Thalidomide Reveals Drug Trade Jobbery!

The old saying "never give a sucker a chance" seems to apply to the American public! For the thalidomide scandal clearly shows up a base practice of drugmakers and their salesmen, the medics.

The government reports that 15,904 unsuspecting patients received the untested pills from US doctors who, as in years past, have been given all kinds of nostrums to try out on patients by manufacturers for experimental use

while efforts were being made to obtain clearance from the Food & Drug office for their release.

Everyone now knows the appalling story of this drug; 3,500 deformed babies in Germany; between 800 and 1200 in Great Britain; eight in Canada, a few in the US. And how many more to come?

Thank Heaven there was an American woman, Dr. Frances O. Kelsey, in Washington, who kept her foot down on releasing this "wonder" drug, although she was unkindly criticised. Two years she gritted her teeth, said No! Then came the holocaust of deformed infants, unless little humans, made so by an untried drug.

Last March the W.S. Merrill Co., Cincinnati, seeing the avalanche of horrifying results when pregnant women used thalidomide withdrew their application for clearance!

In this country, sadly enough, we have too many abortions and deaths as it is, without having women go traipsing around the world to get rid of possible legless, armless or otherwise deformed infants. Perhaps our women should practice a little Amazonia, or shall we just become so flabby-- men and women-- that we will one day just fade away?—CI

It caused a short that burned a wire which hit the ground and blew the fuses. Workmen from the SD Gas & Electric Co. quickly on the job, found the spot and by 5:03 restored power.

Incidentally this was the first power off which did not bother folks who were connected to the new water system as water is supplied from the W. Victoria Reservoir by gravity.

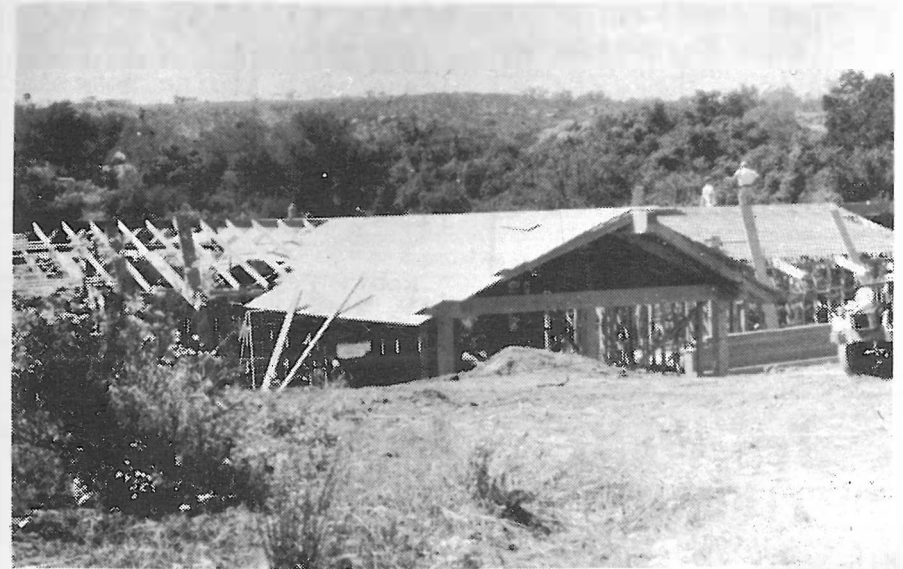
