Shots for Flu Fail to Prevent Epidemics

Vaccines for the flu, given so widely the past few years, and which were publicized so faithfully by the press, have been found without valuable results, it was told at a meeting in Kansas City of the American Public Health Association.

Dr. Alexander Langmuir of the communicable disease center, Atlanta, said a better vaccine is needed before general use could be justified in cost to the public.

He and other top experts said the virus causing the flu is unpredictable and easily altered, staying slightly ahead of the vaccine makers. The slightest change in the bug means the shots will fail to work well.

We have no doubt but that if the people learned to

live right, eat natural foods, more salads, fruits and vegetables-- become food faddists-- (but live well), a lot of this flu 'going around' would not stop in their bodies.

It is a well known fact that lung cancer has gone up in smokers in the past few decades, likewise women are getting it more since they started smoking.

Recently a 5-year study of 5-cup a day coffee drinkers revealed that they run the risk of heart attacks. It is known that caffeine in coffee is a dangerous heart stimulant.

Of course the coffee and tobacco 'institutes' say it has not been proven yet. You know they don't want that to be proved-- they'd lose money, but we might lose our lives!-CI

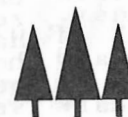

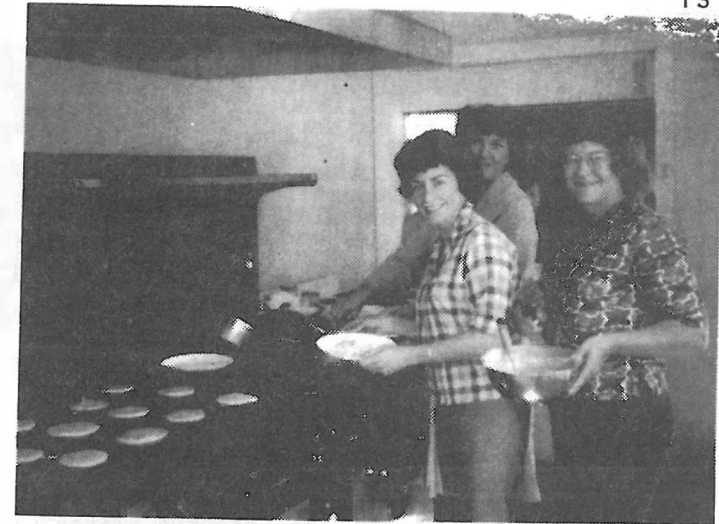
Joyce Dinius gave me some news for last issue and I forgot to put it in so will this time. Her cat Herman got killed in front of their house.

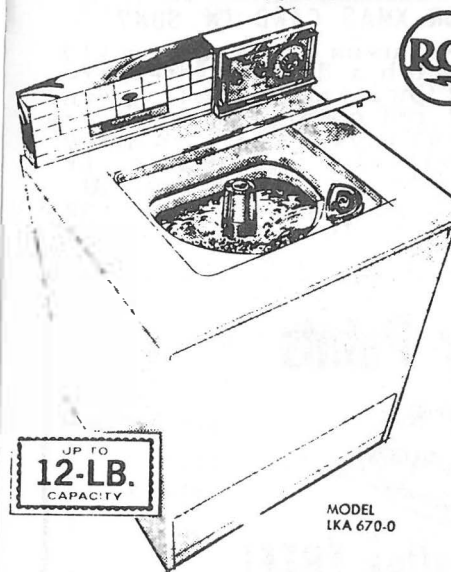

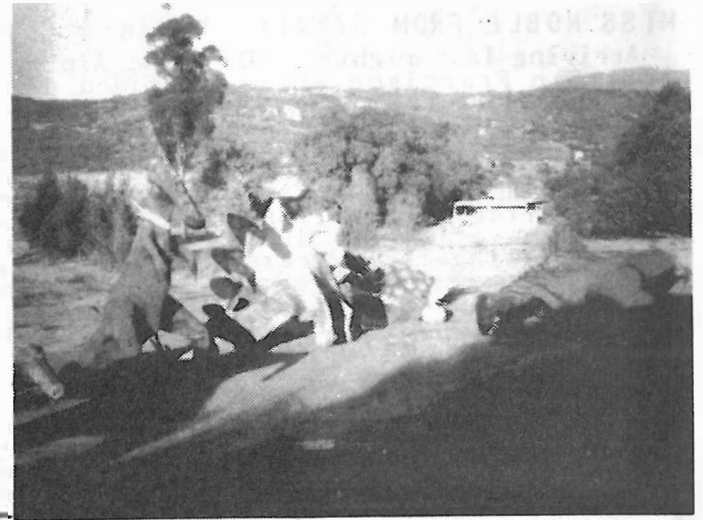
