Due to this burning is permissible before 7 am and after 4 pm without permit. Special permit burning is now ok whenever conditions of wind and humidity make burning safe but only if a permit has been issued and then the permittee must notify the custodian by phoning 445-2343 prior to burning. Otherwise the 1863 burning regulations still apply.

# Chevrolet Expands

The world's largest car manufacturer, Chevrolet celebrated its opening of a zone office in SD last week with a luncheon at Hotel del Coronado, attended by Clarke Hatch, owner of Hatch Chevrolet in EC, and other agencies, plus members of the news media-- press, radio and TV

Creation of the San Diego zone was announced in September by Semon E. Knudsen, general manager of Chevrolet and a vice president of General Motors, who said the action was "in

"We felt it justice to this vast army of owners and to our excellent retail organization here that we should take steps to expand," he said.

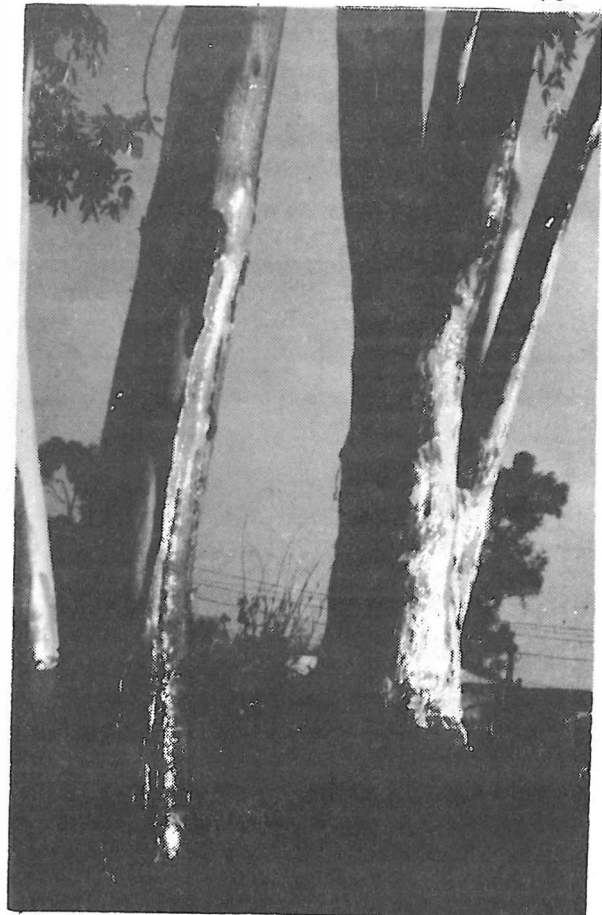
The San Diego zone office—the third in California (the other two are at Oakland and Los Angeles)—went into operation Dec. 1.

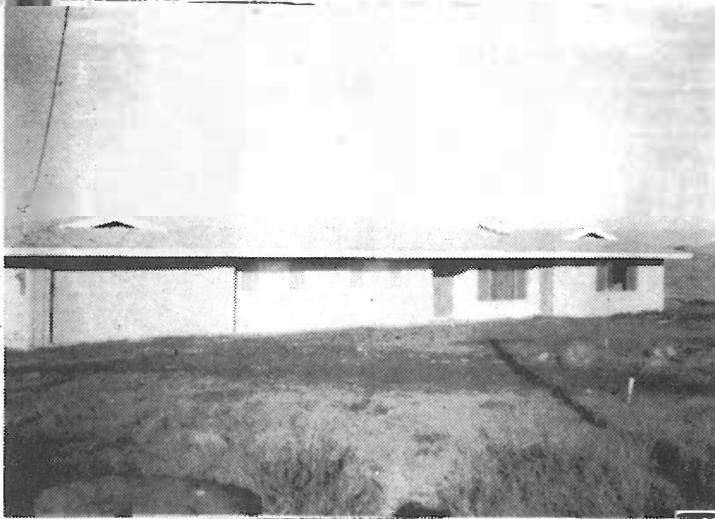

I have not enjoyed such a delightful time since I was last in Japan as I did Thursday at the unique dedication of the \$1.1 million Japanese Village at Sea World, Mission Bay.

And it was done in the ancient fashion used to offer prayers for the success of any such undertaking in Nippon, a traditional Shinto prayer service with all the trimmings.

One of the young priests, the Rev. T. Tsuyuki, head minister of Konkō Church in LA, was there with his assistants to perform the profound ceremony, at which were gathered perhaps 100 visitors and officials.

In the Norito or main prayer, offered by the priest, is embodied words of purification, thanksgiving and prayer for world peace and prosperity for this occasion.

