Engineering angles were elucidated by Ed Houser, for the Rio district, many queries on personal water service being answered. He tol how actual connections and meters can be installed while transmission lines, reservoirs and pumping stations are being built.

"So if all goes well", Price says, "bids will be called for and work will start soon so that both transmission and distribution lines will be built concurrently, thus bringing connections and water soon as pumping begins".

Auren M. Pierce was appointed chairman of the finance committee to raise funds for promoting the committee's educational work.

"The main idea for this" says Lewinson, "is to get as near 100% vote as possible, as the higher the percentage, the lower will be interest on bonds".

He also is calling for testimonial letters from those who have suffered extra heavy expense in getting or deepening wells, and other costs so that voters may know the advantages of bringing in water.

"Just tell briefly of your experiences and plight in well and pump trouble", says Lewinson, "and send them in to the committee, P.O. Box 97, Alpine".
