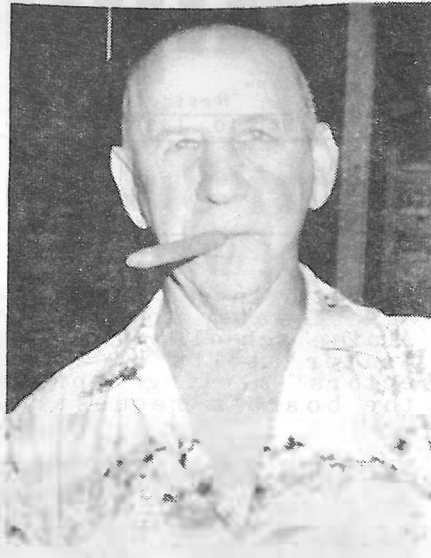

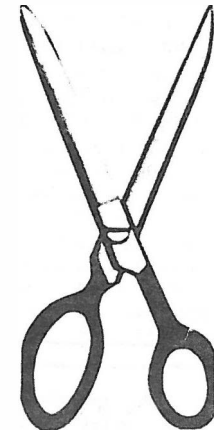

# EDITORIAL

## Fluoridation Mediators Try to Knock Out First Amendment!

Last year proposals to force drinking water fluoridation on the American people were defeated in 43 out of 56 elections. The November elections revealed that all such measures were defeated.

This is only one facet of a trend to take the rights away from the people. Petitions on this, parking meters, lot-splitting and other questions show that politicians do not want to carry out the will of electors. Something drastic must be done if freedom is to be retained.

Fluoridation was voted down in SD by 50,789 to 44,463 in 1954, was likewise refused by other western cities, but the drug peddlers keep trying to make people drink their poison.

The Christian Science Monitor for April 6 carries an informative letter from F.B. Exner, Seattle, M.D., on this question which is worth looking up. He was present "when the director of the National Institute of Dental Research testified under oath that fluoridation is "safe", but on cross-examination was forced to admit that he had no scientific basis for believing that no one would be harmed".

He adds that "if the fluoride is used as a drug, it violates the religious rights of all who have religious objections to the use of drugs, and would come within the scope of the First Amendment... whether a substance is a food or a drug is determined by the purpose for which it is used. Any substance, or mixture, used for curing, mitigating, or preventing a disease, is a drug, both according to the dictionary and in the eyes of the law".

If we believe America is free, then let us protect the freedom of those who desire to live without being dictated to or forced to take what they do not believe in, want or need. CI

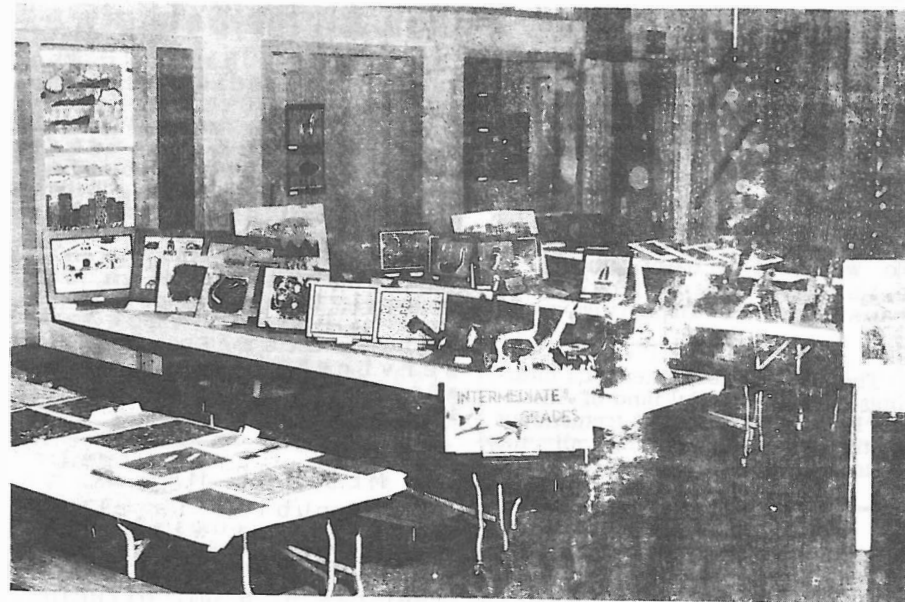

## School Trustees Ponder?

The school board at its last meeting discussed the Special Training Class with SD County; the fire protection of the Canyon school and the transportation problem in Peutz Valley. The Special Training class, which is financed by the county, was renewed at the canyon school. The county pays all expenses except custodial and utilities. Along with hiring the teacher they pay \$1,000 to the district annually for use of the classroom.

Due to the lack of fire hydrants at the new school, Alpine Fire Department has requested that the board take action to solve the situation. The hydrants were not installed when the school was built as there was inadequate water pressure. The board decided to delay definite action until the architect has been consulted.

The growing transportation problem from Peutz Valley was debated. At present this is furnished by a private party, subsidized by the school. Several trips are required, however, to bring the students. An alternative would be to use a school bus, which adds expense. The board decided to pursue the situation further before making a decision.

In other business, auditor John J. Malkind was employed. A visit of the Alpine school by several Tia Juana teachers and students was discussed. The district renewed the contract for continued nursing service with the SD Health dept. The annual doings of the graduating class was approved. School busses for certain field trips were made available.

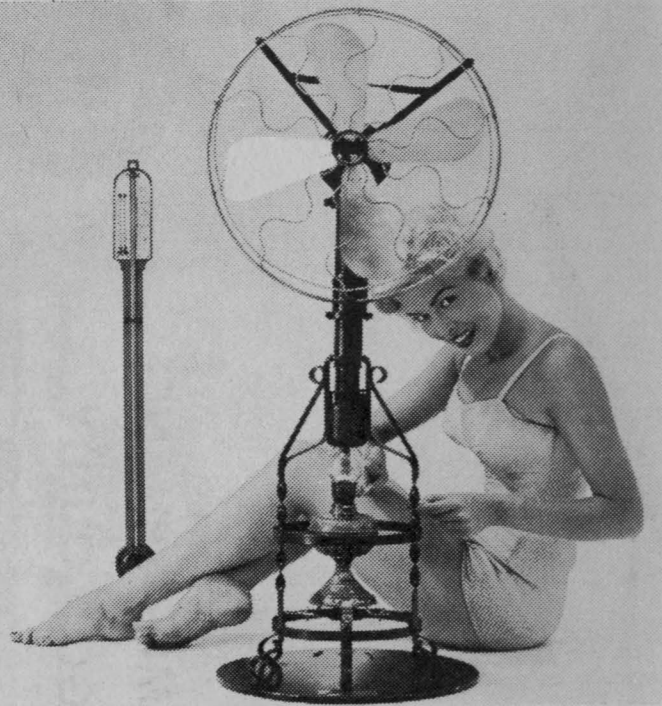

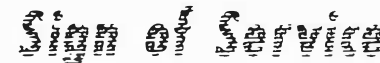

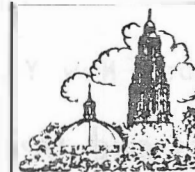
