# EDITORIAL



## Kennedy Tragedy Inspires Entire Nation!

Since our national tragedy, and dishonor, so much has been written on it that to say more is difficult.

However I should like to add my impressions. Right up to now everyone I have met has talked of it, and many an eye glistened, as did mine. I have not felt such a surge of sorrow since the day President McKinley died from an assassin's bullet.

Somehow there seems to be a lot of symbolism and deeper meaning to the tragic events that saddened, shocked and maddened the nation. As JFK said in a talk just before the fatal day "Life is dangerous and uncertain". How right!

Many feel that something larger than a human being died with the intrepid WW2 navy skipper of that ill-fated PT-109. He had performed his work on earth, went on to perhaps higher worlds? Many of his words will live forever in our nation's mottoes. Who can forget his "Ask not what your country can do for you-- Ask what you can do for your country".

The Supreme Court cast God out of the schools,

but an assassin put him back all over the nation, for people have been praying more ever since.

I am thankful we have Lyndon B. Johnson, who lost the nomination for president, but is there now, and his first words to the senate struck deeply into every heart: "All I have I would have gladly given not to be standing here today".

If one reviews the entire drama, it becomes a terrific real life play that shook the world, and it will take all of us a long time to forget it.

Personally I felt more proud to be an American when I witnessed the bravery of the widow, the solemnity of the talks, the handling of all events, and the swift action of government and law enforcement agencies.

Someone will write a dynamic book of those four days of surprise, grief, anger and heart-throbs, that will live forever in the annals of mankind, a part of history which we and our children actually took part in through the press, radio and TV and which we all felt so deeply and unashamedly wept over.

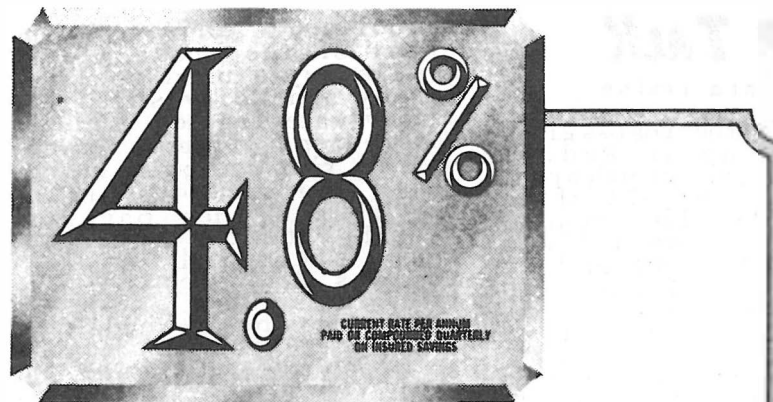

Dr. Louis A. LaVine, accompanied by his assistant, Elsie Leonard, paid a visit



to the Sun on Saturday, driving down from Smog Angeles. This is Dr. LaVine's third visit to the Irvine Ranch since they settled here 15 years ago, he being an old friend of Irvine when he published Let's Live Magazine in Hollywood, (1933-1949)

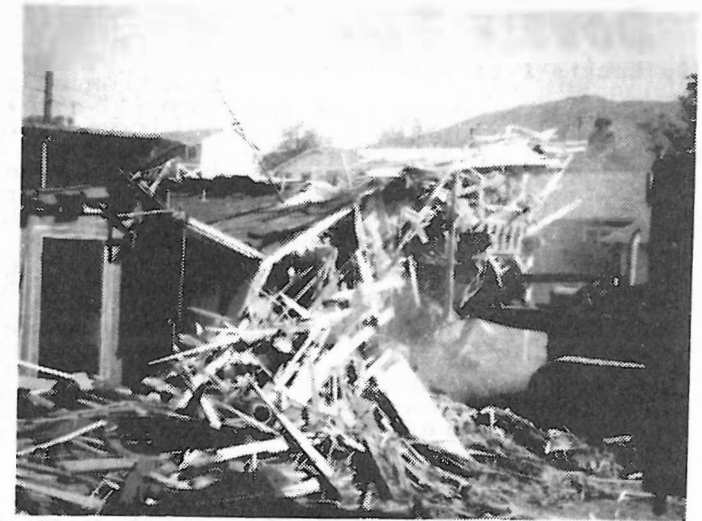

**NEW SCHOOL LAW TOLD**

The school board, along with others in the county, have been alerted to the new code regarding publication of agenda and minutes of all meetings, now in effect. It is AR 2433 (Ed. Sec. 966).

The new law provides: 'Minutes...recording all actions taken by the board. shall constitute public records, and shall be available to the public.'

'A list that will constitute the agenda for all regular meetings shall be posted at a place where parents and teachers may view the same at least 48 hours prior to the time of said regular meeting, and in the case of special meetings, at least 24 hours prior'.

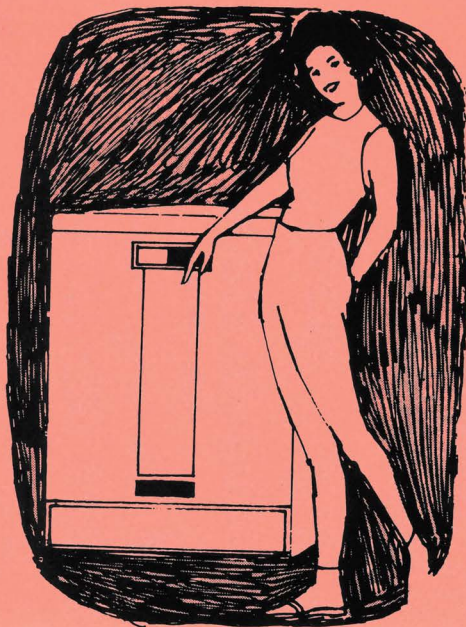

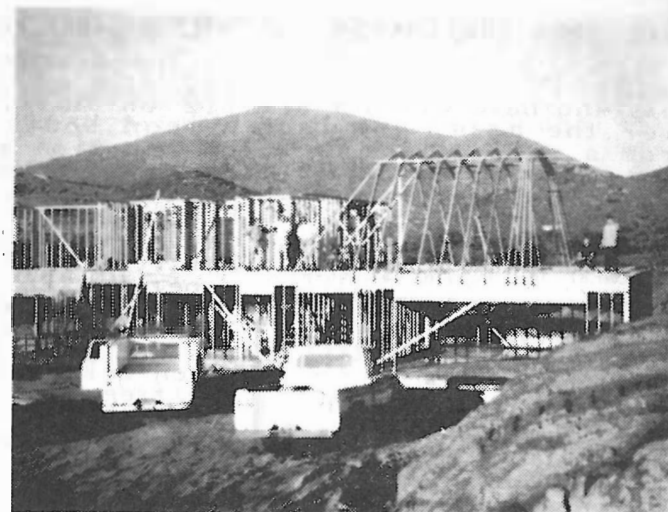
