accelerated speed very shortly.

Funds have been budgeted and contract will be awarded this fall for the \$3.5 million section from 3rd Street in EC, to Harritt Road in Johnstown, so construction should be well underway by year's end.

The next, and most urgently needed by Alpine, is the jump from Harritt out to Fairview. Engineering on this has been done, rights-of-way bought and approvals from county and federal officials have been secured. So if all goes well, this strip should make the 1964-5 budget, with work starting at next year's end.

The final stretch, of major importance in Alpine's commuting route to EC and SD is from Fairview to Willows Road. The route has been adopted and state and county are in agreement, so all that remains is signatures and approval of the US Bureau of Public Roads, Dekema's office told the Sun. This would probably make the 1965-6 budget, likewise if all goes well.

Alpine will have two on-off spots, Tavern and Willows Roads with a bridge over W. Victoria Drive so the hill area may come

directly downtown on that road. It had been rumored that Victoria would be closed by the freeway.

LEGAL NOTICE

ORDINANCE NO. 10

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1 OF THE ALPINE SANITATION DISTRICT BY RE-ASSIGNING CERTAIN DUTIES AND POWERS THEREIN SET FORTH, BY RENUMBERING THE SECTIONS THEREOF, AND BY REVISING SAID ORDINANCE SO AS TO COMBINE IT AND ALL AMENDMENTS THERETO IN A SINGLE, UNIFIED ORDINANCE.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Diego, as and constituting the Board of Directors of the Alpine Sanitation District, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Sections 1 through 29, all inclusive, of Ordinance No. 1, as amended, of the Alpine Sanitation District, are renumbered and amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Section 1. PROVISIONS NOT AFFECTED BY HEADINGS. Article and section headings contained herein shall not be deemed to govern, limit or modify, or in any manner affect the scope, meaning or intent of any section hereof.

Section 2. TENSES. The present tense includes the past and future tenses; and the future, the present.

Section 3. MASCULINE GENDER. The masculine gender includes the feminine and neuter.

Section 4. NUMBER. The singular number includes the plural, and the plural includes the singular.

Section 5. "SHALL" and "MAY". "Shall" is mandatory and "may" is permissive.

Section 6. AUTHORITY. The fees and charges established by this ordinance are adopted pursuant to sections 5470 and 5471 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California.

ARTICLE II

DEFINITIONS

Section 10. SIGNIFICATION OF WORDS. Whenever in this ordinance the following terms are used, they shall have the meaning respectively ascribed to them in this article.

Section 11. "DISTRICT" means the Alpine Sanitation District of the County of San Diego, State of California.

Section 12. "ENGINEER" means the Engineer appointed by the Board of Directors of the District, or his duly authorized agent.

Section 13. "FISCAL YEAR" means the period from July 1 to the following June 30, both inclusive.

Section 14. "HOUSE SEWER" includes only sewer lines and facilities located upon private property (whether said property be used for dwelling, commercial or any other purpose) and which lines and facilities are connected to a sewer service lateral or trunk line sewer.

Section 15. "PERSON" shall mean any person, firm, company, corporation, political subdivision, municipal corporation, district, the State of California, the United States of America or any department or agency of any thereof.

Section 16. "PREMISE" shall mean any lot, piece or parcel of land, building or establishment.

Section 17. "SEWER SERVICE LATERAL" includes all that portion of service laterals located upon public property, highways or rights of way.

Section 18. "TRUNK LINE SEWER" includes all sewer lines and facilities used to convey community sewage.

ARTICLE III

CONNECTION FEE

Section 20. In addition to any other fees for connections to the sewer lines within the District, including those fees established or to be collected pursuant to Ordinance No. 1304 (New Series) of the County of San Diego, which said ordinance is applicable to the territory within the District, there is hereby established a connection fee of \$250.00 for each connection of a house sewer to a sewer service lateral that is connected directly to those certain trunk line sewers and collection line

sewers located within the District and constructed with 1953 Alpine Sanitation District Bond Issue funds and shown as Line "A", Line "B", Line "D", Line "E", Line "F", Line "G", Line "H" and Line "J" on a plat entitled "Alpine Sanitation District, Plan and Title Sheet, Project No. 7752, W.O. No. 31-3, Sheet No. 1 of 14" on file in the records of the Board of Supervisors as document No. 170736.

