ailment had worsened.

Lewinson was born in Mount Sterling, Ill., then the family moved to St. Joseph, Mo., where he finished school. He came to California in 1911 engaging in business with Clyde Gleason operating the American Typrwriter Co. In 1932, with his brother Ed, he ran Lewinson Motors, on University near Sixth, closing it in 1945.

Due to ill health he had come to Alpine in 1937, living in the house now occupied by Ed Weber, 1271 South Grade Road, opposite the place where Clarke Irvine lived when he arrived in 1937.

Soon he bought the Alpine Villa, improved it, later selling, then buying the present Highlands, with Gordon Wilson, which was sold at auction in 1955 to Frank O'Neil who subdivided it. It was the pioneer Daugherty Ranch. The Lewinsons lived there several years, then moved to Smith's Cottages.

Survivors, besides the widow Lois, are a brother Ed, of SD and two nephews and two nieces of IA and SD.

When Clarke Irvine formed the second chamber of commerce here, he asked Lewinson to be president, which he did. This was the body that secured street names and signs, the sewer system, published a modern leaflet on Alpine, and held initial meetings to get Colorado water.

Later Lewinson did a lot of hard work as chairman of the water committee that secured service here. If there was

Contract More Fwy

Full 8-lane freeway from Taylor St. in SD to the Chase off-ramp in EC should be finished this winter under contract that has just been let to the Golden Co., for \$790,861, reports Jacob Dekema, state highway engineer in SD. The piece to be completed is a 5.1 miles of inside lanes from near Fairmount to a half mile east of Spring St.

Contract calls for planting of oleanders in the median strip. Each improvement of in 80 Freeway eastward likewise improves Alpine's position. Without breaking the law, one may now drive to EC in 15 minutes, to SD in 32 minutes, if not hampered by trucks, trailers or slow drivers.
