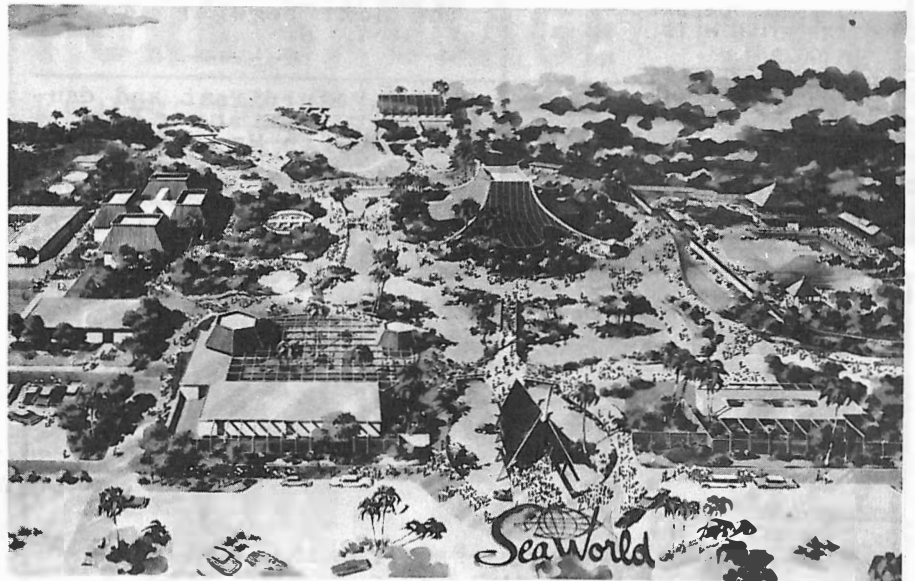

EDITORIAL

Freeways are Safeways Engineer Proclaims

We often hear motorists complain how they do not like freeways and how difficult and dangerous it is to drive them. But you will be surprised to know that there are three times more solo-- single vehicle accidents-- per million vehicle miles on ordinary rural state highways than on freeways. Another point, more than half of all fatalities on freeways are solos, which experienced motorists seldom have anywhere, unless they drive in a juvenile, show-off or foolhardy manner.

This interesting matter was brought out in the current and beautifully illustrated California Highways & Public Works,

in a story by J.C. Womack, state highway engineer, titled 'Freeways are Safer Highways'. The magazine is a beautiful publication with many fine air shots.

Womack points out that cars collide headon when one crosses the centerline, but freeways are divided by a median strip. These reduce headons. The rate on undivided highways is 10 times greater, and better on later freeways that have wider medians plus barriers.

There are no right angle collisions because no roads enter or leave freeways, hence no cross-traffic and no left turns. In urban areas, intersections account for about 2/3ds of all accidents, even in rural areas it is 37%.

There are no stop and go lights which means no rear-end collisions due to sudden stops. There are no driveways, entrances or parking stalls. Pedestrian accidents are nil, as none are allowed on freeways, and hitch-hiking is illegal. Also no children can get on or play on a freeway.

"More than 65 persons are saved from injury every day by California freeways" states Womack, who also claims that one category of accidents-- rear end collisions-- that are just as likely to occur on freeways as on other roads, but statistics show that it is no more likely; the rate is just about the same.

The chamber of commerce at its last meeting authorized Al Hinkle to get the big sign repainted in its original form, it having been changed to advertise the chamber's horseshow last month.

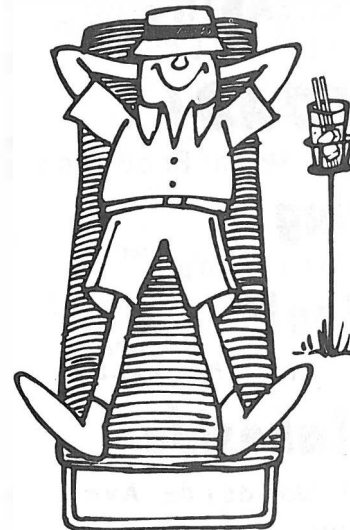

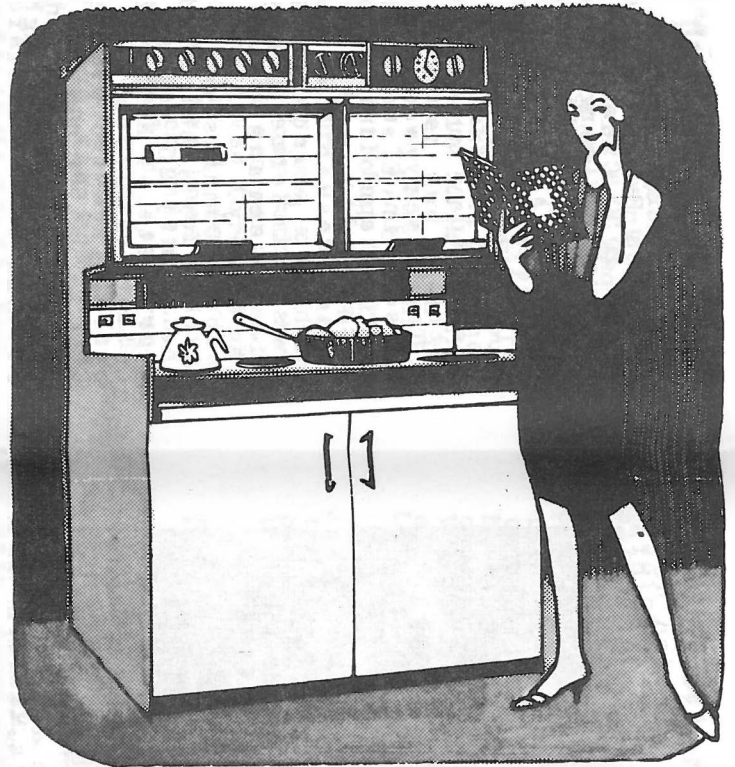

divided freeway. It will be fairly close to the present route, but will eliminate some slight grades and bends, without any extensive damage to properties.

The plan calls for two undercrossings: Broadway, and Los Coches Road (Glenview), with an interchange at Greenfield Dr., (Crest turnoff). Bids are to be opened in LA on Nov. 7, with \$3,531,450 available in state highway funds.

Work should start by Dec. 1, and could be done by end of next year, if satisfactory bids are received.

Note- This is a wonderful improvement for Alpine, but the best will be the middle stretch between Harrit Road, and Chocolate Summit at Gavin Road, starting down the big grade. How galling it is to see hundreds of millions sent abroad, yet only five or six could give us the much needed road! Who's afraid of communism from without?-CI
