It was made at Paramount Studios where he just finished "The Carpetbaggers". His deep love of flying, since he was a lad, makes him use airplanes in most of his pictures. In the 30's Bob who helped many youngsters into flying, says: "These people who learned to fly in that era-- the gas station attendants, auto mechanics, and other private enthusiasts-- became the nucleus of our air force. If it hadn't been for them, we might have lost the war". -CI

Although the county rate is 4-tenths of a cent below last year or \$2.139 per \$100, Alpiners will pay much more as the area last fall was reassessed, some properties going up as much as 300%.

The school rate will be \$2.276 with Grossmont \$1.337; for bond and interest, the school district is \$.277; Grossmont \$.104. Alpine Local Fire District, \$.576, and the sanitation district, \$.481.

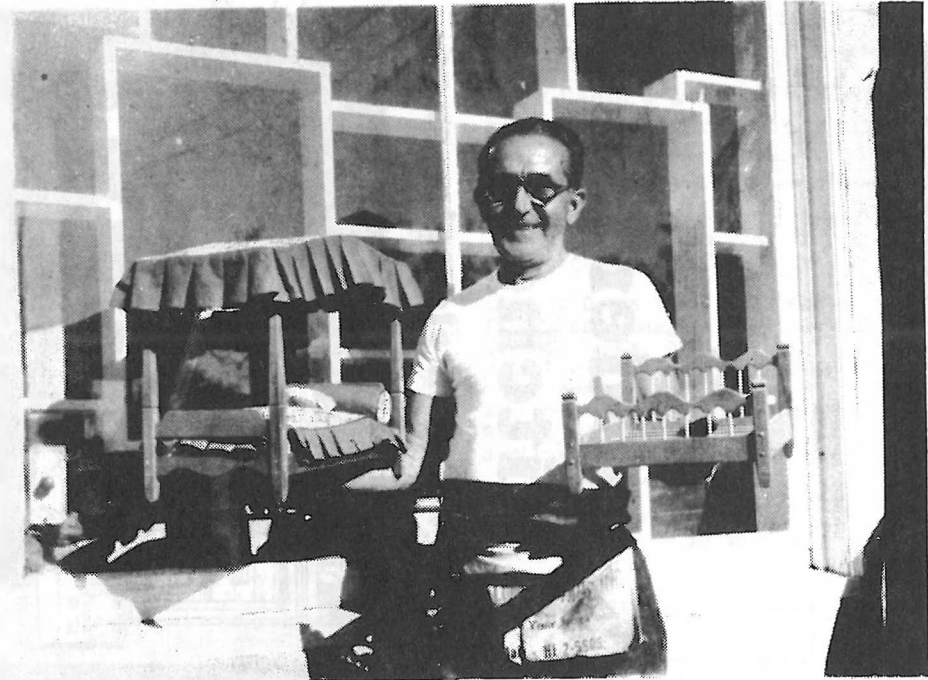
Cangelosi's hobbies are roller skating, in which he is a champion, and horses, while his wife has her fun in running their nice little family.

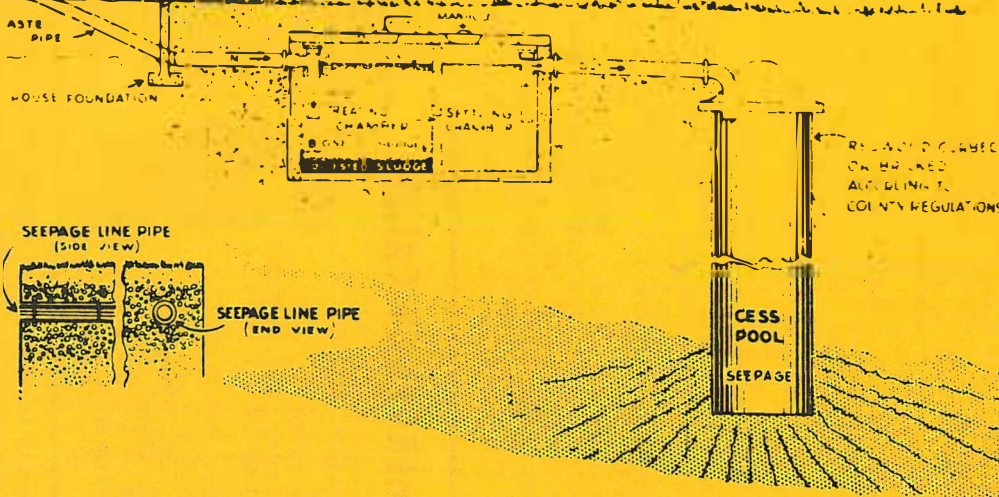


Illustration of Septic Tank System

HOW YOUR SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEM WORKS

When properly installed and maintained, it is considered a reasonably efficient system serving your home satisfactorily until sewer is available.

The system consists of a septic tank, drain field, or seepage pit which reduces, almost entirely the sewage and waste from the home, through bacterial action, to an effluent or liquid that is readily absorbed by the soil under and adjacent to the drain field or seepage pit.

WHY CLEANING IS NECESSARY

A small percentage of waste entering the tank is not reduced to liquid. Some of it floats on the surface, forming a semi-solid "mat." Some settles to the bottom to form a black sludge. Over a period of time, depending on usage, the "mat" increases in thickness and the sludge increases in depth until the area between the mat and the sludge is too restricted for the septic tank to function properly. Vacuum cleaning is then required.

(Note: Vacuum cleaning is the best method obtainable, do not use a chemical treatment to clean a septic tank, it will damage the drainage system.)

If not cleaned at this time, solid matter is carried into the drain field or effluent disposal area and restricts or stops drainage. When this happens, new drainage area is usually required.
