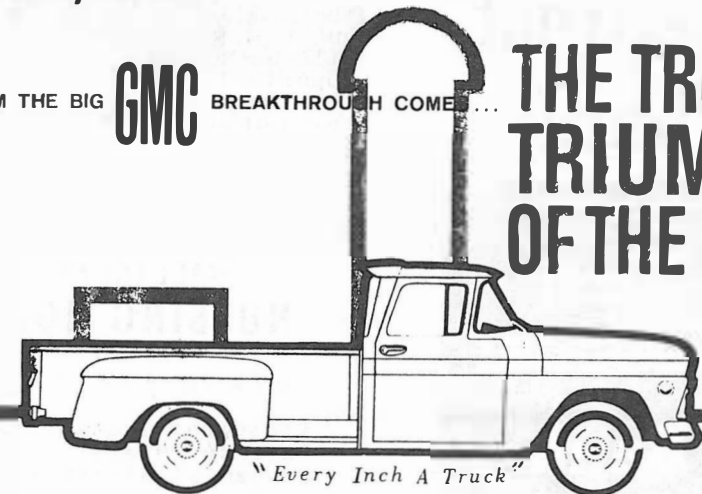

To Step Up School

Grades 4, 5 & 6 of Alpine school will soon launch an accelerated arithmetic program, reveals Supt. Clyde T. Gilley. It is in cooperation with the county Department of Education, SD State, and SD Unified School District. It is one of many National Defense Education Act projects operating throughout the nation, sponsored by the SD Metropolitan Education Study Council.

Thirteen larger county school districts began the program last year with 250 teachers and 2486 pupils. There are now 26 schools and 650 teachers participating.

Objectives are to find ways to provide more effectively for the more able pupils in arithmetic and to advance them at least one quarter of a year at each grade level. In addition, through the use of units developed as part of the project, they will also be provided with an enrichment program over and beyond that found in textbooks.

Students will be screened on the basis of several criteria including a variety of tests, past achievement, and teachers ratings. Experience indicates that 25% of each class will qualify. Subsequently, parents will be notified and given an opportunity to learn more of the project and to decline the participation of their children if they so desire.

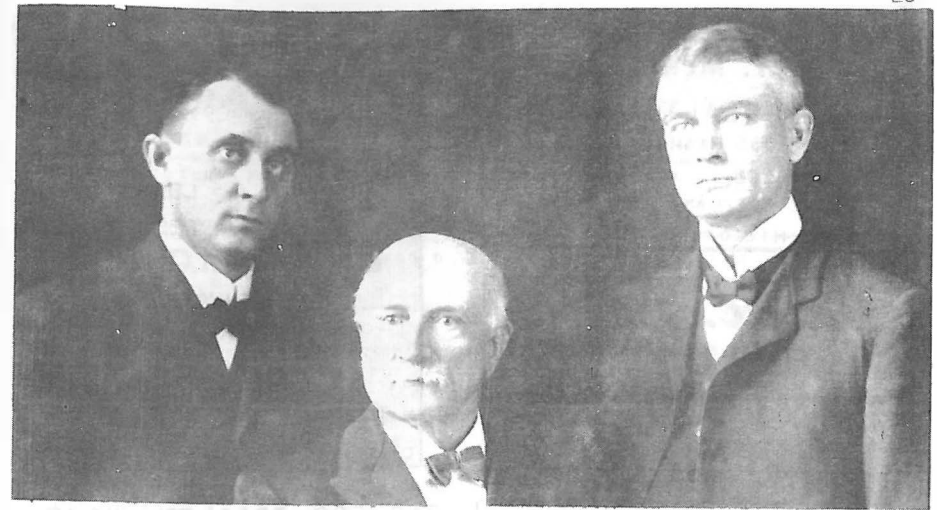
