Of course the NY State Athletic-- what a travesty on the word-- Commission, launched an investigation. Gov. Rockefeller asked for a complete report on the death-dealing affair.

Anyone who witnessed the carnage saw an addled

referee allowing a man fallen on the ropes to be hammered into unconsciousness. Even a fight amateur could see the lack of sportsmanship in this murderous assault on a man that was half conscious, already knocked out, being brutally dealt fatal blows.

When they call fighting a sport, they misuse the word. This world is tottering on the verge of slaughter by atomic bombs, and we wonder why. Man will not reach his utopia till he eliminates some of the brutal pastimes he thinks he enjoys;

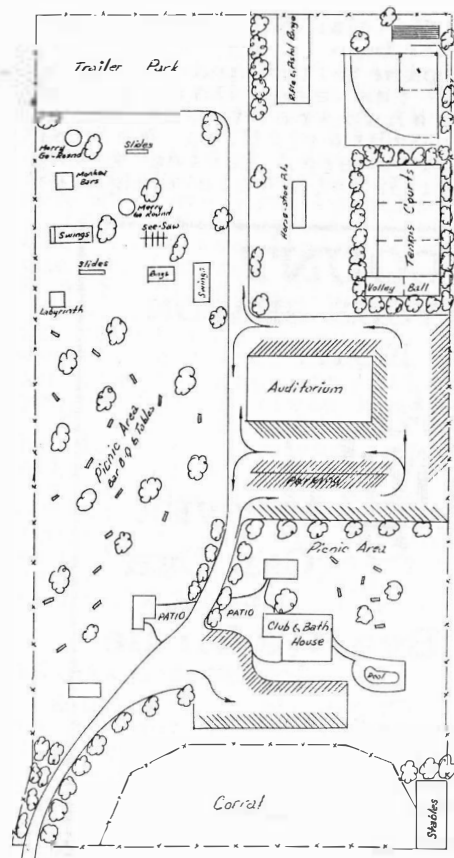
Wanda and Gilda Naylor had to move from Peacock Ranch last week on account of Dinosaur Land going in there. They moved to Harbison Canyon.

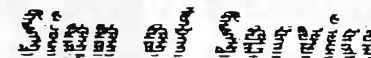

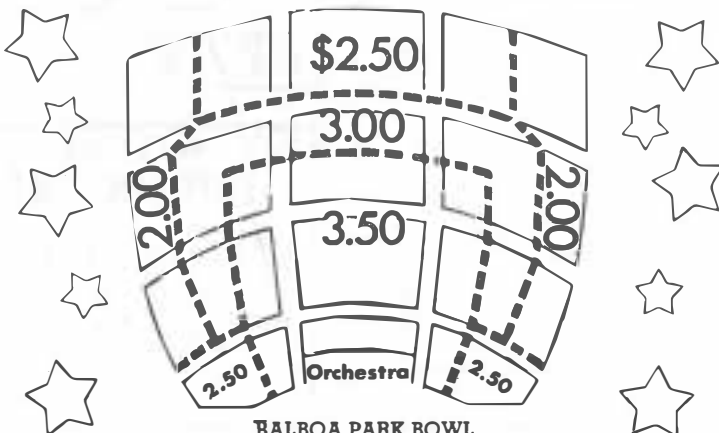

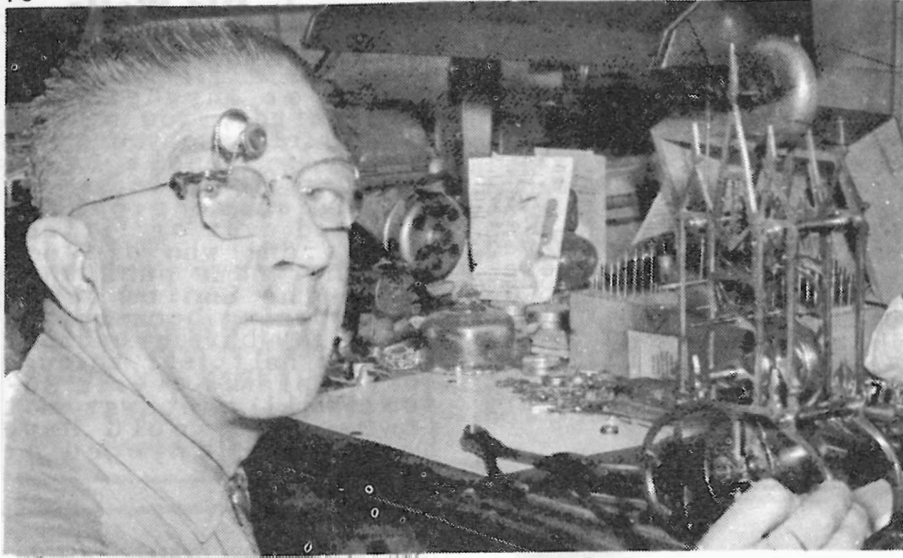

Has Antique Clocks

What treasures may be found in junk piles or old second hand shops is well illustrated in EC where R. W. White, 1611 N. Second, has a rare collection of antique clocks. He has 35 genuine antiques which he has gathered in over 30 years.

One of his prize items is an old English skeleton clock, handmade by an unknown craftsman perhaps in the 15th century. It was repaired by a man who put the wrong sized cable on, and was repaired by A. Kari, jeweler,

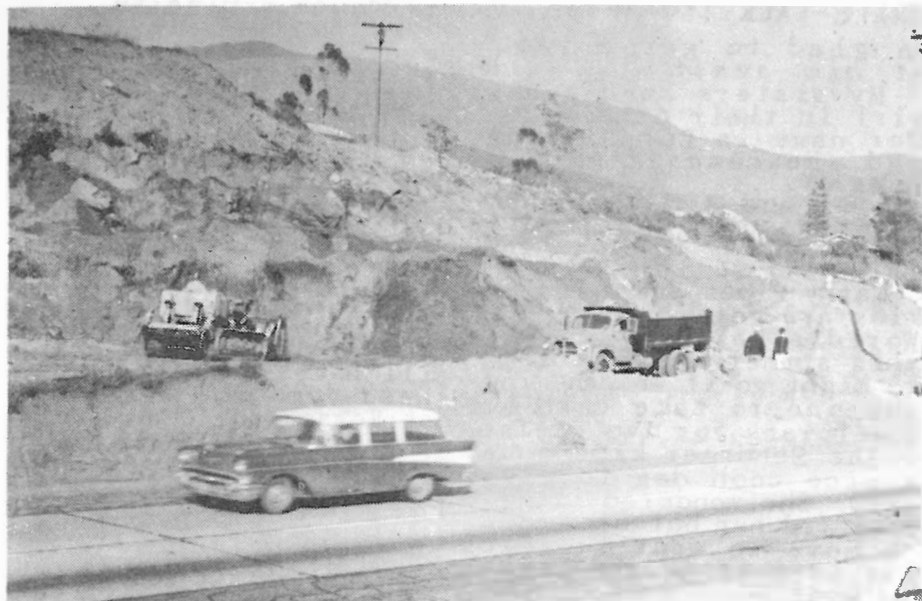
