HOT ZONE HEARING

Yesterday county planners were meeting to pass on the many requests for changes in Alpine zoning from the maps prepared by the staff and exhibited at the initial hearing last Friday week in Civic Center

Although most had little cause to worry, several waxed a bit warm in requesting lower classifications. Planning commissioners asked many questions, treated the visitors nicely, reiterated that the move is not one to force people to give up their rights.

At question time many went to the mike, told their situations: requesting C zoning were Nettie Mack, C.D. Shorter via his attorney; Kuhl Woodcraft, Emil Sachse, Harold Lutz, Verb Echols, R.C. Sumrall, Martha Schwenck, A.E. Wilson wanted E-1-A, while Zane Dana, for S. Ellison, asked for A-4; Clarke Irvine requested R-4 for expansion of his trailer park; Byrl Phelps explained why he desired E-1-A and R-1 for some 320 acres.

Alex Adams presented a new petition for A-4-A for properties south of Alpine Heights Road, to the Dehesa 4-A section signed by J.P. Sullivan, F.L. Green, M. Kendall, Pete Viviano and Margaret Lowthian for her horse and dog ranch with E.L. Freeland.

After passing on these, the commission will prepare adjusted maps, present them to supervisors for their public hearing.

EDITORIAL

The value of a chamber of commerce in promoting any town was stressed at last week's meeting with all directors, 18 members and a group of interested residents on hand.

A strong talk for support, by Auren Pierce,

was inspiring to oldtimers and many newcomers, among them being Jerry Busch and Rodney Johnson who took an enviable position: "We're less interested in what the chamber can do for us than we are in what we can do for you and what can the chamber do for Alpine".

Pierce said that "we can't be takers without being givers also", directed attention to the bright future of Alpine: "New businesses are opening here and others are on the way. The freeway is coming. The section from the termination in east El Cajon to Harritt Road is scheduled for this year; the next segment extending to 2.8 miles west of Alpine should become a reality next year; and the section 2.5 miles east of town should be under construction by 1966-67".

Others speaking informally were Doug Fordyce for a proposed veteran hospital; Mrs. Helen Ellsberg, photo-journalist who is doing stories on Alpine; Gene Cobb on "Our new nearness to SD, only 35 minutes;" and others, who reiterated a belief in the fine outlook now that water is here and Security Bank is soon to open.

Sewer Growth Seen

SAN DIEGO (CNS) - A master plan for sewer services in Alpine is being prepared by the head of Special District Services.

Warren Barney told directors of the Alpine Sanitation District Monday that he was preparing the plan for presentation in the near future.

Barney said that January's single new connection to the district reflected the slow growth the sanitation area had experienced recently, but predicted that since water is here now, growth would be stimulated.

The Sun spoke to Barney Wednesday and he said the district had only 76 users now and that his survey was not detailed as it is yet too early to tell just how growth will go.

Extension of service into the present treatment plant will probably be up Victoria Drive and South on Tavern Road, with lower Arnold Way and Alpine Terrace using it. The present plant is capable of handling 5000 population but Alpine proper has about 2000 today.

One of the biggest worries of business today is the number of unemployed people on the payroll.

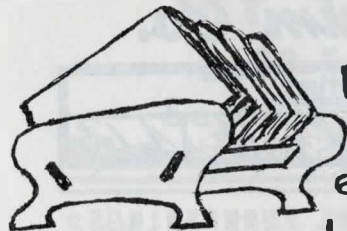

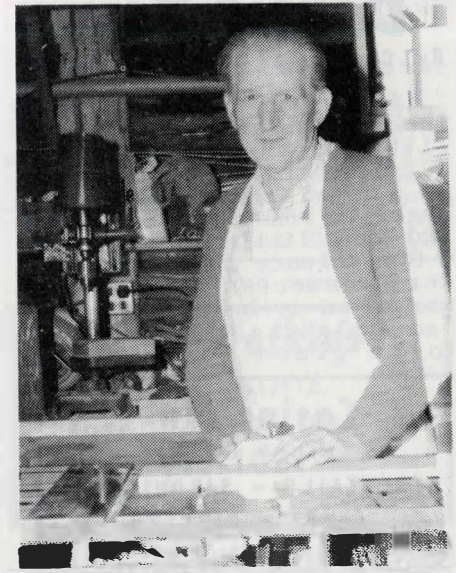

DINOSAUR STORY from | there is no reason to delay the opening, and we will follow a step by step pattern of development," said executive director Kenneth Braid.

