EDITORIAL

Beat Lowering Water Table by More Saving

A guest editorial by Jack Schrader

The Assemblyman from this, the 80th District, has worked for water in his area for many years. He knows the critical situation on his Ramona ranch, also in Alpine.

If you want to have more water, save it!

Wasting the precious fluid in our state today is rapidly coming to be one of the deadlier sins. Everyone is being impressed with the necessity of conserving every possible drop. The future wellbeing of the entire state depends, to a great extent, on our ability to provide an adequate and reliable supply.

For years, growing concern has been expressed over the lowering water tables in our great interior valleys. Water

agencies and users have been forced to go deeper after their supplies, and costs have sky-rocketed. But practical solutions have not been easy.

Hope for success has been renewed. Following a legislative mandate, the Assembly interim committee on water has started a two-year investigation of ground-water replacement problems, and of the need for legislation governing its usage.

At its first hearing, the group received information from both the state water rights board and the state department of water resources. Both were agreed that we must realize the maximum beneficial use of all ground-water resources if we are to meet future demands. Both were also of the opinion that legislation of some sort will be needed to reach this maximum.

This is one of the most urgent and critical problems California has had to face in its history and we are going to do our best to solve it. In the meantime, everyone should remember to save, save, save!

Note- Captain Settle, now retired and living in SD, was a young ensign on the USS Callao, a gunboat based in Hongkong and Canton when I was a slightly younger yeoman 3c, on that small craft, in 1912. He was a splendid officer and a Southern gentleman. We had not heard of each other till a couple of years ago when we enjoyed an interesting visit at his lovely home overlooking the bay, and have kept in touch ever since.

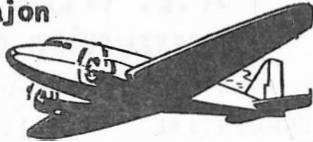

A record total of \$381,833,000 for 1960-61 in state taxes on gasoline, diesel fuel and liquefied butane gas, and on gross receipts of buses and trucks, was reported by the board of equalization. This was 3% over the prior year or \$11 million, and double over a decade ago. This fund is used solely for building and maintenance of highways, roads and streets.

Note- In the year 8 million motor vehicles burned over 5½ billion gallons. Thus it is easy to see that the eternal smog that hangs over the coast is from the highways, not refineries. Flying from here to LA we always note that the smoke is solid now between the two big cities! But the real puzzle is why none of this money is used to improve Hwy 80 between EC and Alpine. 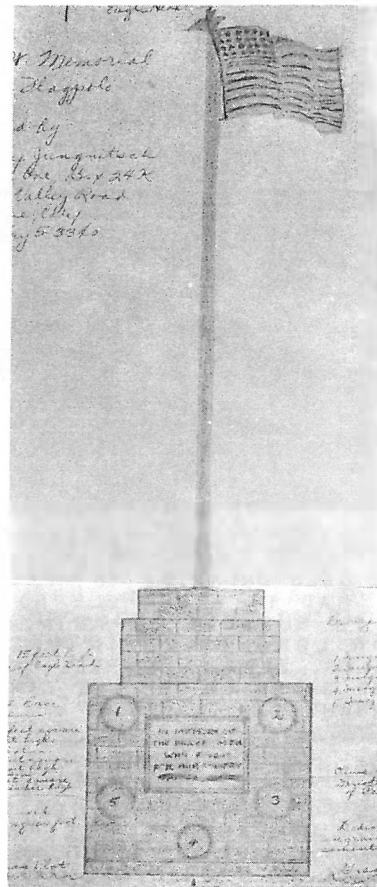

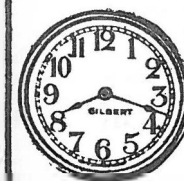
