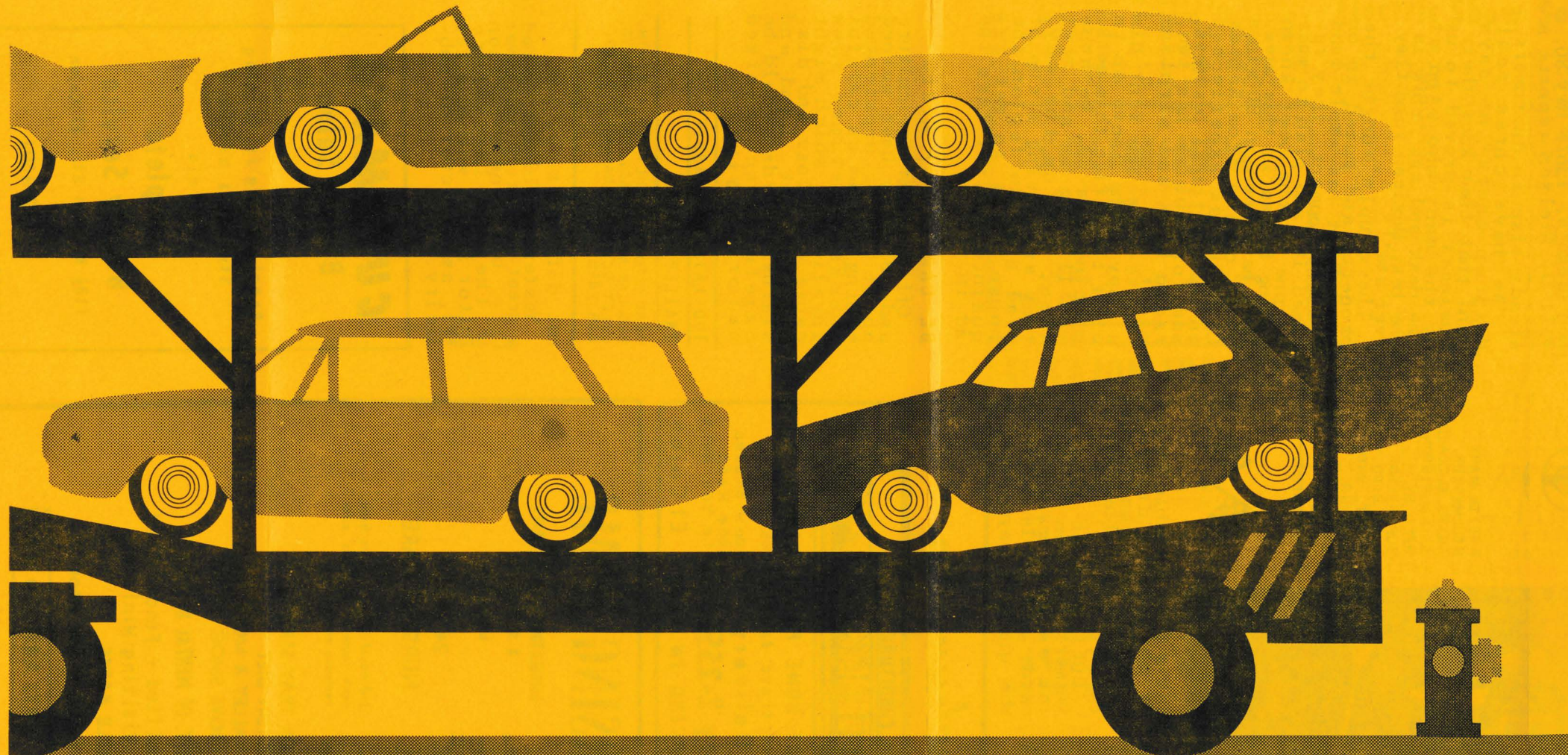

# EDITORIAL

## Two Important Things Face State on Jan. 1

The reelection of Gov. Brown brings up two important matters that vitally concern California and the nation.

First, he is avowedly in favor of human rights. On Jan. 1, this country observes the centennial of the effective date of the Emancipation Proclamation, which Lincoln gave his life for along with thousands of Americans.

Second, about the same time, California becomes the largest state, no mean position, which will give its efforts for human betterment, distinct recognition here and abroad.

