



The new law provides:

Minutes...recording all actions taken by the board. shall constitute public records, and shall be available to the public.

'A list that will constitute the agenda for all regular meetings shall be posted at a place where

regular meetings shall be posted at a place where parents and teachers may view the same at least 48 hours prior to the time of said regular meeting, and in the case of special meetings, at least 24 hours prior'.

sisters, Grace Henry and Franc Polan, of Alpine, and Edith Head, of Pencil Bluff, Ark.






