as Improvement District No. 1. "This is the only bond issue that we should ever have to ask the people to vote" Chas. C. Price, board president told the Sun. "The connection fee is so arranged that normal growth will provide funds for future development".

These fees are geared to pumping areas and distances: below 1000 feet, it is \$435. all others to 1400 ft is \$455. Alpine, between 1400 and 2000 feet is \$465. Fee includes meter and copper leads to property line.

In some districts they charge more, Helix for example now gets \$322 per acre! Lakeside is \$400 an acre. Elsewhere is a map showing the entire district with transmission lines. Although \$3 million will be requested, only \$2,200,000 w will be needed for initial lines, reservoirs and pumping stations.

Price has named a campaign committee of 30 civic leaders to inform voters on this im-

portant proposition.
Literature will be presented all residents and information meetings held prior to the voting so all may know details.
