



A Lincolnana Find

What may be a valuable early reproduction of Lincoln's famed Gettysburg Address, was discovered in an old



family Bible of 1916, by Ray Lewis, 150 S. Anza in EC, The photo shows him with the Bible and the interesting document.

He showed it to Dave Villa, 2221 Tavern Road, when he went in to his place, 1425 N. Magnolia to leave a camper to be sold. Villa examined it, said "Why not take this up to the Alpine Sun, it might make a good yarn?"

So Lewis, a jolly retired service station owner who has lived in ec for 35 years, drove up with the yellowed document, a fac-simile of Lincoln's, handwriting. The Sun consulted SD State's history professor, Dr. Wm. Hanchett, who verified the existence of such rare copies of the document, now in the Archives, Washington, D.C.
