EDITORIAL

Hoover Warns on Summer Fun and Tragedy!

Vacation is here, a time for carefree fun and relaxation with lots of outdoor activities. Are parents prepared? This question was brought up by J. Edgar Hoover, our fine director of the FBI. 'Regrettably,' he says 'to many it will be a season of tragedy. They will be victims of the annual onslaught of crimes of passion and violence'. Records show that forcible rape rises

16% above its annual average. Murder and aggravated assault goes up 12% each. And depraved sex attacks on innocent children climbs similarly. 'These figures,' he adds 'will become known only to police. Untold numbers of victims will remain silent through fear of personal embarrassment. So to a large degree, this shocking picture is an indictment of a careless and unwitting citizenry. For example, a vacationing family, otherwise cautious, are apt to minimize the inherent danger in the signalling thumb of a hitchhiker. Such a hasty benevolent act could place them in the clutches of a vicious killer.'

He concludes with an admonition to 'parents who fail to warn their children to avoid secluded spots, to refuse rides and reject gifts or enticements from strangers, are guilty of gross negligence' And this makes it hard on law enforcement officers as well as the victims, so why not rehearse your children now, so they will be ready when vacation starts. - CI

BOOK REVIEW

"The California I Love" By Leo Carrillo

Published 1961 by Prentice-Hall, Inc., Englewood Cliffs, NJ. 280 pp. cloth, \$7.50.

Here is a tome every one that loves California will read with deep nostalgia for the early days that the author describes. As a lad I also was raised in Santa Monica, knew Leo, his father, then Judge in Municipal Court, his brother, his sister Diana, and was in the same grade with another brother, Ottie, presently a realtor there.

The last time I saw Leo was when I flew down to Palomar Airport at Carlsbad where he had his famous big ranch that he restored over a period of years. Unknown to the world he was dying of cancer, but he never let on, instead he talked of the future, even invited me to drive down with my family to visit him. He passed on before we got there.

He had left an heritage of glowing, lyrical literature for those who sense the glorious days of the past, in addition to his romantic successes on film, stage and TV.

Herein he lifts the curtain of time on idyllic fiestas and the fandangoes of long ago in our splendid

joyous land of song and gaiety so that we might hear through the ages the tambourines, castanets, guitars, violins, flutes and horns creating an immortal symphony of contentment in my California'.

Carrillo gives credit for collaboration to Ed Ainsworth, columnist of the LA Times, a Texan who became a real Californian, wrote much about the genuine old west. This reading is a moving cavalcade of history and legend, will intrigue every reader that appreciates the golden state. And you'll enjoy the portions that mirror his fine work in show business, the great men, actors, artists and others he has known, and of course laced throughout is his eternal love of God and Nature, his horses, and other animals, flowers, trees and the everlasting hills.

Enjoying the tranquillity of his rancho, I appreciate more than one knows, his feeling at the end of the book when he says 'Spiritually a man can never be lonely. Always the living presence of tender souls, now departed, tend him in his receptive hours when the world presses in not too heavily' -CI

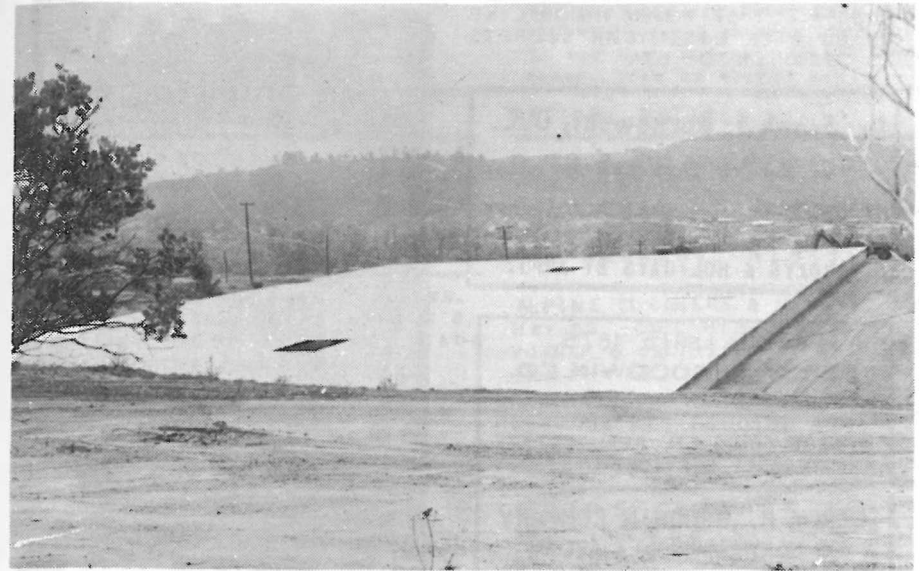

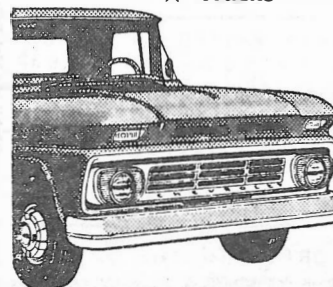