In a talk at LA in October, Brown said "I think the time in America has long passed for so-called 'safe' approaches (to civil rights)-- if

there ever was such a time. Today, when there are Mississippians who openly predict the death of James Meredith, I say it is time to stand up and be counted".

Here, here, we say! Why should white people enjoy freedoms that their sons, and the sons of Colored people, the Japanese and other minority groups, all died together that America might remain free?

He quoted words "of the Hon. James B. Parsons, the first Negro Federal district judge, who spoke at Lincoln's tomb in Springfield, Ill. last month: 'Full emancipation of the Negro in America has been but half accomplished in these 100 years. Yet, if civilization is to survive, the full emancipation of all mankind must be accomplished in the next 10 years.'"

We must remember that Brown's first objective was the-- onerous to some-- Fair Employment Practices Commission act, the Unruh Civil Rights Act and the Hawkins Housing Act. All were designed to enhance the rights of all citizens.

This is supposed to be a Christian nation. Then let us all act like Christians. We believe that this way of life will survive and make a better world.-CI

is being readied for a 2 pm start Sunday. It begins at Ash and Magnolia, ends at Second and E. Main where the record 116 units breakup.

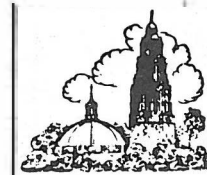

night and a chuckwagon breakfast Sunday at the fairgrounds where the rally is held. They have slated all manner of exhibits, events, contests, a parade and so forth, even a horse-show.

Note- Your editor, publishing Let's Live at Hollywood in 1940, became a trailerite, organized the first club in the west, the Pacific Trailer Club, there being only one in the US, the old Tin Can Tourists. Today there are hundreds.

Mobilhome living is increasing every year, shown by distribution of nearly \$4 million in fees to counties. LA leads with \$1,079,195; SD next with \$330,641, and Orange third, with \$353,717. This is for the half year to June 30, based on a trailer count of 223,134, compared with 210,702 last year. This does not include campers which pay added truck fees, but are used like small trailers for travel, hunting, vacationing.

**SCHOOL STORY** from page 1 came when trustees voted 3-2 to fire Mrs. Marjorie Cooper as board secretary, and relieved Supt. Gilley of fire-hire authority.

As usual since the fracas started, Pres. J.R. Reynolds, Chas. Kildgore and Laurence Wilcox were the three, while Stuart Day and Fred Rushing voted the two.

Day claimed there were three factions moving in three directions; those for the board, those against it, and those interested only in school taxes. During vociferous words from the audience, some walked out on the session; others mumbled, some laughed.

"They ought to get a TV camera up here and let the people see just how silly and cheap all this is," a man remarked. "It's doing Alpine a lot of damage."

The recall petitions have now about 400 signers to remove the solid three voters, but it is opposed by the Parents Union for Better Schools favoring the three. Their letters have been sent out with a stamped envelope to Reynolds, but no signatures

are on, and it accuses the recall committee of making a smokescreen.

When Mrs. Cooper was dismissed, audience reaction could be seen in the crowd of over 100. Kildgore said she had been active in the recall petition work, which she denied. This does not affect her post as school secretary, in which she reaffirmed her loyalty to the superintendent.

Zane Dana, co-chairman of the recall committee, who has no fight, or axe to grind, told the Sun, he scored Kildgore for the board action he fostered.

Although he was not told, Day attended a meeting Reynolds and Kildgore had set up with County Supt. Cecil Hardesty, complained that they had not told any members.

County Counsel Bertram McLees was on hand, apparently on his own, and made no comment. There had been a question as to whether the Brown Act made it mandatory for school administrators to inform the public and press of executive or closed sessions. (it does).

Note- The Sun has always received notice of regular or special meetings, but has never known about closed sessions or attended one. The record shows that no hullabaloo was raised when the board voted to let contracts of Superintendents Frank Brown and David Everett lapse. Perhaps more will come to light in the future! -CI

miles, most of which is agricultural. A team from the county planning office will be on hand to explain, hear comments and so forth. When the revised plan has been approved by citizens at open meetings, the county will advertise public hearings and later supervisors will do the same before it is adopted by ordinance. If you plan to be at the meeting, you might take these maps with you for handy reference.