As shown on the cover photo, your editor was photographed with Mayor Curran of SD, who joined in the colorful service, along with many for the Tamagushi, or thanks and prayer for success.

The Japanese Village is being erected for Murata Pearl Co., of Kobe and will become a year-round sort

of world's fair exhibit of old Japan and its unique pearl industry. One feature will be a 42 by 72 ft. tank where six Japanese beauties will dive for cultured pearl oysters.

Another feature will be a 2-story tea house and gift shop, an ornamental bell tower and a demonstration room for showing how pearls are cultivated and harvested. Decor throughout will of course be Nipponese, with many imported plants, trees and flowers.

An interesting angle is that the entire village was built in Japan, is now being reassembled here by Japanese workmen. It is one of the prime features of the new Sea World which is due to open early in March and will soon become a must on all tourists' lists.

Following the ceremony a luncheon was enjoyed in the Bahia Motor Hotel nearby, at which George Millay, Sea World president, presided. The mayor and Councilmen Harry Scheidle and Mrs. Helen Cobb, Deputy Mayor Ivor de Kirby, City Manager Tom Fletcher and others were present. Representing the Japanese contingent was Matao Uriu, consul who came from LA for the occasion, Kirk Nonaka, vice president, Murata Pearl Co., and other prominent members of the Nipponese colony, as well as members of the press, radio and TV.

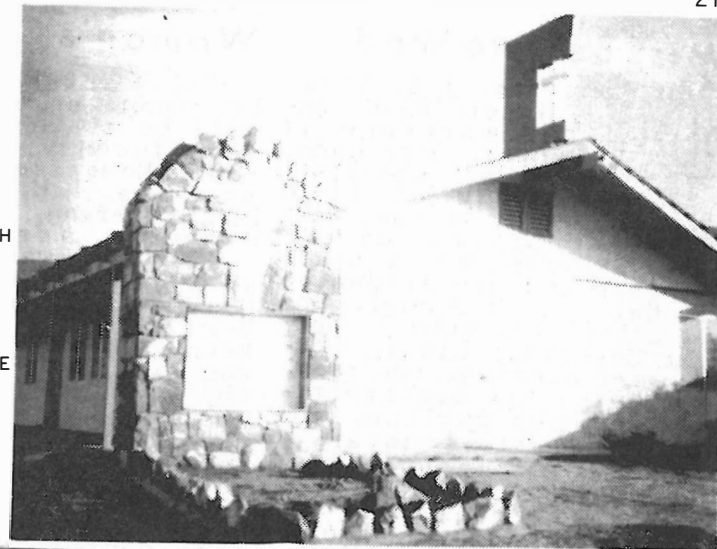

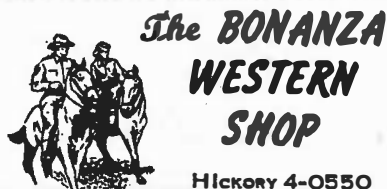
importance of freedom, chiefly free speech and freedom of the press, which are the rights of the people, who should know and appreciate them.

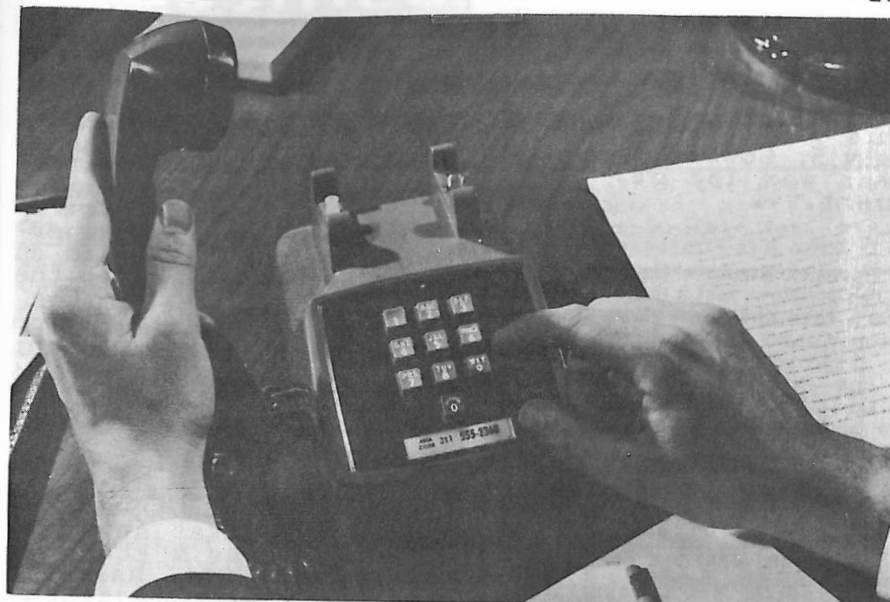
