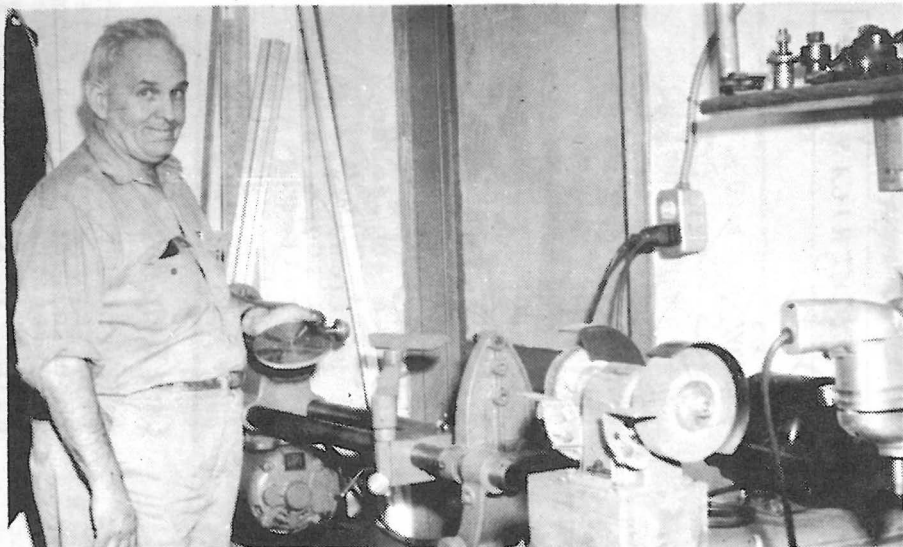

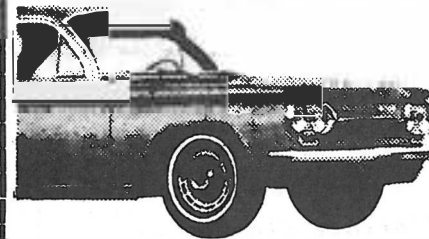

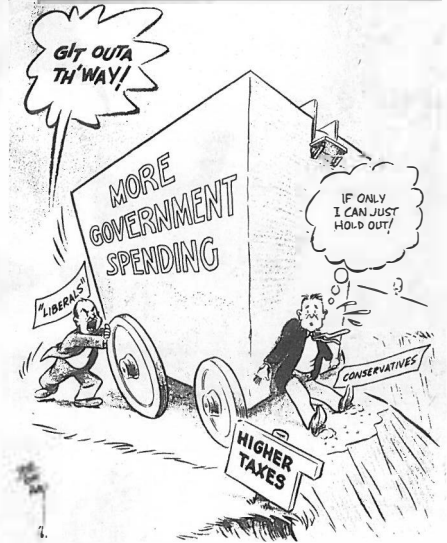

Green's have one of their palomino horses for sale. I haven't seen Jimmy or Martha lately so don't know which one. We just saw the sign on the fence as we rode by.

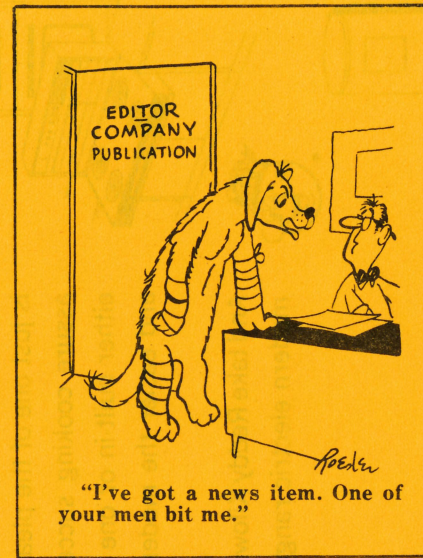
