CLARENCE STEARNS

Services for Clarence G. Stearns, 85, of Zumbrota Road, were held in his birthplace, Zumbrota, Minn., Tuesday, following his death Sunday in Naval Hospital, Minneapolis, after major surgery the week before. With his wife, Inez, he had as usual been spending the summer at their lodge on the lake at Grand Marais. They were about to leave for Alpine where they had lived for 11 years, when he was stricken.

Stearns was a highly civic-minded citizen, a member of Kiwanis, Community Church, Acacia Masonic Club, and was a past-president of the Photographers Association of America. He was also a life member of the Camera Craftsmen of America and an honorary life member of the American Society of Photographers. He retired 25 years ago in Rochester, Minn. as a portrait photographer.

Among many noted subjects he had taken were Presidents F.D. Roosevelt and Calvin Coolidge; Elias Calles, former Mexican president; Boxer Jack Dempsey, Coach Knute Rockne and many others.

Besides his widow, survivors are two daughters, including Mrs. Elizabeth S. Hulbert, La Jolla; a son, and seven grandchildren.

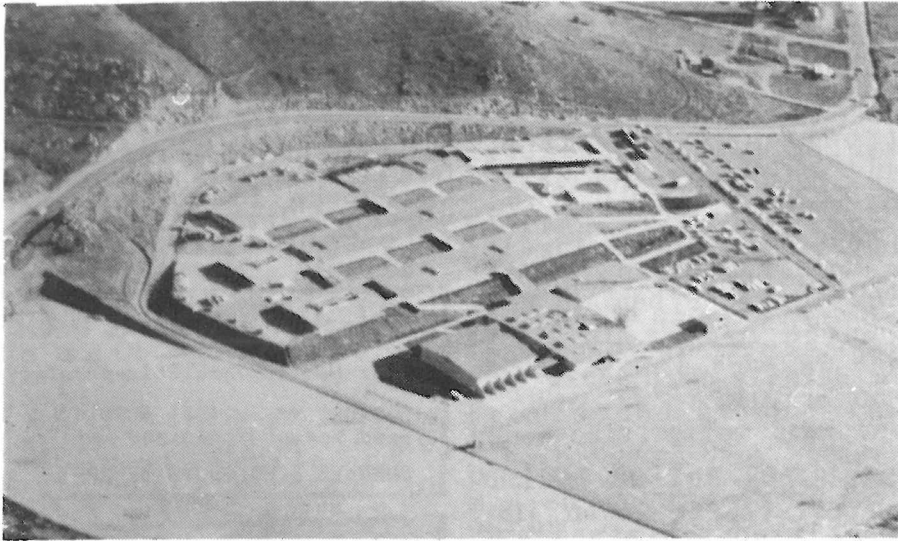

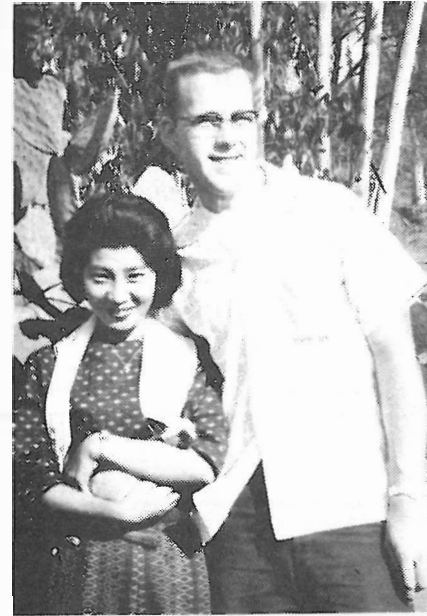