Section 21. PAYMENT OF CONNECTION FEE. The connection fee established by Section 20 shall become owing, due and payable at the time application is made to connect a premise to the sewer system of the District; provided, however, that where the application for connection was made prior to November 29, 1962, and the payment of the fee was to be made in installments in accordance with the provisions of Section 18 as it read prior to November 29, 1962, then, and in that event, installment payments of the connection fee shall be as follows:

On July 1 following the due date of the first installment, the second installment of \$25.00 shall become owing, due and payable unless theretofore paid, and on each July 1 for a period of eight years thereafter there shall become owing, due and payable successive installments of \$25.00 each. Unless the installment is to be collected with the taxes of the District as authorized by Section 50 of this Ordinance, each installment referred to in this Section shall become delinquent on the first day of September following the date on which it becomes owing, due and payable.

Section 22. TIME FOR PAYMENT OF CONNECTION FEE. The entire connection fee prescribed in Section 20 shall be paid at the time application is made to connect a premise to the sewer system of the District; provided, however, that where a connection fee is being paid in installments pursuant to Section 21, there may be paid to the District any unpaid portion of the fee which has not been included in a report prepared pursuant to Section 5473 of the Health and Safety Code and adopted by the legislative body of the District pursuant to Section 5473.3 of said Code.

Section 23. UNPAID INSTALLMENTS OF CONNECTION FEE TO BE A LIEN. The Board of Directors of the District, acting pursuant to Sections 5474 through 5474.10, inclusive, of the Health and Safety Code, may provide that any unpaid portion of any connection fee as established by Section 20, which unpaid portion is to be paid in installments pursuant to the provisions of Section 21, shall constitute a lien against the respective premise to which was made the connection for which said connection fee was imposed.

ARTICLE IV

SEWER SERVICE CHARGE

Section 30. ESTABLISHMENT OF SEWER SERVICE CHARGE. There is hereby levied and assessed upon each premise within the District that discharges sewage into the sewer lines of the District, a service charge in the following amounts:

(a) For each family dwelling unit in a building containing not more than three such units —per dwelling unit....	\$18.00
(b) For each family dwelling unit in a building containing more than three such units (other than a hotel, motel or auto court) — per dwelling unit...	15.00
(c) Rest homes — per each patient's bed from 1 to 40 inclusive	4.00
—per each patient's bed over 40	2.75
(d) Hotels, motels, auto courts —per living unit without kitchen.....	6.00
—per living unit with kitchen.....	9.00
(e) Churches — per each unit of seating capacity (a unit being 150 persons or any fraction thereof)	24.00
(f) Cafe or restaurant —conducting on-sale liquor sales	72.00
—not conducting on-sale liquor sales.....	48.00

- (g) Automobile service stations
 - not more than 4 gasoline pumps..... 36.00
 - more than 4 gasoline pumps 54.00
 - for each washing rack or pit or floor drain an additional..... 36.00
- (h) Self-service laundries
 - per each automatic washer from 1 to 20 inclusive 12.00
 - per each automatic washer over 20 9.00
- (i) Trailer court
 - per trailer space..... 9.00
- (j) For each store, office business or small industrial establishment not listed above 18.00

Provided, however, in the case of laundries (other than self-service laundries), bottling works, industrial establishments, and other businesses and establishments that have unusual characteristics insofar as sewage is concerned, the rate shall be established in each case by the Engineer subject to approval by the Board of Directors of the District. The rates so established shall be fixed in consideration of the estimated volume and type of sewage from such business as compared to the volume and type of sewage discharge from those businesses for which a fee is specified above.

- (k) Schools— The rate shall be 65 cents per pupil per year based on the average daily attendance of pupils at the school during the preceding fiscal year computed in accordance with the Education Code of the State of California; provided, however, where the school has had no attendance during the preceding fiscal year, the Engineer shall estimate the average daily attendance for the fiscal year for which the fee is to be paid and compute the fee based on such estimate.

