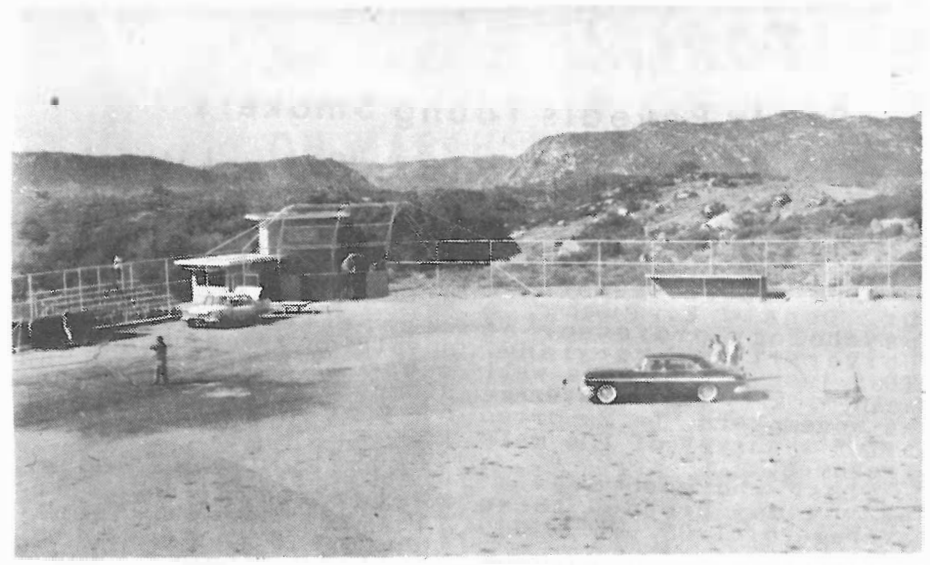

Study Reveals Young Smokers

Lag In School Work.

The more a student smokes cigarettes the lower his grades are likely to be! This was the report of Dr. Donald K. Pumoy, a psychology professor at University of Maryland. They just don't do as well academically on the average as nonsmokers, he reported after a survey of 204 male freshmen.

Those who used over a pack a day dropped to an average of 1.38, while 119

abstainers averaged grades of 1.98. Their grade of 2 is equal to a C.

This is just one more reason to halt the use of cigarettes, long under suspicion as being a chief cause of respiratory and stomach cancer, death rate of which is rising with the upsurge in use of cigarettes.

Athletes, swimmers and many who live with efficiency as their goal, long ago discovered that physical fitness cannot be tops when such habits are clung to. The best time to stop is right now! -CI

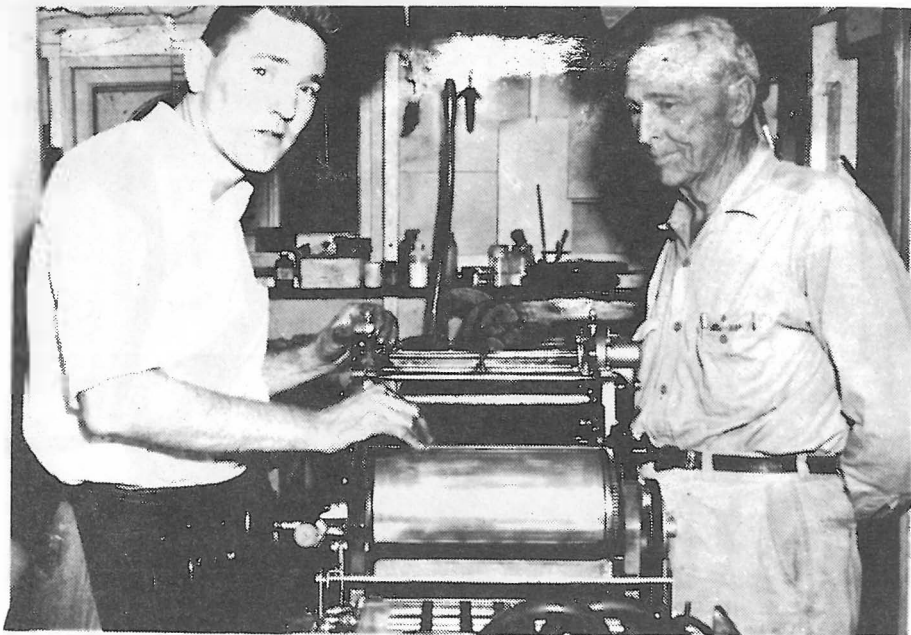

He is Bob Cummins, 36, of 591 Cochran Street, Imperial Beach where he lives with his wife and daughter Joy, 12, who goes to SD Union Academy, a Seventh-Day Adventist school in National City.

In final adjustments where ink lines must be seen, they lend him assistance. But Bob has invented an electronic eye which he will have operating soon so he can learn the width of the line by audio!

Cummins has been handicapped for the last two years following injury in an accident that resulted in iritis which turned into blindness. Now he works free-lance servicing these small presses, is building up a route business.

