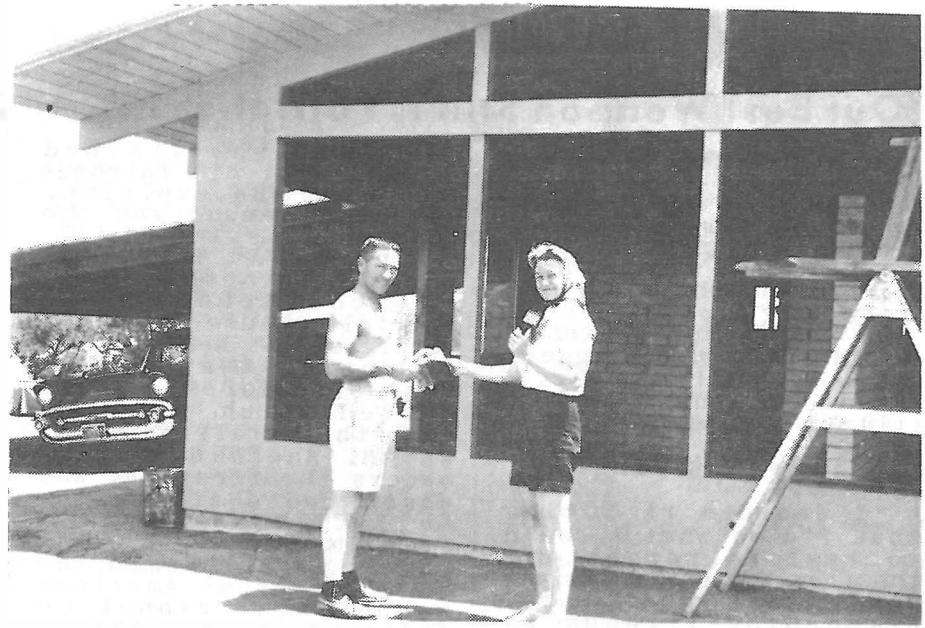

Our Best Weapon Still is Patriotism!

Arthur Godfrey's recent tiff with SD about seeing few flags on the fourth—he was out very early that morning—reminds us that an Alpine woman has started something for Old Glory.

On Washington's birthday, Mrs. Thos. H. Biggert, 1155 W. Victoria Dr., scanned Alpine from her hilltop, was struck by the fact that only a few homes were flying the colors.

"I decided right then that I'd do what I could to restore respect for the flag and our country's traditions" she says "by persuading friends to display it whenever appropriate".

So she went to buy a new 50-star flag for her home, but hit a snag.



No store she visited stocked any! "In fairness to them" she explains, "lack of demand was the main reason".

Finding that most flags are made in the east, she contacted an LA specialty house which was so pleased at her patriotic motive that a bulk cost price of \$3.85 was quoted which compares with the retail price of \$5.95. She obtained 27 orders the first day she announced their availability at this non-profit cost.

Mrs. Biggert told the Sun "One great American weapon that cannot be defeated is patriotism. The citizen that has it is invulnerable to any other 'ism', and one way to keep it alive is to display our American Flag and respect it".

School To Save Expenses

Supt. Clyde T. Gilley of Alpine Schools reports that the board has taken several steps to save in the coming year, the budget being about \$14,000 below last season.

The number of teaching positions will be reduced" he says, "a practical move since the number of students per teacher has declined". He will take on some duties usually handed to principals, who in turn will do some teaching. Numerous other expenses have also been reduced, he adds. Teacher salaries will be upped, this being lower than many other districts.
