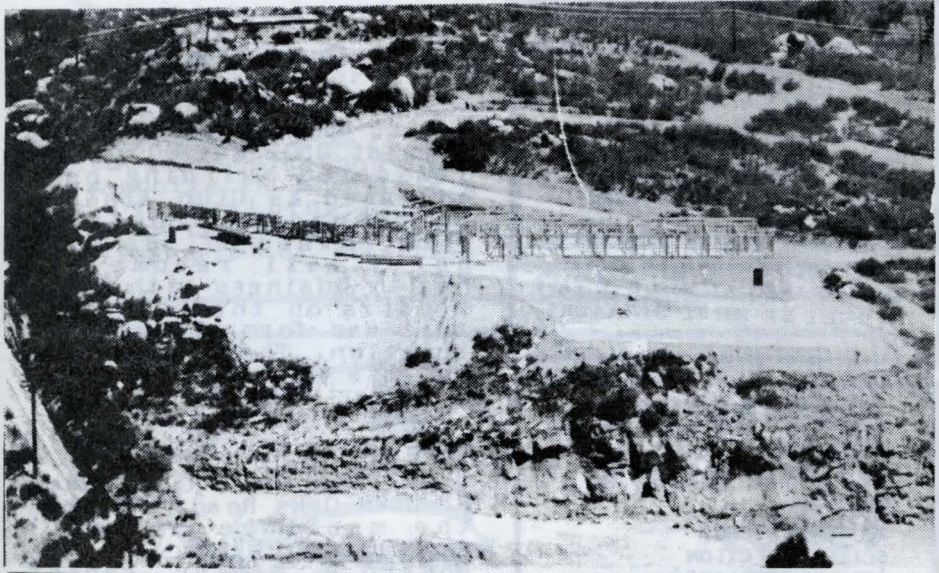

New Property Valuations Hits Veterans.

Progress and higher land values are all well and good. But there is an angle to it that some do not realize. The veteran who gave up his career, spent many months in WW1, WW2 and Korea, lost a lot, suffered a lot, so that America could remain free,

and go ahead. Higher assessments are forcing many veterans out of the bracket that allows them \$1,000 exemption for taxation. With high prices, unemployment and so on, it means a lot to us.

For example, in 1916 I started the first film weekly in Hollywood. On Aug. 3, 1917 I enlisted in the navy, gave up a very promising future, served 18 months, returned to a \$25 a week job, but worked into publicity and made good.

Just because a man's total valuation goes over \$5,000, seems to us to be no reason to deprive him of that exemption—the country can never repay any veteran for the time he spent in service. Just an idea.—CI

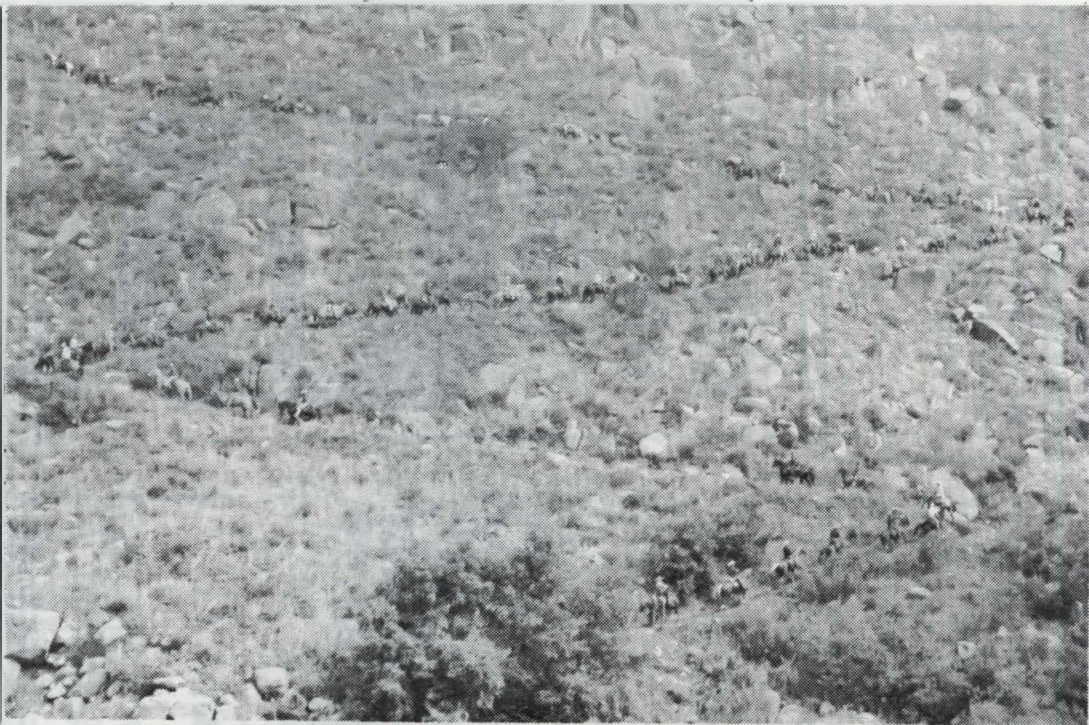
