**May Buy Fire Truck**

An official of the Bureau of Fire Underwriters in LA was here at a special Tuesday night session of Alpine Fire District commission, following a telephone talk with Commissioner O. E. Palmer on Friday.

The local board sent all information and data to the bureau, so the representative could have it for discussion here on his arrival.

'We will definitely have to buy a pumper to upgrade the area's fire fighting equipment' said Palmer, 'if we are to get the lower fire rates'.

The board met Tuesday of last week with an equipment salesman to discuss the proposed purchase of a new truck. It would have a storage tank of 500 gallons, with pump capacity of 750 gpm which would meet underwriters' requirements.

Cost would be \$16,000 to \$17,000, payment to be made on a lease-purchase deal over a long period. Members were given duties on investigating equipment, purchase plans and what Rio SD MWD could do on engineering for hydrants. President Hinkle, with members Wm. Jones, Fred Rushing, O. E. Palmer and E.L. Freeland were on hand.

## Not at War but Making Widows!

The American people are waking up to the truth that the US may not be 'at war', but it is making widows and killing off a lot of young military men every week in South Viet Nam.

Recent revelations from the widow of a flier killed on Jan. 7, show how this country is very much at war, yet prattles of being at peace. She is Lucille Adams, widow of Maj. Hughie Adams, who

called his old B26 plane 'The Widow Maker'. She said a young officer told her Adams' ship fell apart in the air, killing him and another flier.

Adams was a veteran of WW2 and Korea-- another 'no war' operation, which killed thousands-- was due to retire in another year. He wrote her before he died that 'everything is all fouled up and the people who said Diem was doing his best against the Communists are full of baloney. He spent all the money we gave him for special troops to protect him'.

The grassroots people have no say as to how their money is spent in Washington, yet we have to hold an election to build a new restroom at a local schoolhouse.-CI

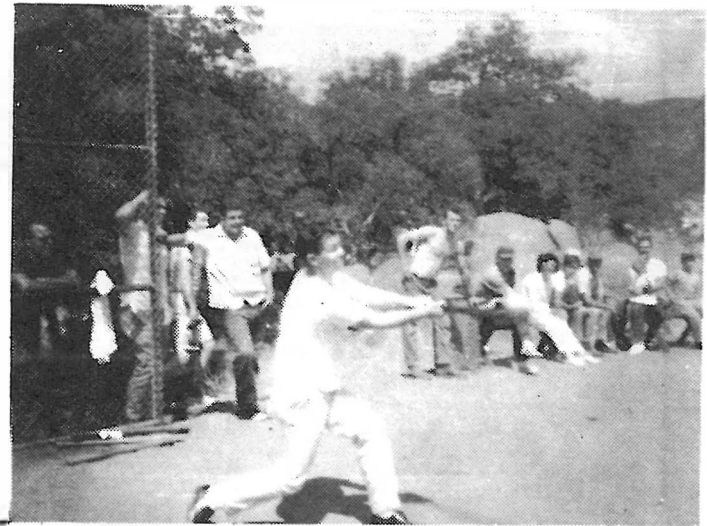

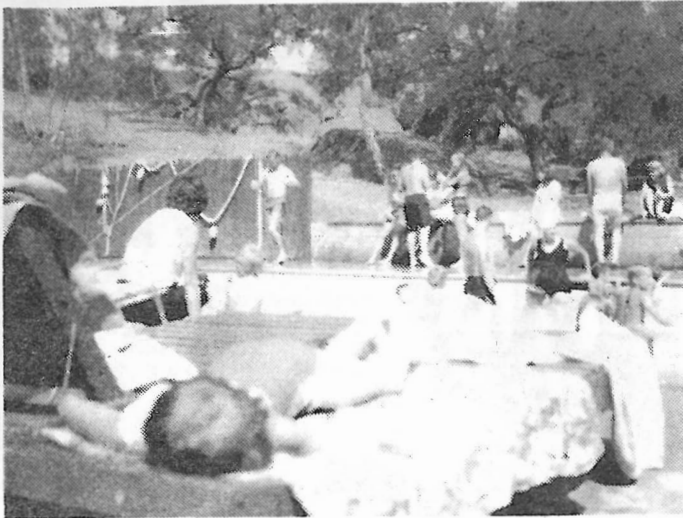

Four unified districts were okayed; La Mesa-Spring Valley-Lemon Grove, Lakeside-Alpine, Santee, Cajon Valley-Dehesa-Jamul-Las Flores-Barrett-Dulzura. The plan now goes to the state committee for approval or turndown.

The adopting vote was 13 to 9, while that for complete unification of the Grossmont District was 6 yes, 16 no.

If the state committee disapproves, it must give reasons, then the districts will reconsider, submit new recommendations. If approved, then an election will be held probably in December. If a majority vote yes in each district, unification will start July 1, 1965. If any district disapproves, it will remain as it is, but those approving will go on to unify.
