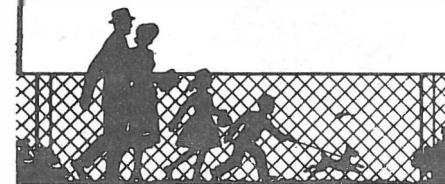

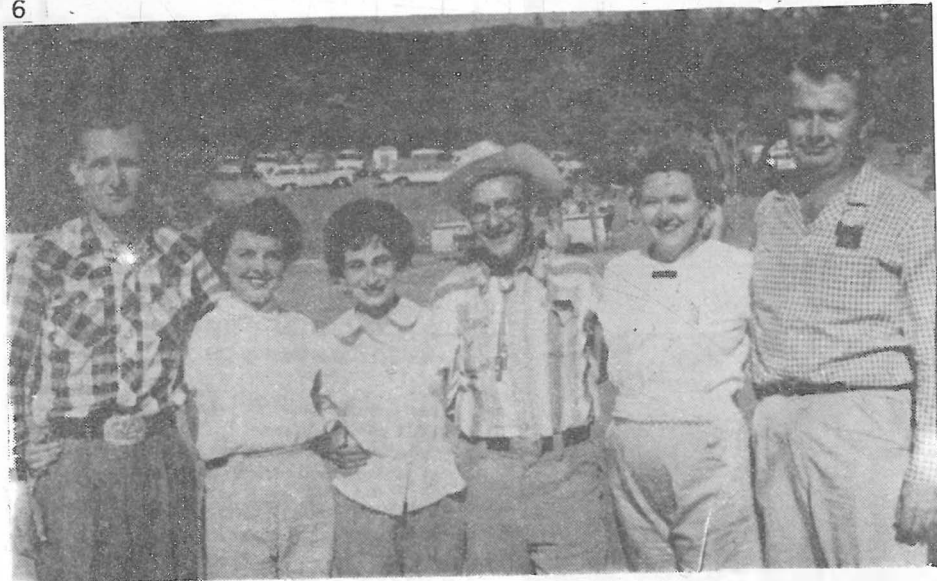

bonds for 33,000 acres. Voters in the entire area passed the \$3 million measure last March by a 93% majority. Colorado water will relieve string-ent users who now depend on wells, many of which are drying up.

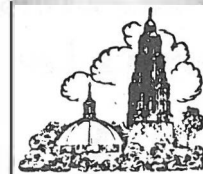
