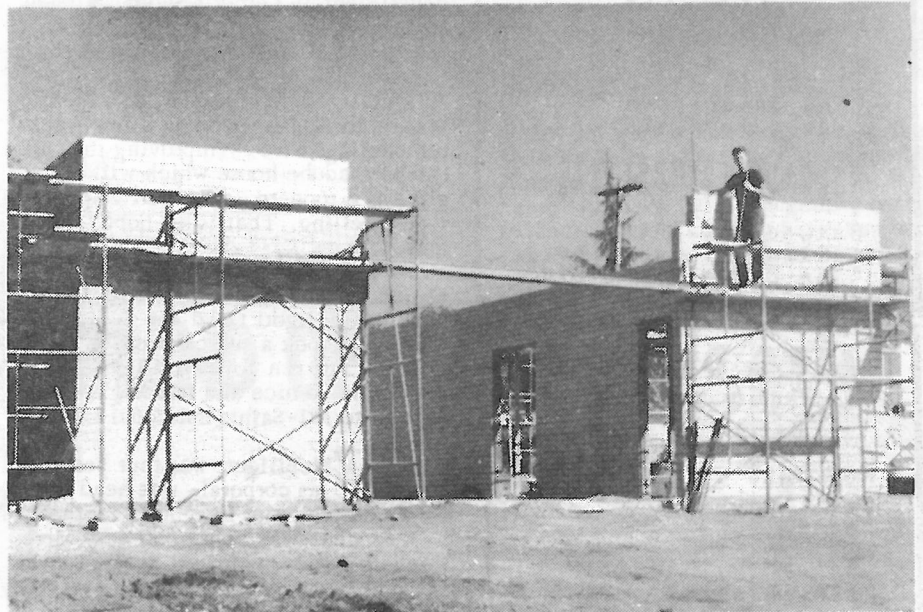
Build Glass Warehouse LAW OK FOR HORSES!

EDITORIAL

Toastmaster Founder, Man with Idea, Dies

Although I have been the speaker numerous times at Toastmaster meetings here and abroad, I confess I did not know who had the brilliant inspiration to start such a fine organization.

But this week I found out when I read of the passing of Dr. Ralph C. Smedley, of Santa Ana, founder of Toastmasters International, a non-profit corporation through which close to a million men have trained themselves in public speaking. He died Saturday at 87.

He was a graduate of Illinois Wesleyan University, was born in Waverly, became a YMCA worker in that state, later in San Jose. In Santa Ana he supervised building the "Y" In 1924 he organized the first Toastmasters Club which now claims over 3600 affiliates with nearly 80,000 members in 50 countries.

In 1941 he resigned from the "Y" to devote full time to the club. Its international headquarters is in Santa Ana, which should be mighty proud to claim him and his wonderful organization.

If you enjoyed the Miss America pageant Saturday night, you saw how important it is for young people-- even high school students-- to be able to get up and speak extemporaneously before any group.

We believe that public speaking should start in the primary grades because it helps everyone to develop personality, perspicacity and ability that promotes success in life. -CI

Rodney Arnold came over Sunday to say goodbye. His leave was up and he is being sent to Hawaii this week.

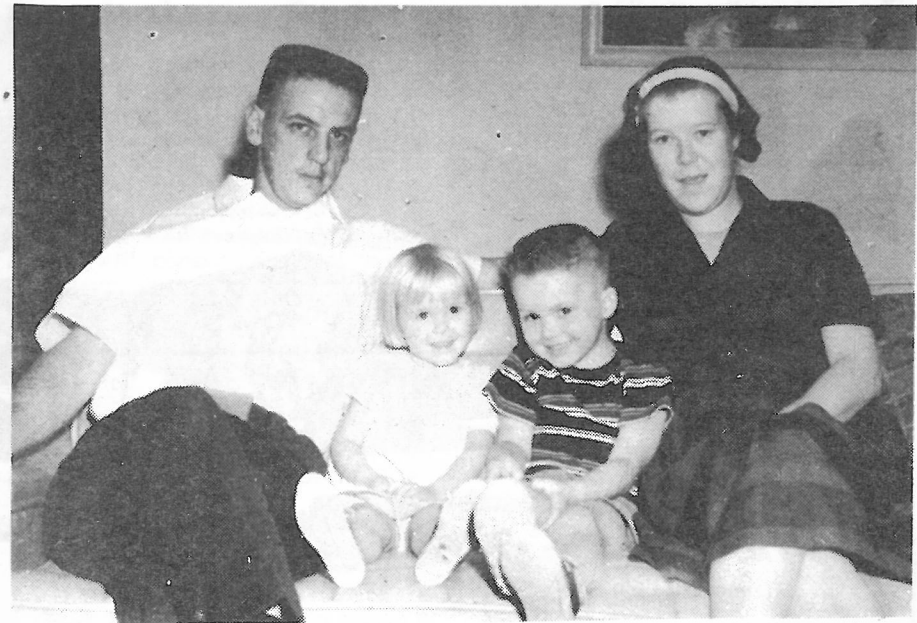

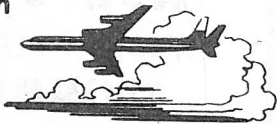
