EDITORIAL

Is Atomic Bomb Fizzle as Weapon?

When Science developed the terrible atomic bomb which was used to demolish Nagasaki and Hiroshima and kill many thousands of innocents, the world thought we had a great weapon.

But we went through Korea without using this "fine" new weapon. Instead we killed and were killed by the thousands with old style weaponry.

Now we are doing it again--slaugh-

tering and being slaughtered in South Viet Nam-- and we still hold back the atomic bomb. Why? Because it is a horrible and unusable weapon. It would demolish the whole earth and its men and animals.

Wednesday the President proved this because he is calling in the Mobile Air Division, increasing our troops there from 75,000 to 125,000-- 66-2/3% more. The draft goes up 100% from 17,000 to 35,000 monthly. He will not call the reserve forces-- yet. And he hopes that voluntary enlistments will increase.

As for peace, he said it might be month, even years away, till the world gets rid of men that hate and destroy. This means a long period of expense for the people, and profits for some.

Perhaps it might be far better to let all our troops fight it out with gloves! Weapons up to the bomb have only killed, maimed and been costly. What a fizzle is the bomb!. CI

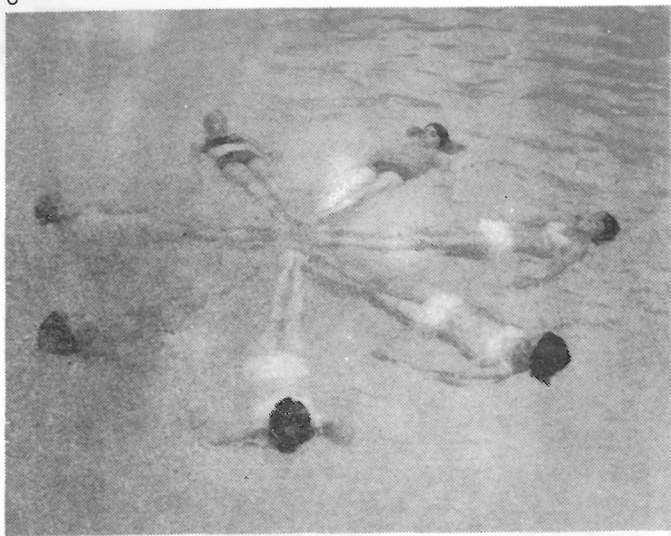

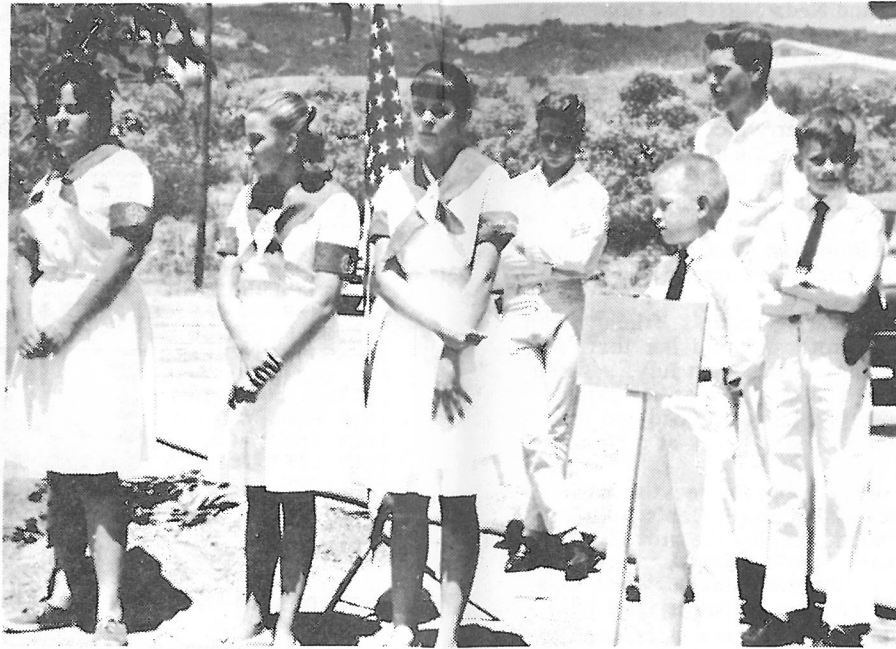


Don Fordney, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Fordney is on an attack submarine as quartermaster and navigator somewhere overseas.