Section 31. PAYMENT OF SEWER SERVICE CHARGE. When application is made for permission to connect a premise to the sewer system of the District, there shall become owing, due and payable in advance the sewer service charges for the remainder of the fiscal year in which said application is made, such sewer service charges to be computed by prorating the annual charges from the first day of the second calendar month following the date of such application; provided, however, that where such application is made after the last day of February and prior to the first day of July of any year, there shall become owing, due and payable at the same time in advance the sewer service charges for the next succeeding fiscal year. Sewer service charges which become owing, due and payable at the time such application is made for permission to connect to the sewer system of the District shall be paid to the District prior to the issuance of any permit authorizing the connection of such premise to the District's sewer system. Thereafter, the sewer service charges for such premise shall become owing, due and payable annually in advance on the first day of July. Such sewer service charges shall be payable to the District and become delinquent on the first day of September following the day on which they become due unless such sewer service charges are to be collected with the taxes of the District as authorized by Section 50 of this ordinance.

Section 32. CHANGE IN USE RESULTING IN INCREASED RATE. Whenever the use of any premise is changed so that there is an increased sewer service charge rate applicable to such premise, there shall become owing, due and payable the prorated amount of the increased rate applicable to the premise for the remainder of the fiscal year in which the change is made. The charge imposed by this section shall become delinquent sixty (60) days following the date it becomes due.

ARTICLE V

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 40. USERS OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT. The Board of Directors of the District shall have the power to establish by agreement

or resolution the fees and charges and such other conditions as it deems appropriate that shall be imposed for providing sewer services to premises located outside of the District.

Section 41. MODIFICATION OF FEES AND CHARGES. The fees and charges established by this ordinance may be modified or amended from time to time as determined by the Board of Directors of the District.

Section 42. DEPOSIT AND EXPENDITURE OF FEES AND CHARGES. All fees and charges collected pursuant to this ordinance shall be deposited in the operating fund of the District; provided, however, that such fees and charges shall not be used for the acquisition or construction of new local street sewers or laterals as distinguished from main trunk, interceptor and outfall sewers.

Section 43. USE OF DISTRICT'S SEWAGE FACILITIES PROHIBITED UNLESS FEES AND CHARGES PAID. No person shall discharge or allow the discharge of or dump sewage or other waste matter into the District's sewer system except in compliance with the terms of this ordinance and payment of the fees and charges provided and established by or pursuant to this ordinance.

Section 44. ENGINEER TO ENFORCE ORDINANCE. The Engineer is charged with the duty of enforcing the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 45. ENFORCEMENT MEASURES IN CASE OF DELINQUENCY. When any fee or charge imposed by this ordinance becomes delinquent, the Engineer is authorized to take any or all of the following actions:

(1) Any steps authorized by law to collect such fees and charges.

(2) Disconnect the premise from the District's sewer system, provided, however, that prior to such disconnection at least five (5) days' notice of such delinquency shall be given to the occupant of the premise by United States mail or by posting such notice on the premise. When a premise has been disconnected, it shall not be reconnected until all delinquent fees and charges have been paid together with a

reasonable charge for such disconnection and reconnection as established by the Engineer.

ARTICLE VI

FEES AND CHARGES MAY BE COLLECTED WITH TAXES

Section 50. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this ordinance, the fees and charges including the connection fee and the sewer service charges, or either of them, may be collected on the tax roll in the same manner and together with the general taxes of the District pursuant to Sections 5473 to 5473.9, inclusive, of the Health & Safety Code of the State of California.

Section 51. SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this ordinance; it being hereby expressly declared that this ordinance, and each section, subsection, sentence, clause and phrase hereof, would have been prepared, proposed, adopted, approved and ratified irrespective of the fact that any one or more other sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after the date of its passage, and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published once, with the names of the members voting for and against the same, in the Alpine Sun, a newspaper of general circulation published in the County of San Diego and circulated in the District.
