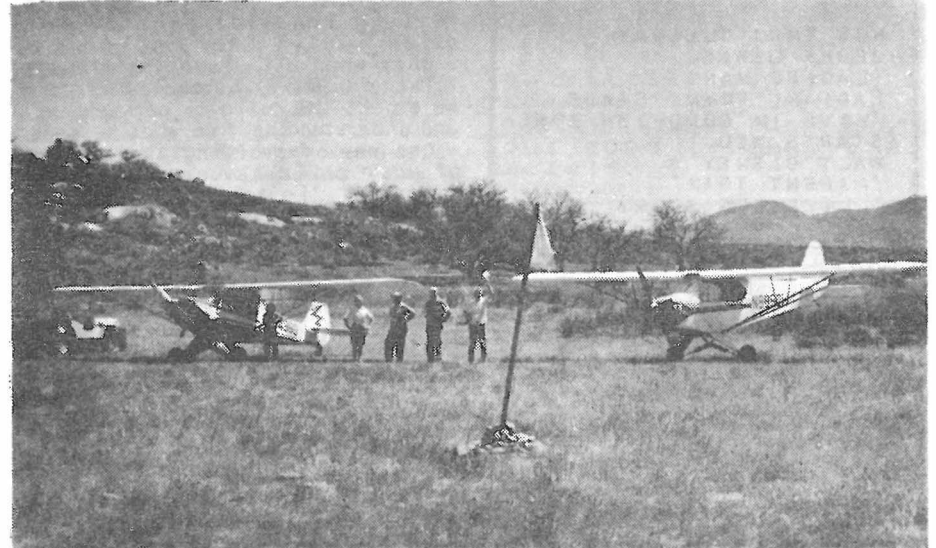

Your Child's Eyes

By Dr. Irving Arbutal, Optometrist

With school opening again, we find our children returning to work with their eyes. Thus undergoing great visual stresses. To function properly, a few basic requirements should be observed:

1. Ability to focus and point his eyes together as a team.
2. Accuracy in looking from one object to another.
3. Ability to keep his eyes on an object moving toward him, in a circular direction, from side to side, up and down, and at an angle.
4. Ability to sustain focus for close work.
5. Ability to use eyes and hands together with proper coordination.
6. Ability to see clearly at both a distance of 20 feet and 16 inches.

When a child cannot perform some of these visual skills, he may find himself classified as a reading behavior problem, or often just a lazy child.

Only when all visual skills are working together harmoniously, can we expect the child to get meaning, and understanding from what he sees.

One way of avoiding the chances of your child having difficulty in school, is to have a thorough optometric visual examination at the beginning of each school year.

By making sure his eyes are functioning at maximum efficiency, we as parents can help to make sure that our children are visually prepared for school.

EDITORIAL

When Enough Rebel then Trouble Starts!

Government, be it city, county, state or federal, when it needs more money, merely adds taxes. That is the only way they have of getting cash, although much business today is done by government.

But there is an old law of diminishing returns that can apply to taxation as well as any other matter. Two wars raised taxes, added a lot of 'temporary' ones. There is the excise levy on

many things, some of which are not luxuries, as the telephone, and others.

Then there is the gasoline tax-- state and US combined take now averages 10¢ a gallon, or around half the retail cost of gas itself! Someone once said that when taxes go over 25%, watch out for trouble.

This excessive tax, which hurts chiefly the worker and the small income group, an oil executive points out, is proving to be self-defeating. By 1965, he says, the states will be deriving 7% less from the gas tax than they planned, which will throw highway budgets out of kilter. His figures are borne out by reports from the Federal Bureau of Public Roads.

Motorists are rebelling at this tax on a daily necessity which is greater than on costly luxuries. So they drive less. Buy compact cars, or do both. But the end result is what worries one-- the revolt that might ignite! - CI

