# EDITORIAL

## Is America's Legal Swindle Really Legal??

'No wonder we're broke'! is the heading of a thought provoking ad from Warner & Swasey, Cleveland precision machinery firm since 1880, which a reader sent in.

It has to do with foreign aid, cash the American taxpayer has given or loaned since the end of War 2. 'Not to help win the war, remember, but since its end', it says.

'And if you think these billions were to win

friends for decency, think this one over; it continues. 57 billions of this give-away went to nations who boast of being neutral; they want our money but refuse to call themselves our friends-- call or act like it.

Then it gives the total of \$84,090,200,000. and says 'The list of your gifts is well worth studying (it certainly has cost you enough!)--'

We quote only a few: (in billions): Yugoslavia 2.1, Greece, 3.0, India, 2.3, Brazil, 1.3, (Friendly Italy, 5.5, United Kingdom, 8.6, China, 3.8, Turkey, 3.0) In millions: Cuba, 52.0, Mexico, 600.0, and Tunisia, 135.2. The source; Congressional Record.

The point that maddens most thinking Americans is that, no matter how trivial a sum, we must vote bonds for schools, roads, water and even the school tax rate. But in Washington they collect our income and other taxes, and spend it without a vote of the people.

The editorial concludes: 'Any sane American-- if he can control his temper long enough-- can write his own editorial. Or obituary'.

Will it be just another editorial, or will the Reds write our obituary, or will a revolution sweep this nation to get control? CI.

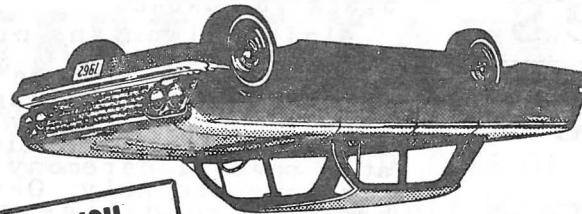

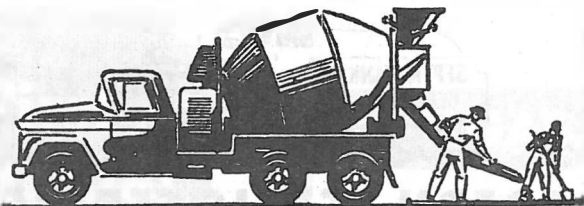

As Cletus Gardner, county parks and recreation director told the Sun 'One comes along and stops the water, then another hits and the water returns. Geologists have warned us that we might lose our supply, so we have had to go carefully'.

Last week the springs turned away 750 cars, the week before, 450, and previously, 250. All spaces were filled and they did not have enough water. However they are now open again with the new trailer park.

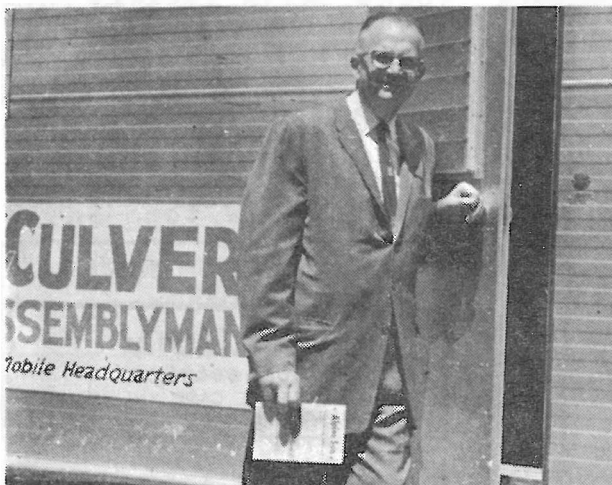
