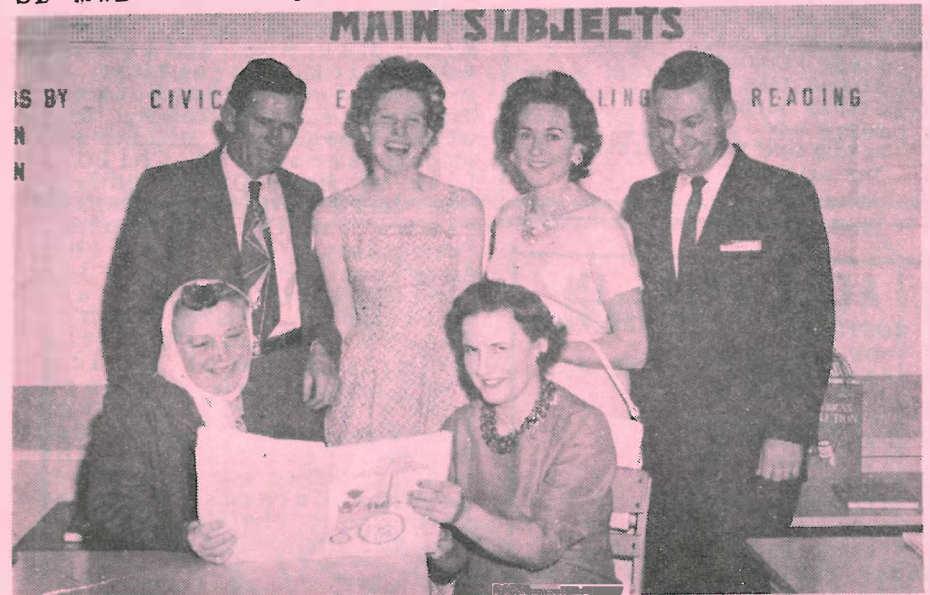

He pointed out that their scheme is a huge national debt, which we now have spiraling, and continued inflation, which we have, plus colossal internal and foreign aid commitments, which insure the continuance of such policy for many years, regardless of what party is in power!

'The only alternative would be drastic political surgery with reorganization and abolishment of the greatest part of federal bureaus which they use for running the government and the people', he adds.

This is borne out by our own congressman Utt, who says we are rapidly approaching the point where a complete change of elected officials, including Congress and the White House, means little change in policy.

'Thus you are governed more and more by people for whom you have never voted, he says for whom you never will vote, whom you have never seen, and whom you cannot recall by your vote... this is a form of invisible government and can lead to the most oppressive type of tyranny'

Yes, if we cant to retain our diminishing freedom, for which America's founders fought so valiantly, we had better start looking at the situation today--- and doing something about it!-CI

Letter To Editor

Dear Editor:

Since printing the letter by the Facts Finding Committee of 'Action', people have been asking for more facts. There are many ways of presentation and several of us thought this approach interesting.

The 1960-61 total income for the school was \$230,576. The number of children going 180 days was 542. The amount of time a student spends in school and on school-provided transportation was seven hours a day. Now there are other factors, but they cancel each other out pretty evenly. So to make it simple we dealt with the above figures.

Dividing the total income by the number of days the school was open gives the school \$1,280 a day to operate on. Now that is a pretty impressive figure, but you divide that by 542, the number of children being prepared for life at Alpine school and the amount drops to a meagre \$2.36 per pupil. Take the next item and divide, and the figure drops to .33¢ per hour.

Where else can such value be had? One can't hire a baby sitter for less than .50¢ plus food and sometimes transportation. A bargain is fine but the majority of bargains are likely to reflect a fairly close relationship between the price and value received. Fortunately cooperative effort does reduce cost, but it is obvious there must be a ratio involved even here. Besides this, the citizens of Alpine aren't actually paying the .33¢ an hour since 66.24% of this school district's revenue comes from the state, into which one can assume Alpiners pay a very small percentage.

There are figures which can be used to estimate the amount per hour drawn directly from Alpine if that is of interest to anyone. Take \$57,000 and start dividing.

Is there too much money going into Alpine School? If someone thinks there is, let's hear just how you have come to that conclusion. Facts Finding Committee of 'Action' Citizens Committee.

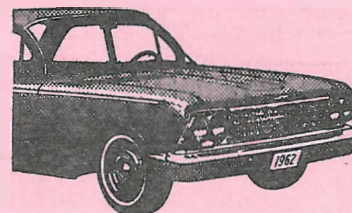

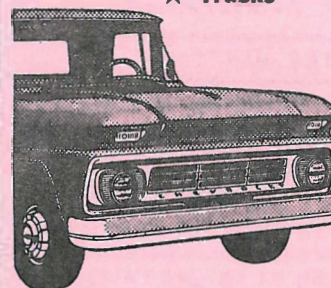
