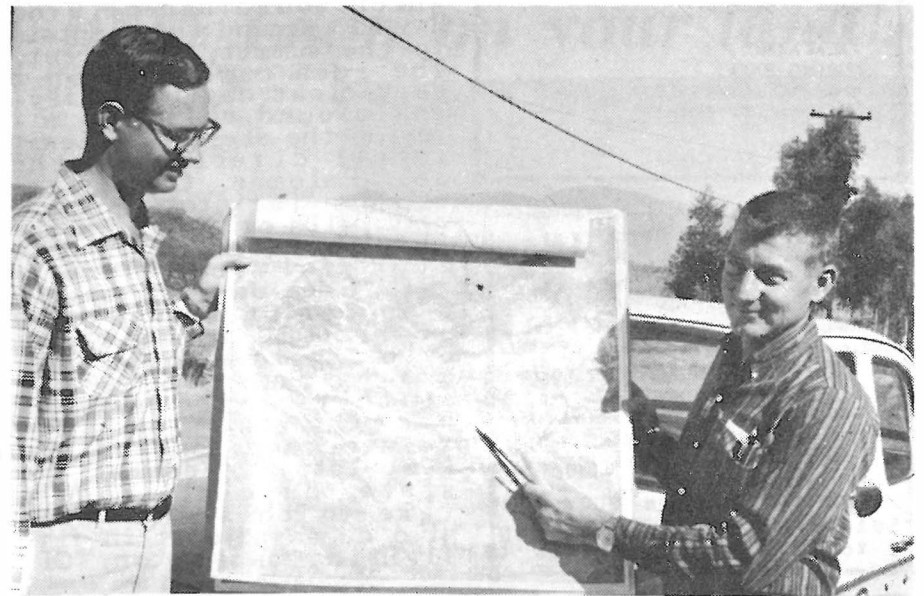

STARTING BRIDLE TRAILS GROUP

Tonight at 8 at Willow Glen Farm, 545 Alpine Heights Road, an organizing meeting will be held to follow up the first discussion session Tuesday night to promote a bridle trails association.

Present were Miss Margaret Lothian, noted horse and dog breeder, Eugene Freeland, associated with her in this venture, and Carl McCall, three ardent horse lovers and boosters for Alpine.

'This will be an open

meeting' McCall told the Sun, 'and those interested are invited to attend and help get the project underway.'

They plan to secure dedicated trails along fences over private lands to make connections with existing state riding and hiking trails, also get permanent public bridle trails to encompass the community.

Freeland, an engineer, was instrumental in getting the state trails into the Southland, and will be a valuable asset to the proposed group.

Note- This is fine! For some months I have been planning a project for the Sun, which would tie into the above. It is a Viejas Mountain Scenic Drive, which would ascent from Hwy 80, around the mountain to the summit, 2442 feet. The idea came when on a very clear day I was flying around the top, enjoying the startling views in all directions; the sea, Palomar, Cuyamacas, Mt. San Jacinto, and the hazy hills of Mexico, with Alpine nestled in the peaceful foothills.

The idea came as to what a wonderful drive, hike or ride it would make, bringing fame to Alpine. The Sun is starting work on this project now by writing the forestry service and some of our legislators. Federal and state officials should take to this. It would also be an adjunct in fire fighting and so on. -CI.

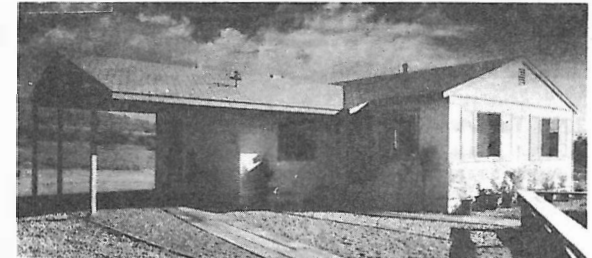

Will Man Ever Catch up on Water Supply?

America's water problem-- not just Alpine's-- grows greater every year, scientists have pointed out.

By 1980, reports R.B. Keane in Service, a magazine of Cities Service Co., population growth plus greater per capita use, is expected to jump the nation's daily needs to 600 billion gallons daily. A Senate committee has estimated that to prepare for these needs will cost \$54 billion!

The strange part is that it pours out of the skies in vast quantities at times flooding large areas, yet today's top problem in conservation is-- water. He tells how schools, factories and business have had to shut down; homes buy water at 50¢ a gallon; penalties made

for leaking faucets; rationing of water and many other restrictions. We have had that right in this dry county.

Precipitation yields the astronomical figure of 4300 billion gallons a day in this country. If all were saved, it would cover the whole nation to 30 inches in the year.

First, most all water is salty, unfit for anything. Much is being done to desalt it, but that is slow and costly. Rainfall is unpredictable, floods and runs away to the seas. Evaporation and absorption take a lot.

We need more water every day in homes, industry, on farms. Industry alone uses 160 gallons daily. Sewers consume a huge amount, but little is recovered-- and it could be.

This paper has written editorials on SAVING WATER. If we built plastic, gunite, cement rills, creeks and catchers, we could conserve millions of gallons, sluice it into settling reservoirs, then pump and filter it into storage tanks to cut into our water systems.

This is a challenge to our city, county, state and federal governments. When we do this we will have accomplished far more than putting a man onto that dry old moon!

Stephen Huff got the off his arm. He broke it several weeks ago.

