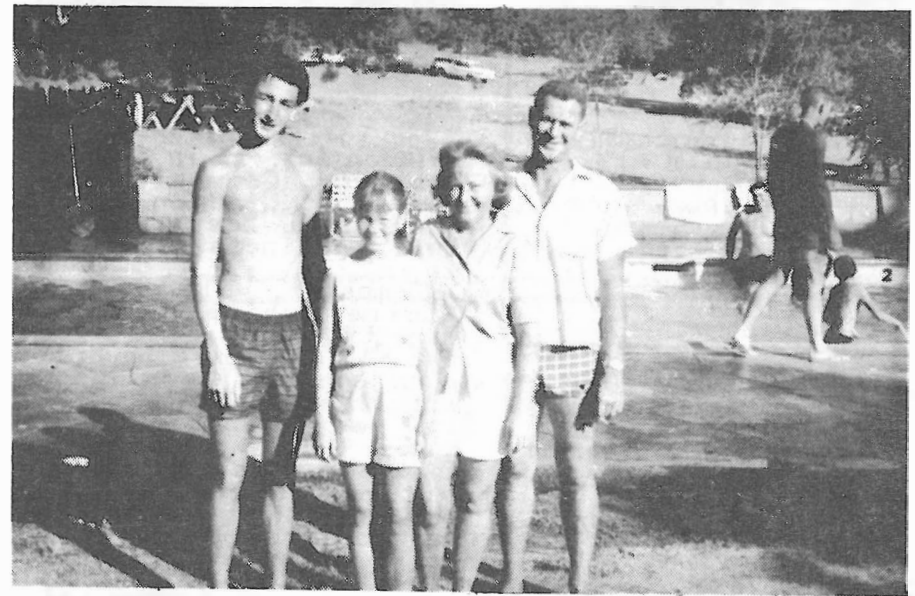

## Meeting Coach Stagg was Big Inspiration!

The grand old man of football, Coach Amos Alonzo Stagg, just celebrated his 100th birthday. He earned it in many ways. The event no doubt stirred the memories of many a football player.

For me it revived a pleasant memory of a fellowship at sea when I returned to Hawaii back in 1939 after selling my place here on South Grade Road.

Coach Stagg, then a spry 77, was taking his College of the

Pacific boys over to play in the Islands. I did an interview with him, became deeply inspired by this short, gray-haired man whose fame is world-wide for his ideal way of life; no smoking, no liquor and no profanity.

He had a reputation for intriguing plays. but always started his game with a personal prayer: "Lord, let me do my best", not just a request that his team win. He was a mighty successful coach for 70 years, starting in Chicago in 1892 where he was for 41 years.

This fine "young" gentleman inspired hundreds of lads to live the life of abstinence, to play the game for the game's sake, to be always fit, and to strive to be one of the best in the team effort.

It must be a great inner satisfaction to Amos Alonzo Stagg today to gaze down the years and know that he played the game by that admonition, "To thine own self be true". Thus he has not been false to any man, but has inspired others with the great truths by which he lives. I am grateful that I knew him for those few days at sea.-Cl



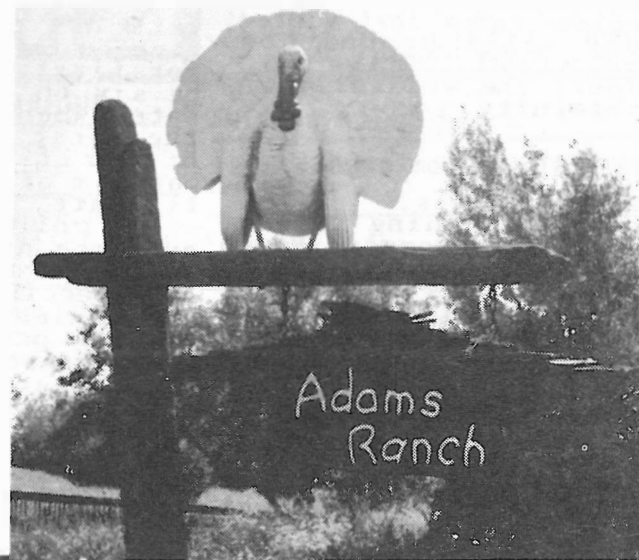

## Pilot Spots Fire

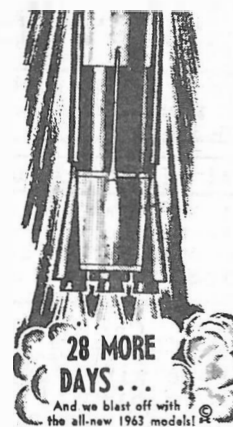
