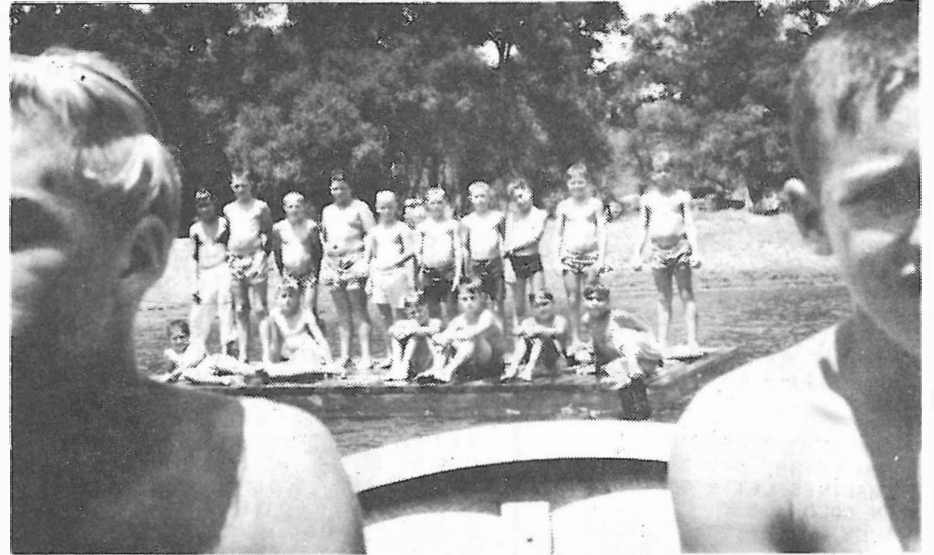

## BIG County Development Plan Helps Alpine

Every town in this county is on the verge of receiving a shot in the arm for its economy! Including Alpine.

BIG, a major industrial development project that will cover every phase of county economy, is now underway in SD.

Chief purpose, to bring new industry here, according to Milton F. Fillius, jr., chairman of the BIG-- Build Industrial Growth campaign-- with goal of 50,000 new jobs in the next decade.

Alpine, in the path of greater SD expansion through La Mesa, El Cajon and other areas, with water due next April, building increasing, zoning being done, an airport in the offing, and the freeway extending toward here, we have one of the best futures in the country. On top of all these advantages, Alpine is known for its finest climate in the US, which makes it doubly advantageous to any company to settle here. This area could well enjoy light, clean, noiseless industries where employees could live nearby in one of the most lovely spots in the world! -CI

AIRPORT story from page 1

Tuesday this project is coming into sight, for Harold Mattley of the county planning office visited the Sun to confer with us on details of the proposed airport, permit for which is being processed on the application of Alpine Flying Club, which I formed in 1958 to promote this project.

Within a few days the matter will be brought before supervisors for action. Shortly thereafter hearings will be held and if all goes well, a permit will be granted and work commenced to put Alpine on the US air map.

This is an air age. Federal, state and county officials are urging more airports for many reasons: safety, disaster, fire, war, reseeding, as a shuttle to terminals of airlines, and to promote flying among youngsters. A gliding club wants to come here, and a model plane club would spring up, too.

Wm. T. Piper, head of Piper Aircraft said, 'Just as soon as a community gains the stature of a general store, a gas station and a few houses, it's ready for its own airstrip. America must have tens of thousands of spots where planes can drop in occasionally. We'll not be complete till we get this country covered with airports.'

Four years ago Al Howe gave me my first light plane ride. Then I took lessons, have been flying over four years for pleasure, business and photography. Thus I saw more readily our real need of an airport. Before Sidney Wright died I approached him, but he would have nothing to do with airplanes. He owned the only suitable site, 245 acres on South Grade Road, with a fine mesa. Joe Rust county airport director came up, said it

would be ideal for a landing strip.

When Wright died, All Saints Episcopal Church in SD inherited the land, but did not care to sell or lease. Later I tried again, and the vestrymen were interested to have some income, so they came out and went over the land and my plan. For months we have been negotiating, with the result that today we have option on land for this project.

Next step was federal ok. Airport engineers K. K. Kellner and Carl Davidson, came from LA, went over the site with Rust, Al Smith, assistant manager of Gillespie Field, and myself. They wrote that it was ok, sent blanks to fill out. We also have the green light from the state's aviation director, Clyde P. Barnett, who urges communities to get busy on airports. Fallbrook is just now getting one.

Everywhere an airport has gone in, property values have upped and business and pleasure flying have been inaugurated. Plane owners here are Kenneth Hittle, Jack Smith, and Forrest McKinley of Holiday Ranch and myself, in a club at EC. There are numerous pilots interested: Robt. Tipton, John Gault, Corky Jones, Gene Adams, Andy Andrews, Weldon Wilson, Lee Riggs, and others, including Darwin Hauenstein who is building a home here.

With the advent of water, zoning, freeway, a bank, more building and recreation for the area, an airport would help in many ways to make Alpine, with its unsurpassed all-year climate, a magnet for a high type of visitor, tourist and prospective resident. That all adds up to prosperity.
