Lower tax rates for Alpine in Rio SD MWD are due, reports Manager Edwin Houser, but the assessed valuation goes up about 10%. In the whole Rio district, 54,000 acres, valuation went from \$35 to \$37 million, about 5%.

Back taxes in Alpine will be paid at 23¢ per \$100, against last year's 25¢. The tax rate this year will be \$2.35, while last year it was \$2.38. Alpine's land tax rate will show considerable increases due to recent reassessment some being as high as 300%.

## EDITORIAL



### Students Do Gain Health on Apple-A-Day!

Two weeks from Tuesday Alpine children will go back to school. Maybe it would be wise for parents to see that their youngsters get an apple a day to preserve health and energy.

This apple idea does seem to keep the doctor away, and perhaps the dentist. At least those eating two or three daily

made fewer calls at Michigan State U health center, for upper respiratory infections and tension-pressure complaints, than those who did not eat the luscious fruit.

This was proved after a 3-year study of 1300 apple-eaters, compared with all the rest of the students. The apple fans made one-third fewer calls for these infections than expected for the entire student body. And they made only a sixth as many calls for tension or pressure showing as headaches, nerves and lack of concentration.

At any rate, it would do everyone a lot of good to eat apples, and more adults could do the same, say the experts who do not know just how or why the lowly apple is so good-- maybe its Vitamin C, enzyme, malic acid, or just because it's a king among fruits. Maybe Eve had something when she passed the apples to Adam!-CI

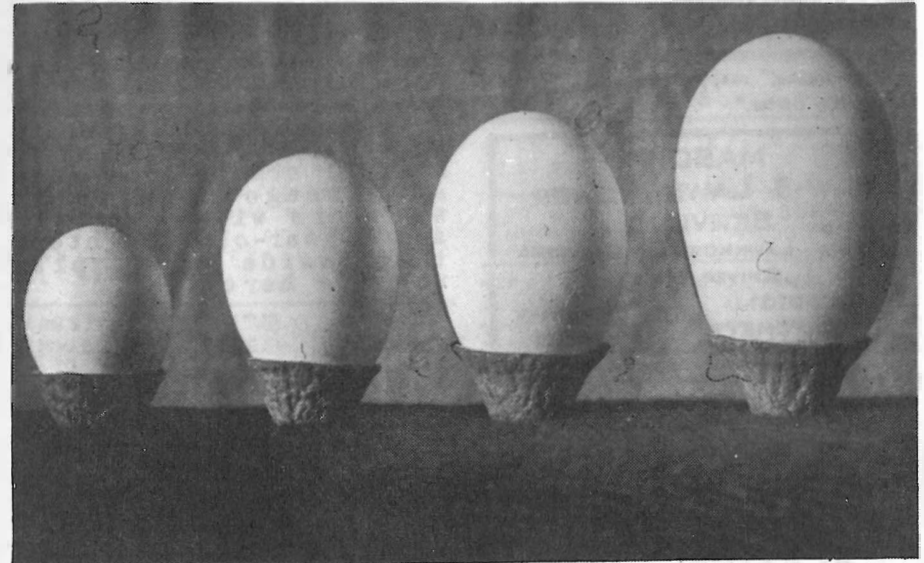
