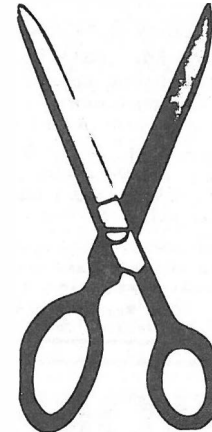

EDITORIAL

To get into Orbit You Need a Perfect Vehicle!

The Christian world has just celebrated the resurrection of Jesus, but how little did it realize that here and now the body of mankind can be resurrected from its abysmal depths of disease and early death.

In January of 1933 I started a health and nutrition magazine in Hollywood and when Smog Angeles got too eye-burning for us, we sold out and came back to Alpine in February, 1949. The magazine, Let's Live! is still published and sold all over the world.

In 1939 Dr. Weston A. Price of Cleveland published one of the greatest books on this subject, "Nutrition and Physical Degeneration", which has helped thousands back to normal, natural health. I maintain that you can-

not get into orbit-- life, action, happiness-- unless you have a perfect vehicle, like the missiles of today.

Profit seeking man, with his forced vegetation through chemical sprays and fertilizers, is ruining the health of the world. Dr. Price knew this and devoted 11 pages to "soil depletion and plant and animal deterioration".

In traveling through the South Pacific and visiting small islands where the natives lived primitively, I found that they suffered no tooth decay and none of our civilized diseases. Dr. Price also went to the antipodes, Alaska, Africa and other places and invariably found that when a race ate the primitive diet, it had no dental caries. He also saw that with tooth decay the younger generation evinced a lower mental acuteness.

Another man leading the world out of the morass of ignorance and crimes against nature is J.I. Rodale, who came along about that time with an organic gardening magazine and books on how to grow living foods, mulching, composts and so on.

If you feel like being awakened, read Price's volume, then get Rodale's "The organic Front", and you'll get the surprise of your life, and you may also make a few changes in your diet and where you get your foods.

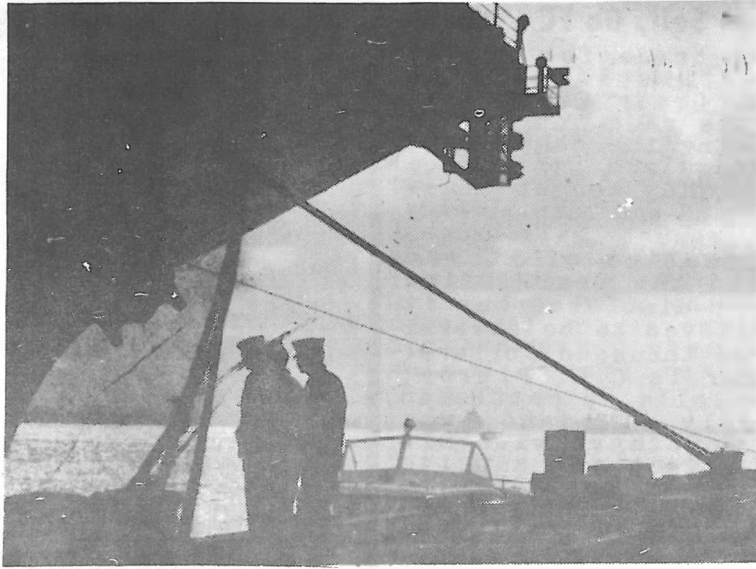

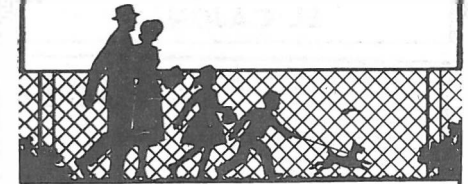

I wish every one of California's 8800 egg ranchers could have been with us at the sixth annual Good Egg Breakfast at the Town & Country Hotel Wednesday. It was great. Funny and serious. Good food and good cheer.

As usual Hart Dunham exceeded the thing with his Will Rogeresque style, keeping everyone in stitches. County Administrative Officer T.M. Heggland received the Good Egg award in absentia, for his fine work down at Civic Center.

