TAXES ESCALATING

SAN DIEGO (CNA) The largest tax increase since 1950, when it rose 36¢ was revealed Monday by T. M. Heggenland, chief administrative officer, who says for 1965-66 it will stand between \$2.27 and \$2.29 per \$100. Rate will be up 14¢ to 16¢ over the previous year's \$2.131. Welfare costs will be up from \$47 to \$54 million. Another raise comes from increasing crime.

“And now may the blessing of God Almighty rest upon this whole land; may He give us light to guide us, courage to support us, charity to unite us, now and forever more. Amen.”

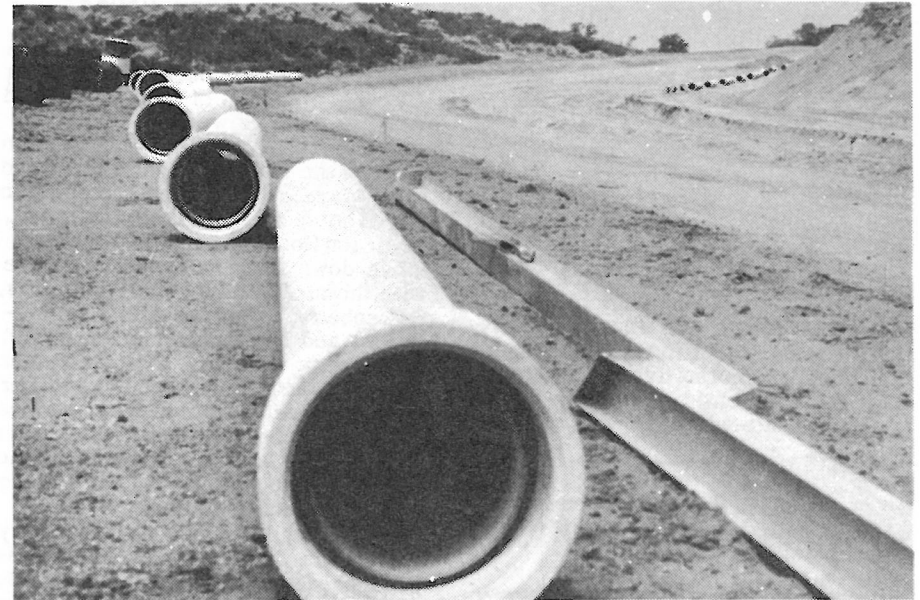

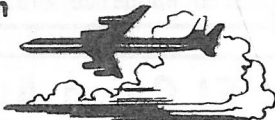

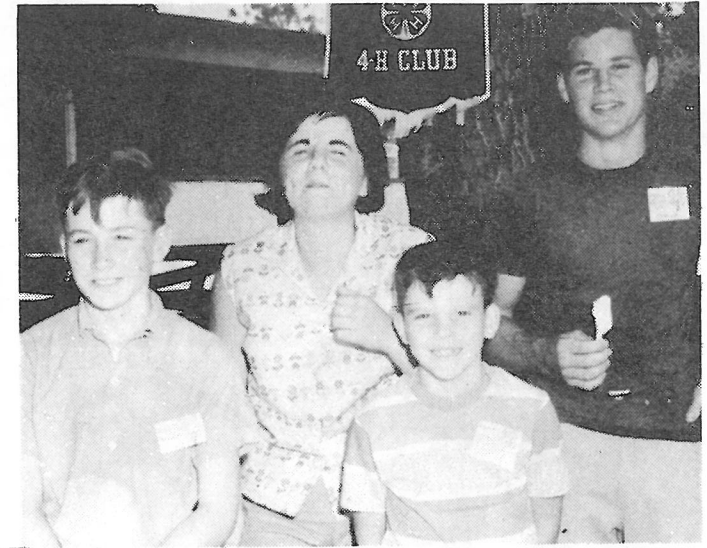
BOUND FOR IRELAND

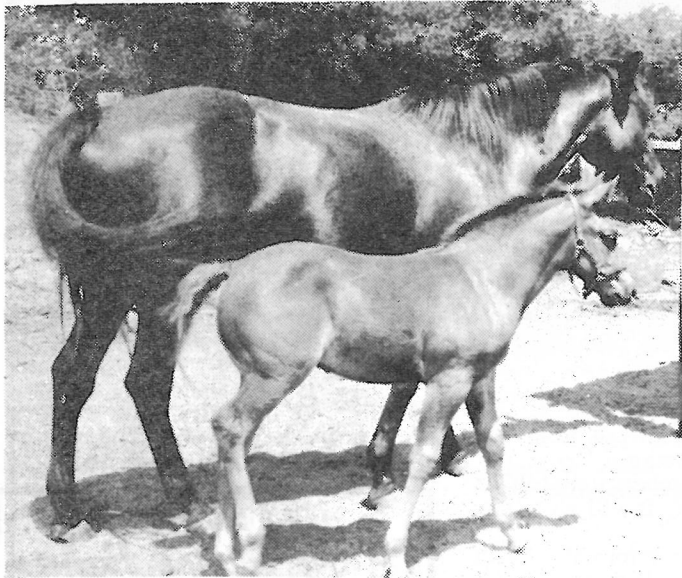

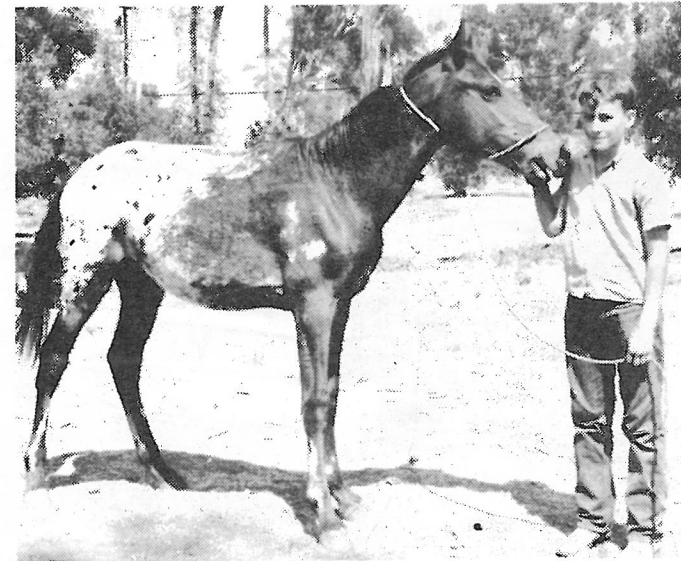

KELLERS WIN COLOR TV

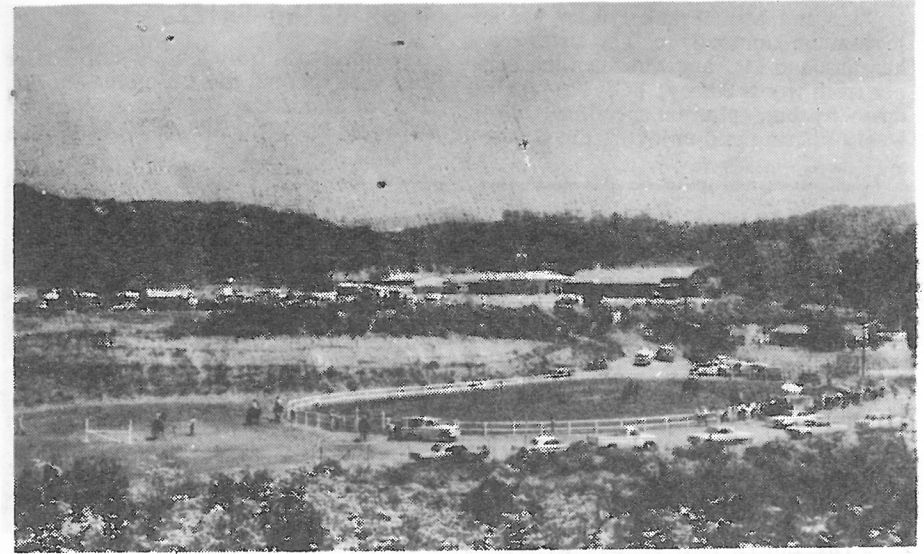

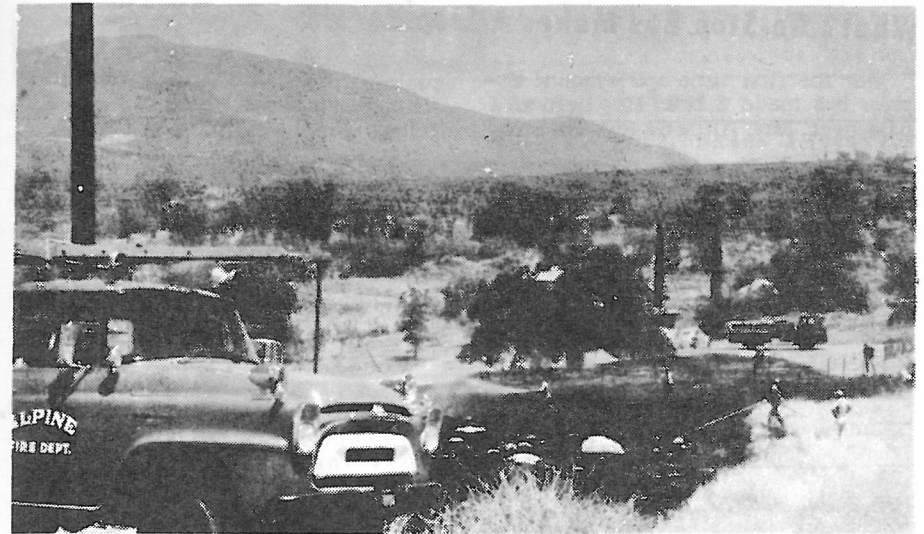

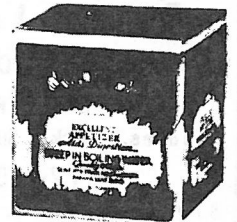
