What Makes Good Egg?

When you sit down to breakfast with two fresh eggs, no matter how the lady fixes, em-- sunny side up, over easy, scrambled (with brewer's yeast makes it tastier) or in an elaborate omelet, you



perhaps never realized that there is a lot more goes into the making and laying of those spheres of healthful food, than

of healthful food, than meets the eye.

Take water, for example, explains Ed Zimmer, pioneer eggman of Alpine's famous Adobe Hacienda, where his Leisurelaid Fresh Eggs are produced. It is a very small dribble that each hen gets, but when you have say, 30,000 layers, they use only 5,000 gallons of pure, fresh wellwater a day! In a year that totals 1,825,000 gallons! Quite a bucketful! But Ed, former engineer, auto expert and retired naval

officer, figured it all out in advance -- before one egg was laid.

one egg was laid.

'You see, we had to plan this whole enormous operation' he explains. 'So we tested, then dug several wells that produce fine mountain water, an important ingredient in egg production, it being over 90% water.

important ingredient in egg production, it being over 90% water.

The photo shows Ed with a bucket of water from one of his big reservoirs. This one is on a hill back of the laying sheds on Hwy 80, three miles east of town, holds 25,000 gallons, and it is kept full while the overflow runs down to a 10.000 flow runs down to a 10,000 gallon tank from where it fans out to all sheds, the office, home, apart-ments and so on. In addition he has other wells that have never gone dry and are producing plenty of water daily.

Then there is the little item of feed, which amounts to four tons a day or about \$125,000 a year, a tidy item added to the county's economy.
Physiologically, how many heartbeats does it take to make an egg? Science reveals that a hen's heart throbs 300 times a minute which projected, gives us 18,000 an hour, 432,000 per day or in a year, 157,680,000. Quite a string of heartbeats for a normal 250 eggs a year, or, 444,960 per egg! So-- all Adobe's hens would register some 4,730,400,000,000 throbs