Braid, now a La Jolla businessman, has spear-headed the development of several large corporations including LaMere Industries and the Kentron Corps.

He announced these appointments yesterday: Wm. "Bill" Dwyer as interim resident manager of the park; Gerry Gauss as curator of the prehistoric museum, and Wm. M. Masters as recreation coordinator.

Dwyer, who now lives here, carries 20 years' of park management and public relations experience to his post. Gauss is a recognized authority in the prehistoric field. Masters is a former recreational director with the SD Parks and Recreation Dept.

"At a Torrey Pines Inn meeting February 16 we decided to immediately enter into the first phase of the park's opening--involving a half to 3/4 of a million dollars expenditure," Braid said.

"Dwyer is now on the Park's 60-acre site and is charged with physical preparation of the exhibit area in this first phase; Gauss

is designing and stocking the museum, and Masters is planning resident and family type recreational activities for this spring and summer," Braid said.

Dwyer, who was instrumental in the development of Florida's largest marina -- the Guy Lombardo Marina -- said, "I can't help but feel enthusiastic. "I think we will be a national attraction in a short time".

"To say nothing of the Dinosaur idea, it is stunning to think of the number of Californians who will be drawn to Alpine for rodeo and horse show activities alone," he told the Sun on a visit to its office.

Gauss feels the same way about the museum activity; Just consider the interest your children display in their school studies of the prehistoric era, and you'll have some idea of how exciting an attraction we are developing for regional and national visitors," he said.

Masters feels just as strongly about the parks planned recreational program!

"As a nation, our work week is growing shorter each year. That means more leisure for recreation--just consider Disneyland and Knott's Berry Farm. They aren't successful by accident-- both have simply responded to a need for wholesome recreation-- at a cost the average family can afford".

"What does this mean to Alpine? Well, we can handle 1,000 a day for each acre of land, and we've got 60 acres," Masters concluded.

Clitsomes Featured

Mrs. Alex Clitsome, who with her husband makes her home in a large trailer, Alpine, using another as a guest house, was featured in the SD Union last Sunday on the front page of the Women's Section: "Collecting, a Rewarding Hobby" by Opal Crandall.

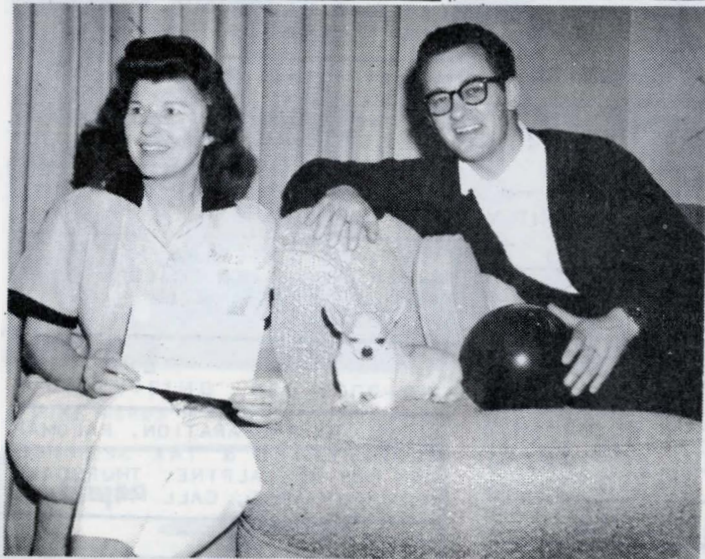
