The inspirational will be presented by Rev. Vaughn Steen of the First Baptist Church of the Willows.

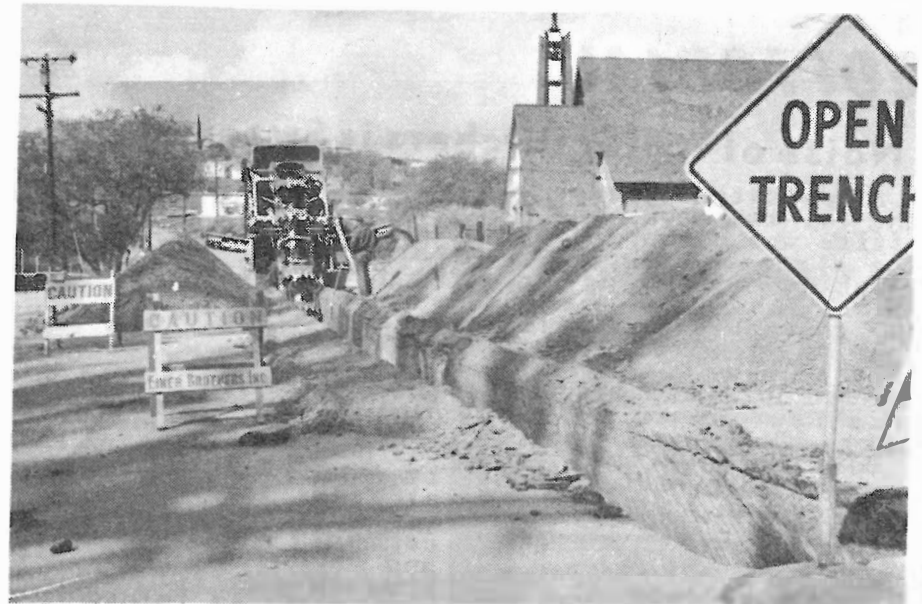
A nominating committee is to be elected from the floor to select a slate of officers for next year, installation to be in May.

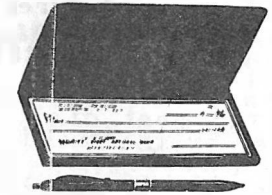

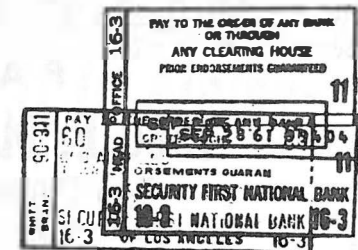

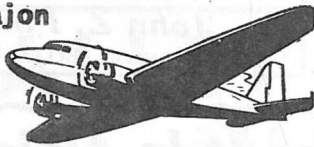

Bradley Clark had his 13th birthday last Saturday. He had only boys come to it.

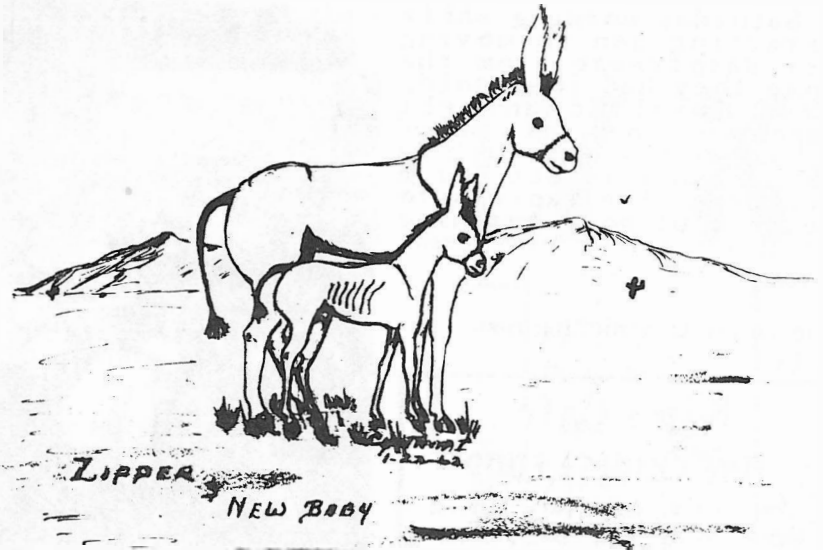

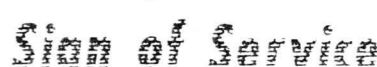
The Rev. H.L. Christmann of the EC Christian Church of which she was a member, conducted the service.
