



Betsy McCall's mother. just got back from a nice trip to Canada. She went some of the way by boat and had a wonderful time.



ministration so is hoping for a private offer to buy the \$3 million water bonds which were voted here in March.

Chas. C. Price, chairman, says they have lost enthusiasm due to the delays evidenced in the past rather than savings from lower interest federally.

"They have too much redtape" he says, "and if we run into underground trou ble and have to make changes, we must stop the contractor, redesign the drawings, submit them to LA, then they go to San Francisco, then somewhere in the midwest, and on to Washington. The holdups scare us, besides we found that contractors know this, bid higher to cover these delays, sometimes 5% to 10% more. There is just too much governmental control."

July meetings of the district will be in Lakeside, he says, on the 11th and the 25th, Tuesdays, and the public is welcome.