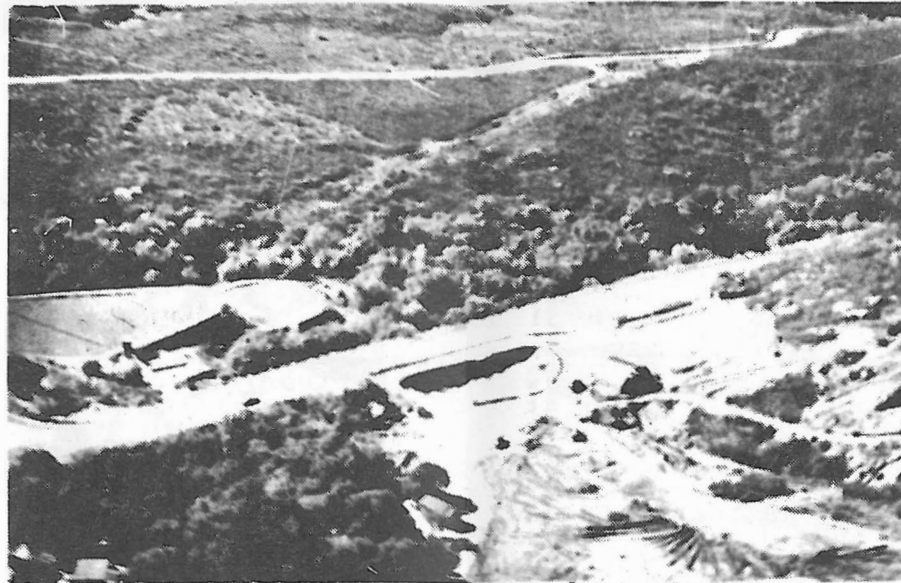

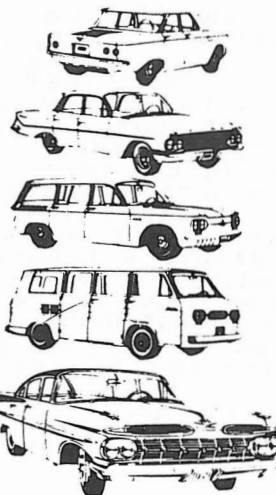

LEGAL NOTICE

RESOLUTION NO. 117

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF RIO SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT ORDERING, CALLING, PROVIDING FOR, AND GIVING NOTICE OF A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 OF SAID DISTRICT ON MARCH 21, 1961, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF SAID IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT A PROPOSITION OF INCURRING BONDED INDEBTEDNESS AND ISSUING BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT FOR SAID IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT.

The Board of Directors of RIO SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DETERMINE AND ORDER as follows:

Section 1. That this Board deems it necessary that the RIO SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT incur a bonded indebtedness by the issuance of bonds of the district for Improvement District No. 1 thereof in the amount of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the purpose of the acquisition and construction of a waterworks system, including reservoirs, pumping stations, transmission and distribution lines, conduits, pipelines, works, machinery and other property (including lands, easements, rights and privileges), and including water rights, capital stock and existing waterworks systems of mutual water companies, useful or necessary to store, convey, supply or otherwise make use of water for the lands and inhabitants within the exterior boundaries of said Improvement District No. 1, and including expenses of all proceedings for the authorization, issuance and sale of the bonds.

Section 2. That, following a hearing thereon as by law provided, this Board has determined, and does hereby determine and state, that the portion of said district which will be benefited by the accomplishment of said purpose hereinabove stated and by incurring said bonded indebtedness constitutes and is known as "IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 1 OF RIO SAN DIEGO MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT" and that a map showing the exterior boundaries of said improvement district is on file with the secretary of said district, which map shall govern for all details as to the extent of the improvement district.

Section 3. That the maximum term which the bonds proposed to be issued, or any portion or series thereof, shall run before maturity shall not exceed the maximum term permitted by law, to wit, forty (40) years from the date of said bonds or each series thereof, but said bonds may be made to mature within a lesser number of years; that the maximum rate of interest to be paid thereon shall not exceed the maximum rate permitted by law, to wit, five per cent (5%) per annum, payable semiannually, except that interest for the first year shall be payable at the end of said year, the actual rate or rates to be determined at the time of the sale or sales thereof.

Section 4. That a special election be held, and the same is hereby called to be held, in said Improvement District No. 1 of Rio San Diego Municipal Water District on the 21st day of March, 1961, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of said improvement district the proposition of incurring the said indebtedness and issuing bonds of said dis-

trict for said improvement district, in the amount hereinabove set forth, and for the purpose herein above stated.

That if the proposition for the incurring of said indebtedness so submitted receives the requisite number of votes, to wit, more than two-thirds of the votes of the qualified voters voting at such election, bonds of said district for said improvement district in not exceeding the principal amount hereinabove stated shall be issued and sold for the purpose hereinabove set forth. Said bonds will be bonds of the district, but taxes for the payment of such bonds and the interest thereon shall be levied exclusively upon the taxable property within said Improvement District No. 1 of Rio San Diego Municipal Water District all as provided in the Municipal Water District Act of 1911, as amended.

Section 5. that adds to safety in handling such bonds. "If these bonds pass on March 21, and all indication are that they will, we can then bend every effort to get water here just as soon as possible" he declared.

It will take three months, he pointed out, to complete all plans in detail for pump stations, pipelines and reservoirs. A month will be needed for advertising for bids, then contracts will be let and another month for completing legal advertising and so on, by which time the six month period will have passed and we can then go ahead and sell the bonds and let contracts. We will get contractors to work concurrently so that by next March work on the three phases--lines, reservoirs and pump stations, will be finished at the same time when testing can be done and water turned on".

Regarding connection fees, which, through a misunderstanding, Cecil Lewinson, chairman of the campaign committee, had quoted as being for one property-- not acres-- "no matter how many buildings, etc", will be fixed by engineer's later on with an added fee for units over two in business or residential. When more volume is needed, a meter larger than the regular 5/8" will have to be paid for. (See Lewinson's letter in ad on page 5).
