This budget would be \$4,690 above last year's due to an estimated \$20,000 holdover, makes the lower tax rate, Present county rate is 62¢, and the best estimate they can get is 'from 55 to 57 cents' says Hinkle. The new figure has allowances for bonded indebtedness and interest payments. The true budget for 63-64 was \$33,405, including \$1500. for interest and bond redemption.