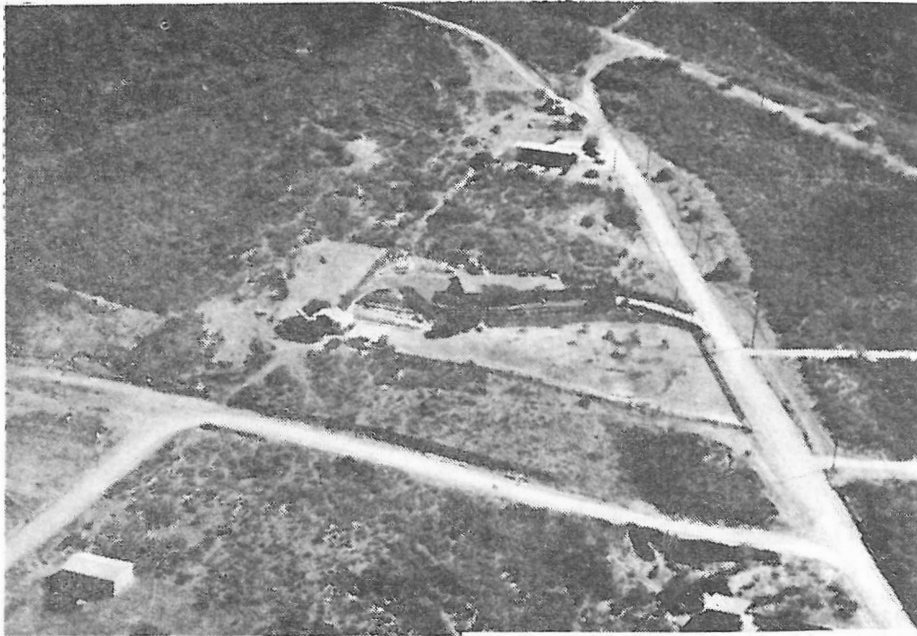

This being the hot weather season, you'll probably be especially interested in hearing about nutritious meals that can be prepared quickly and with ease.

I'll be presenting my "Ready-in-a-jiffy Meals" program on **Tuesday, September 12, at 10 a.m.**, and again on **Tuesday, September 26, at 1:30 p.m.** This cooking demonstration will be held in the air-conditioned auditorium of San Diego Gas & Electric Company's Eastern District Office, 104 North Johnson Street, El Cajon.

Contrary to a rather widespread impression, quickly prepared meals need not necessarily be expensive, as in the case of steaks. The real secret of "ready-in-a-jiffy" meals is in making plans well ahead of time - in fact, doing some food preparation in advance. 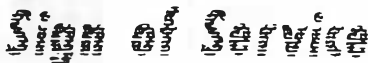

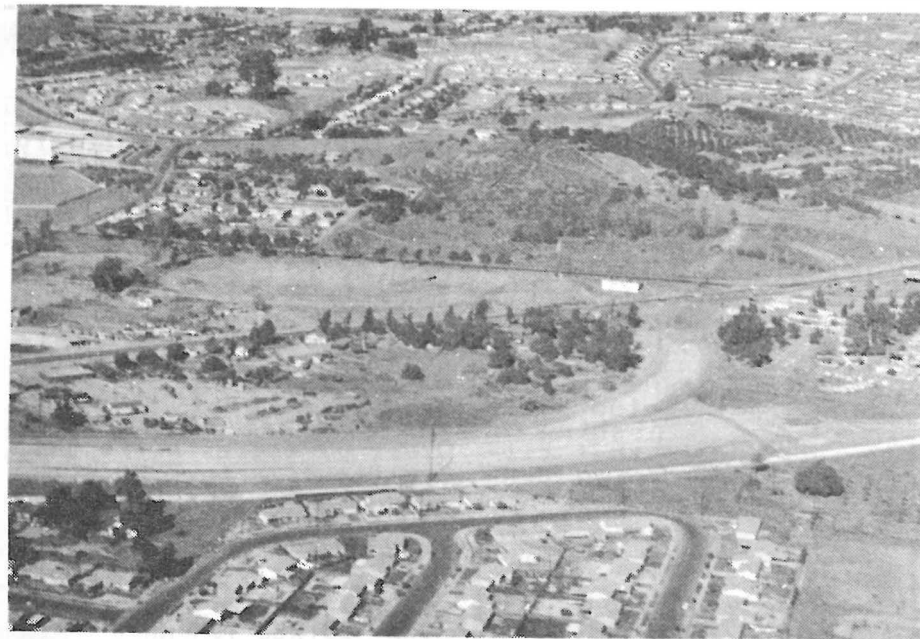
Judy Wilcox and her family are on vacation all this week.

completion by March 1-- provided not too much inclement weather hampers operations.

'In order to expedite installing lines, those who have signified intention to sign for service should get their applications in now, so we can plan definitely on putting the pipes in' says Price.

Payments which would start on Oct. 15, of the \$465, can be split into monthly installments, the final one being made prior to March 1, date water can be turned on, he adds. Checks or cash can be left in person at the office, 9739 Los Coches Road, Lakeside, or mailed to Box 656, Lakeside.

He pointed out that if an insufficient number sign for a certain road or area, lines cannot be put in till enough do sign. In that event payments will be refunded, but it is hoped that there will be no such delays. A form letter to this effect is going out by Sept. 15 to all residents in the general area.
