

in a story by J.C. Womack, state highway engineer, titled freeways are Safer Highways. The magazine is a beautiful publication with many fine air shots.

Womack points out that

cars collide headon when one crosses the centerline. but freeways are divided by a median strip. These reduce headons. The rate on undivided highways is 10 times greater, and better on later freeways that have wider medians plus barriers.

There are no right angle collisions because no roads enter or leave freeways, hence no cross-traffic and no left turns. In urban areas, intersections account for about 2/3ds of all accidents, even in rural areas it is 37%:

There are no stop and go lights which means no rear-end collisions due to sudden stops. There are no driveways, entrances or parking stalls. Pedestrian accidents are nil, as none are allowed on freeways, and hitch-hiking is illegal. Also no children can get

on or play on a freeway.
"More than 65 persons are saved from injury every day by California freeways states Womack, who also claims that one category of accidents -- rear end collisions -- that are just as likely to occur on freeways as on other roads but statistics show that it is no more likely; the rate is just about the same.




#### NEW LUTHERAN MINISTER