Serious highlight was the figure-filled talk of Dr. Wm. Jasper, Chicago, of the American Federation of Farm Bureaus. He told that agriculture is not a declining industry but is going ahead with 11 of the 68 million workers in this field for a total of \$8 billions a year.

"Ranches are fewer, yes, but they are larger" he said, "and in America we have no kick coming, we get so much for so little! Costs may be higher, but wages are higher. A century ago a farmer worked to feed and clothe himself and family plus three persons, but today he does that for 11!" The good egg breakfast was a good eye opener. -CI

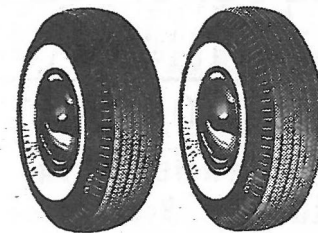

Fourth 'Day in Navy'

In the air, over the land, and on the sea! Few are fortunate enough to enjoy all three kinds of transportation in one week-end.

Traveling as "working press" for the Alpine Sun, Editor Clarke Irvine and myself were guests of the navy. Participating in the fourth annual "Day in the Navy", we were privileged to the full facilities of the enormous U.S.S. Ticonderoga.

Beginning our trip Sunday afternoon, we left Alpine for Gillespie Field. We flew to Montgomery Field for lunch. Irvine piloted the plane over Mission Valley, North Island, SD, Alpine and back to Gillespie, with Al Smith as co-pilot. While flying over SD en route to Alpine, we climbed above a blatted of

clouds over a mile high!

Next we went to the naval Training Center, where we ate supper, saw Colors, watched navy movies and bunked down for the night. Next morning after breakfast, the 111 plus group of students and press from various schools of the area boarded two small boats which took us to the Ticonderoga at North Island. Immediately after boarding the 906-foot-long and 103-foot-wide attack carrier, we were greeted by Captain R.F. Farrington and assigned guides.

The 43,500 ton ship, which was launched Feb. 7, 1944, mothballed after WWII, can quickly and efficiently operate over 70 jets. After steaming over 97,000 miles in the war, being damaged by 2 kamikaze planes, she was furnished with a \$10 million angled flight deck and enclosed hurricane bow at the beginning of the Korean War.

During the cruise, which took us over 40 miles to sea, we visited the photo-lab, and print shop. The main event, however, was the simultaneous taking off and landing of jets and bombers every 40 seconds.

After lunch we witnessed rocket drills by jets and bombers, in which they shot at smoke targets. Then we had a press conference where we asked questions for over an hour. On the way home, we watched as the eight 150,000 horse power steam turbine engines sped us at the rate of 28 knots back to SD harbor. After leaving the 3,000 man crew and 250 officers, we knew much more about the operation and purpose of our Navy.

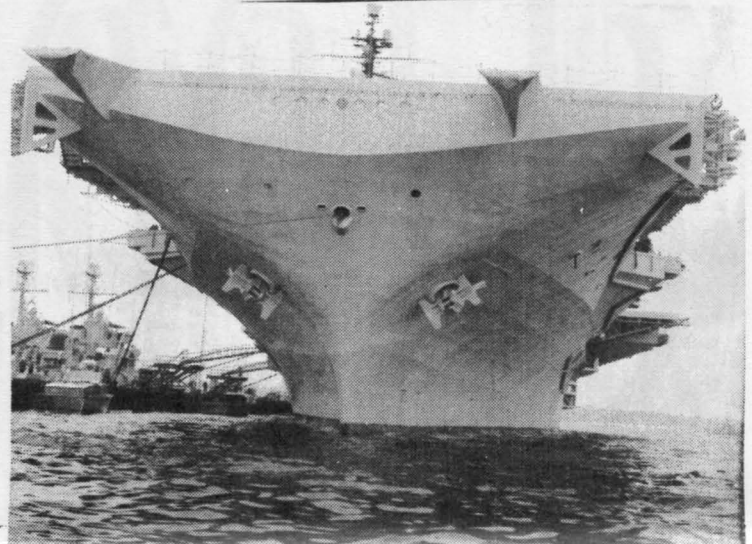
