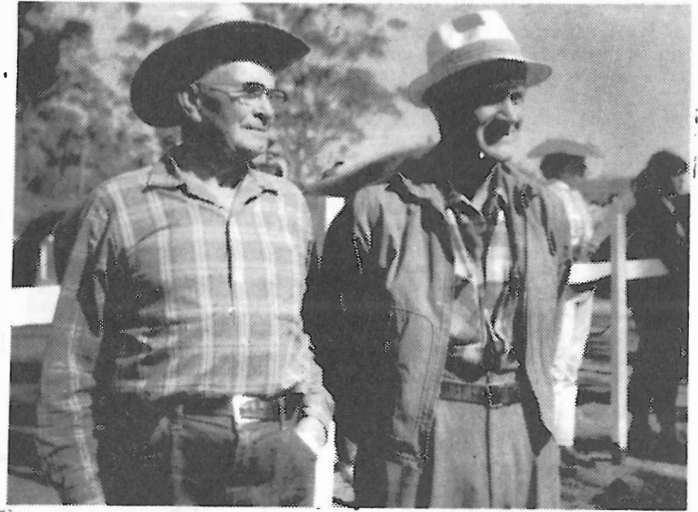
Library has It!

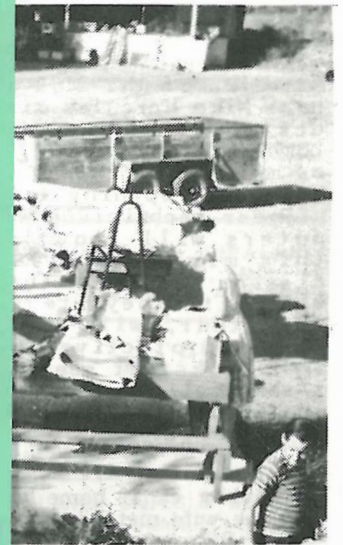
