The government reports that 15,904 unsuspecting patients received the untested pills from US doctors who, as in how many more to come? years past, have been given; all kinds of nostrums to try out on patients by manufacturers for experimental use

Everyone now knows the appalling story of this drug; 3500 deformed babies in Germany; between 800 and 1200 in Great Britains eight in Canada, a few in the Us. And

Thank Heaven there was an American woman, Dr. Frances O. Kelsey, in Washington, who kept her foot down on releasing this "wonder" drug, although she was unkindly criticised.