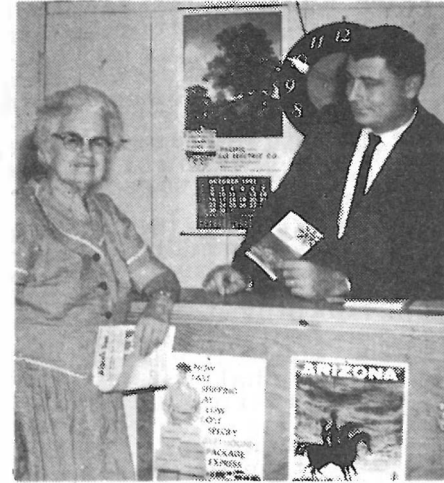

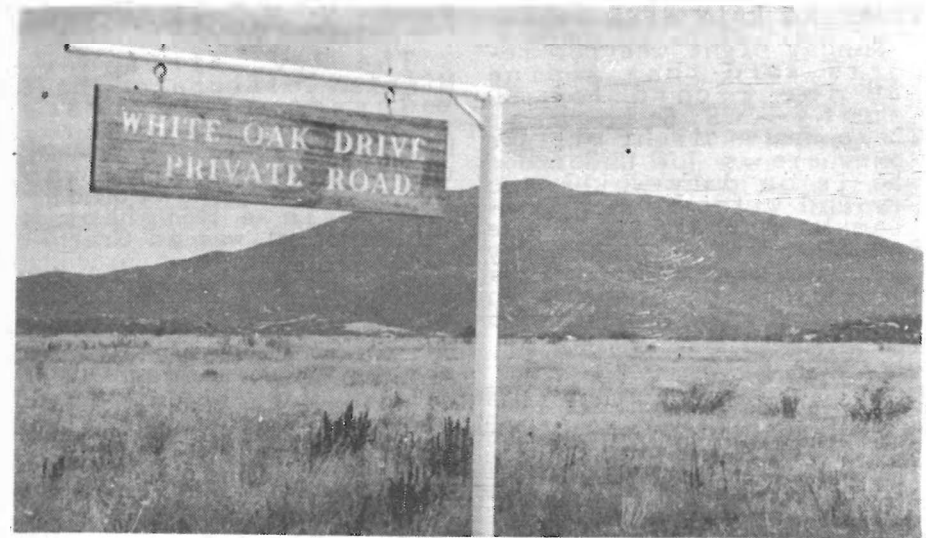

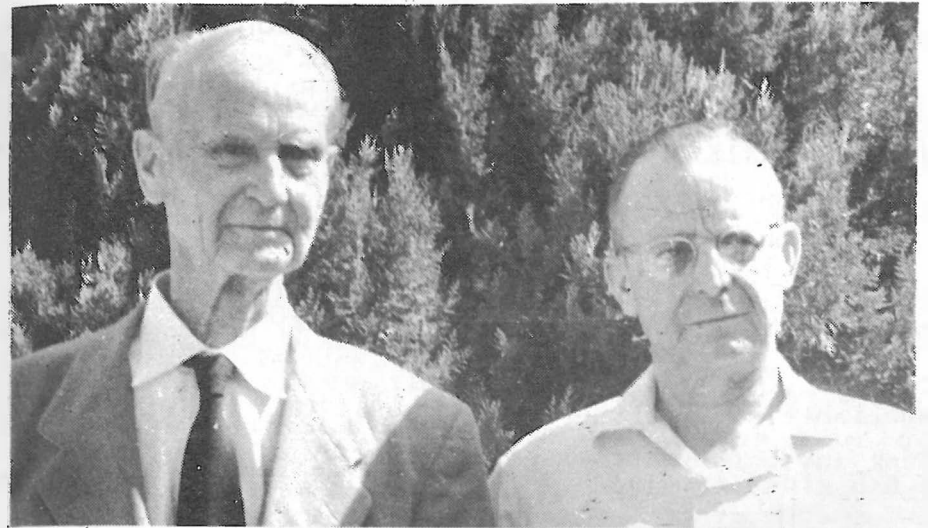
Judge Walters Back



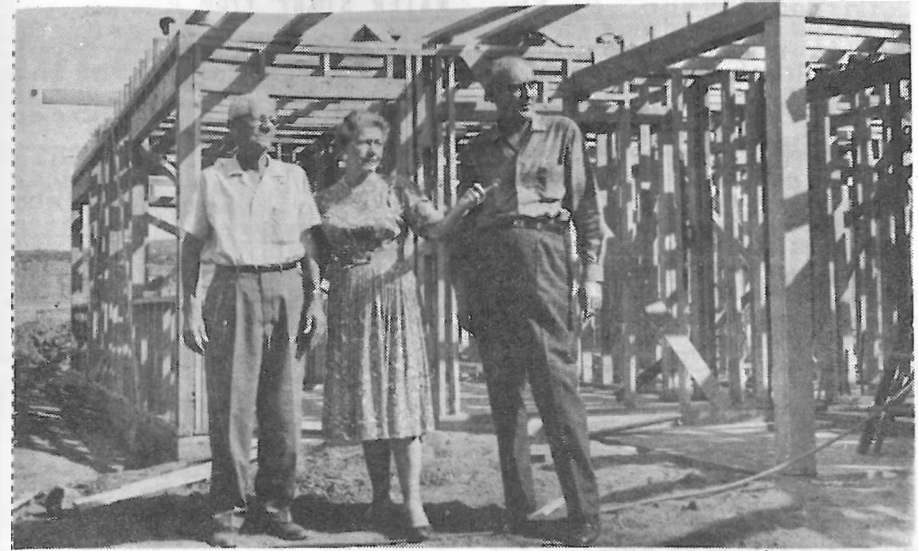
